Now in its 25th year, the MassMutual Classic annually has marked the opening of the college basketball season.

For a quarter century, two of the nation's top basketball programs have traveled to the birthplace of basketball in November to compete in this special, invitation-only contest at the 6,800-seat Springfield Civic Center in Springfield, Mass.

Throughout its history, this event has featured the elite in college basketball. Six times in its history, the defending national champion has opened its post-championship run in the Classic (1979, '80, '82, '83, '89, 94). The game has also featured that season's eventual national champion on two occasions: Kentucky in 1995 and Arizona in 1996.

Such a high level of competition has produced its share of great games. Thirteen of the previous 24 match-ups have been decided by less than 10 points, including eight by five points or less. The average margin of victory in the series is 10.1 points.

Arizona has made two appearances in the Tip-Off Classic and won on both occasions. UA defeated Michigan, 82-75, in 1989 and downed North Carolina, 83-72, in 1996.

Established in 1979, proceeds from the game help support the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. MassMutual's title sponsorship of this exciting event reflects its commitment to the Springfield community and its rich basketball heritage.

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Jimmy V Classic fueled by Pontiac

The V Foundation is proud to team up with ESPN and Madison Square Garden to bring to life the Jimmy V Basketball Classic, one of the nation's most talked about early-season basketball tournaments.

Each year, four premier collegiate basketball teams pair off in the name of Jim Valvano, and in the process, raise funds to help find a cure for cancer. To date, the Jimmy V Basketball Classic has raised almost \$450,000 to help fund cancer research.

A standout player at Rutgers in the late 1960s, Valvano was an NCAA Division I head coach for 18 seasons, most notably serving as the head coach at North Carolina State for nine seasons. During his time in Ralieg, Valvano earned Atlantic Coast Conference Coach-of-the-Year honor two times and won the 1983 national championship.

He was diagnosed with terminal cancer in June 1992 and passed away in April 1993. The V Foundation for Cancer Research was founded by Valvano and ESPN shortly before his death in 1993 to ensure that cancer victims will become survivors. In the past 10 years, the foundation has raised over \$27 million and awarded more than 170 research grants.

Some of college basketball's top teams have competed in this elite tournament. Teams in past Classics have included: California, Clemson, Duke, Georgia Tech, Kansas, and Kentucky, Massachusetts, North Carolina, Penn State, Princeton, Purdue, Seton Hall, South Carolina, Temple and Wake Forest.

A change is in order for the ninth edition of the event, as the doubleheader will be hosted for the first time by Madison Square Garden, "The World's Most Famous Arena," in New York, N.Y.

For the seventh time in its history, and third consecutive season, the Pacific-10 Conference will hold a postseason basketball tournament to determine the league's automatic berth in the NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament.

The top eight teams in the Pac-10's regular season standings will advance to the 2004 Pac-10 Tournament, scheduled for Thursday-Saturday, March 11-13 at the Staples Center in Los Angeles.

Fox Sports Net will broadcast quarterfinal and semifinal action on March 11-12, while the Championship game will be televised by CBS at 3 p.m. PST on Saturday, March 13.

The original incarnation of the Pac-10 Tournament ran from 1987-90. The inaugural event was held following the 1986-87 season at Pauley Pavilion in Los Angeles. Tournaments were also held in Tucson, Ariz., (1988), Los Angeles (1989), Tempe, Ariz. (1990), and Los Angeles' Staples Center (2002-03) as well.

UCLA captured the first Pac-10 Tournament title on its home court in 1987 before Arizona won four consecutive championships from 1988-2002. Oregon won the postseason tournament title last season, courtesy of a 74-66 victory over USC.

Prior to announcing the return of the tournament on Oct. 23, 2000, the Pacific-10 Conference was one of just two NCAA Division I leagues (Ivy) in the nation without a postseason tournament.

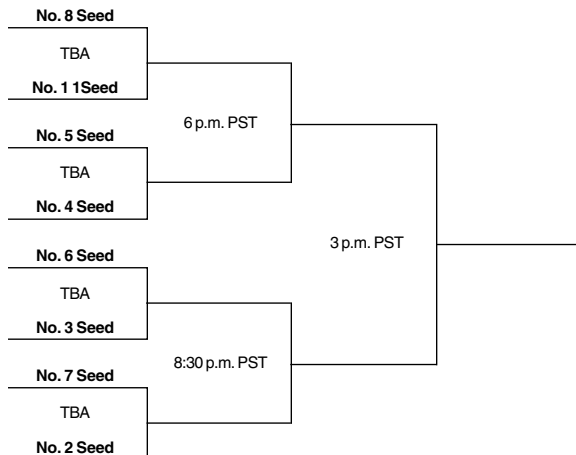
