Hit 1-of-2 FTs and added a block vs. Wyoming on 3/16 ... Grabbed five rebounds in his NCAA Tournament debut on 3/14 vs. UCSB ... Averaged 20.0 points and 12.0 rebounds per game as a senior and improved those numbers to 23 pts./19 reb. in the state playoffs ... Set a state regional championship game record with 23 rebounds ... Scored 30 points and grabbed 21 boards in the championship game loss ... Set title game records for free throws (14) and free throws attempted (18) ... Helped team to second straight CIF title ... Named Delphic League, CIF, and Division 4 State Player of the Year ... Earned the John R. Wooden Award for California Division 4 high school players ... Cal-Hi Sports Division 4 Player of the Year ... A top-10 player (all-state) in California for all divisions as a senior and second team as a junior ... Earned all-tournament honors at the Las Vegas Classic ... Garnered

first team all-South Bay accolades and team Most Valuable Player honors in 2001 ... Ranked as the No. 7 center nationally by *The Sporting News* ... As a junior, Fox averaged 25 points and 13 rebounds per game and earned all-state and all-California Interscholastic Federation kudos ... Led Crossroads High to a 55-1 league record in four years ... Attended three Nike Camps.

Scheduled to travel to Turkey and Italy with NYC Hoops later this summer.

2001-02 (Freshman): A key contributor in 2001-02 who started 25 of 34 games ... Worked his way into the starting lineup by late December and stayed there for the rest of the season ... Selected to the Pac-10 all-Freshman team ... Team leader with 50 blocks and collected five blocks in a game three times this year ... Led the Pac-10 with a .595 FG percent-





age (.605 in Pac-10 play), and was the only UA player to shoot better than 50 percent from the floor ... Also shot .727 from the free throw line ... Arizona's No. 2 scorer (14.3 ppg) and rebounder (7.7 rpg) in three NCAA Tournament games ... Ranked 14th in the Pac-10 in rebounding (6.3), fifth in blocked shots (1.47) and ninth in offensive rebounds (2.38) ... Had string of 17 consecutive shots made (covering four games) come to an end at Arizona State On Jan. 23 ... Shot 80-of-128 (.625) from the field in his last 21 games ... Averaged 18 points, 12.5 rebounds and 38.0 minutes in the two-game Oregon trip Dec. 20-22, including a career-best 18-point, 16-rebound performance at Oregon State ... Named to the Fiesta Bowl Classic All-Tournament team ... Hit all four shots from the floor and added five rebounds and two blocks on 3/21 vs. Oklahoma in the West Regional Semifinal ... Collected five points, two boards, an assist and a steal on 2/28 vs. Stanford ... Hit 2-of-6 shots from the floor and grabbed just one rebound on 2/20 vs. Arizona State ... Tallied five points and a block at USC on 2/16 ... Scored five points and added eight rebounds at UCLA on 2/14 ... Struggled from the field (3-of-12), but grabbed 10 rebounds on 2/9 vs. Washington State ... Posted his fifth double-double of the year with 16 points (6-of-9 FG) and 10 rebounds on 2/7 vs. Washington ... Another in the long line of Arizona prep standouts to enter the Wildcat program ... Led St. Mary's High School to the 2001 Class 5A state championship with a 30-3 record ... Averaged 22.0 points, 15.0 rebounds, 6.0 blocks and 3.0 assists per game as a senior ... St. Mary's won the Desert Valley Conference title with a 10-0 record ... Named Player of the Year by the *Arizona Republic* ... Was the Arizona Gatorade Player of the Year ... A fourth-team *Parade* All-America ... A McDonald's All-America nominee ... As a junior, Frye averaged 15.0 points, 12.0 rebounds, 9.0 blocks and 6.0 assists per game for coach David Lopez at St. Mary's. He led the team to a 26-7 record in 2000, a berth in the Class 5A state tournament semifinals and a No. 19 national ranking by *USA Today* ... He was a *Street & Smith's* High Honorable Mention All-America pick and an all-metro Phoenix selection ... He earned MVP honors at the Arizona Preps Fall Showcase and attended the Nike All-America camp ... A member of the St. Mary's Lettermen's Club and was very active in its community service program.
