HEAD COACH

First Season at Arizona | Career Record: 120-47 (.718) in Five Seasons

Arizona athletics director Jim Livengood appointed Sean Miller to take over the reins of the University of Arizona's heralded men's basketball program April 7, 2009.

Miller, 40, completed five seasons as head coach at Xavier in 2008-09 with his fourth consecutive

20-victory season and fourth consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance.

His clubs won the last three Atlantic-10 Conference regular-season championships and he carries a career head coaching record of 120-47, a superlative .718 winning percentage. He took two Xavier teams to the NCAA Tournament's Sweet 16 (2008, 2009) with his 2008 club advancing to the West Regional final. He is the school's overall coaching leader in NCAA play with a 6-4 record in his share of Xavier's 20 tournament appearances.

Miller's 2008-09 club won the A-10 championship finishing with a 27-8 record. The Musketeers lost to No. 1-seed Pitt as the No. 4 seed in the East Regional in Boston.

XU was ranked No. 20 in the final Associated Press poll and was ranked steadily after Nov. 25, rising as high as No. 7 on Dec. 15 and holding a spot in the top 10 (9th) on Feb. 2.

As a player Miller participated in three NCAA Tournaments for Pittsburgh (1988, 1989 and 1991), coached in one as an assistant at Miami of Ohio (1995) and in three as



associate head coach at Xavier from 2002-04. He is a member of the Pitt all-Centennial team and a former all-Big East honoree. He still ranks among the top 20 in three Big East career statistical categories: assists (third), free throw percentage (third) and three-point field goal percentage (17th), and was the Big East Rookie of the Year in 1987-88.

Moreover, Miller's work with his student-athletes off the court paid outstanding dividends with 100 percent of the basketball seniors who completed their eligibility since 1996 graduating. While a head coach, 16 Xavier players have earned their degrees.

His success with his student-athletes both on and off the court echoes the fact that Miller genuinely cares for their well being. That complete commitment to his charges is a strong indication of his character.

"It's easy to be a fan of Sean. I can't think of anyone in the profession who is more honest and more loyal. Sean is as good a person as there is in college basketball," said Mike DeCourcy of *The Sporting News*.

Miller becomes Arizona's sixth appointed head coach in the last 83 years, a succession that includes Fred A. Enke (1925-61), Bruce Larson (1961-72), Fred Snowden (1972-82), Ben Lindsey (1982-83) and Lute Olson (1983-2007).

Miller's 30-7 record in 2007-08 set a Xavier record for victories in a season, and helped earn him Atlantic 10 Conference Coach-of-the-Year honors, along with his 14-2 record and second A-10 regular-season title. The National Association of Basketball Coaches named Miller its District 10 Coach of the Year and he was a finalist for a number of other national coaching honors.

His overall record (120-47) ranks him third all time on Xavier's coaching chart behind Pete Gillen (202-75 from 1985-94) and the late Skip Prosser (148-65 from 1994-2001).

Xavier finished 25-9 overall in 2006-07, Miller's third year as the Musketeer mentor. XU won the 2007 Atlantic 10 Conference regular-season championship and advanced to the second round of the 2007 NCAA Tournament. Miller finished 21-11 in the 2005-06 season, winning the 2006 Atlantic 10 Championship and earning a berth into the NCAA Tournament.

Miller took over as head coach in 2004, replacing Thad Matta. He was Matta's right hand man the previous three seasons as XU's first-ever associate head coach. Miller helped the Musketeers record three straight 26-victory seasons and three straight NCAA Tournament appearances that culminated in the 2004 Elite Eight run.

Miller began coaching at Xavier after stops at North Carolina State, Pittsburgh, Miami (Ohio) and Wisconsin. He has coached on 14 teams that advanced to postseason play in his first 17 seasons as a head coach, assistant or associate head coach. That includes seven NCAA Tournaments in his eight years at Xavier.

Xavier's scheduling was as tough as any nationally prominent program during Miller's head coaching tenure. The slate in 2008-09 included Duke, Virginia and Virginia Tech from the Atlantic Coast Conference, Missouri from the Big 12, USC, Cincinnati from the Big East, Auburn and Louisiana State from the Southeastern Conference, Memphis from Conference USA and Butler of the Horizon League. His Musketeers defeated Portland State and Wisconsin in the 2009 NCAA Tournament, with a five-point loss to his former school, Pitt, in the Sweet 16.

Considered Pittsburgh's best three-point shooter of all time, Miller was a Big East all-Rookie team pick in 1987-88. In his four-year career he helped lead the Panthers to three NCAA berths and an NIT appearance. He is tied for 17th place entering 2009-10 on Pitt's all-time scoring chart with 1,282 points, ranked 10th among career Division I free throw shooters at .885.



He played on the United States' 1991 World University Games team that earned a gold medal after his final year at Pitt. He was named the "Best Pitt Player of the 1990s" as part of his alma mater's centennial celebration during the 2005-06 season.

A native of Pittsburgh, Miller was born Nov. 17, 1968. He and his wife, Amy, have three sons, Austin, Cameron and Braden. He prepped at Blackhawk High School and earned his bachelor's degree in communications from Pittsburgh in 1992.





ARCHIE MILLER

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH

First Year at Arizona | North Carolina State, 2002

Archie Miller joined the Wildcat staff as the associate head coach on April 17, 2009.

Miller, 31, brings seven years of coaching and administrative experience to his brother's staff, including the last two seasons as an assistant coach at Ohio State under Thad Matta. The Buckeyes posted

a 22-11 record in 2008-09, were the runners-up in the Big Ten tournament and advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

"This is a very exciting opportunity for me for several reasons," said Miller. "One, to be able to coach at Arizona. Two, to be able to coach with my brother, and, three, to have an opportunity to continue to do something special with this exceptional program. It takes a lot to walk away from a place like Ohio State, and this is it," he said.

Prior to his tenure in Columbus, the younger Miller spent three seasons on Herb Sendek's staff at Arizona State (2006-07) and North Carolina State (2004-06), the last two years as a full-time assistant. In 2004-05, Miller was the Wolfpack's director of basketball operations. In each of his final two years in Raleigh, NCSU won more than 20 games and advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

Miller served as the director of basketball operations at Western Kentucky University in 2003-04, where he assisted in recruiting and scouting, and coordinated the program's summer camps. Miller's efforts were key

in the recruitment of Courtney Lee, who went on to become Sun Belt Conference Freshman of the Year (2005), an all-conference honoree and a 2008 NBA first-round draft pick.

His coaching career began at N.C. State in 2002-03, where he filled the role of intern under Sendek.

"Archie is one of the most talented assistant coaches in college basketball," said Sean Miller, "His playing experience in the ACC coupled with his coaching in the Pac-10, Big Ten and ACC allow him to connect with people at all levels. He has a

total understanding of the game and will be a tremendous asset with our on-court and off-the-court coaching activities," he said.

A stand-out point guard at N.C. State (1998-2002), Miller's 218 career treys ranks second in Wolfpack history, while his .428 three-point percentage ranks fifth in Atlantic Coast Conference history. He also ranks second in NCSU history with an .846 (165-of-195) career free throw percentage. During his senior season, Miller helped lead N.C. State to the ACC Tournament final, earning ACC all-Tournament first-team honors. He also helped the `Pack reach the 2002 NCAA Tournament.

Sean was an assistant coach at N.C. State during Archie's first three collegiate seasons.

A native of Beaver Falls, Pa., Miller earned a bachelor's degree in parks, recreation and tourism from N.C. State in 2002. He is married to the former Morgan Cruse. The couple has one child, Leah Grace Miller, 4.





EMANUEL RICHARDSON

ASSISTANT COACH

First Year at Arizona | Pittsburgh-Johnstown, '98



"Book" Richardson, 36, joined the Arizona basketball staff after completing his second year as a member of Sean Miller's staff at Xavier in 2008-09. His impact at XU was immediate, as the 2007-08 Musketeers posted a school-record 30 wins and advanced to the NCAA Tournament's "Elite Eight."

Prior to Xavier, Richardson was the Director of Basketball for the New York Gauchos/ Teamwork Foundation in the Bronx, N.Y., from 2005-07. He also served as an assistant coach at St. Raymond's High School for Boys in 2004 and was the head coach for ninth and 10th-grade players in the New York Gauchos system in 2003.

Richardson's U-18 red team captured the gold medal at the 2007 USA Basketball Men's Youth Development Festival, becoming the youngest coach ever to win the event. He was the first AAU coach to be selected by USA Basketball as a head coach in the festival. Additionally, Richardson was part of Nike's Travel Team Advisory Board, a part of Nike Elite Youth Basketball, where he was the youngest of six members.

Richardson was an assistant coach at Marist College in 2004-05, where coordinated the Red Foxes' recruiting, scouting and individual work outs, focusing primarily on guard play and offensive skill development. He also spent three seasons as an assistant at Monroe College, an NJCAA program in the Bronx. His 2002-03 club went 31-3, won the Region 15 and District 3 titles and finished fifth at the NJCAA national tournament in Hutchinson, Kan.

A 1998 graduate of the University of Pittsburgh at Johnstown with a bachelor's degree in business marketing and management, Richardson's coaching career began at his alma mater as the associate head coach in 1999. He handled recruiting, scouting, practice plans and study halls and helped lead the NCAA Division II Mountain Cats to a 25-3 record, the best in school history.

A native of Queens, N.Y., Richardson and his wife, Erin, have two children, daughter Sere and son E.J.

"I am thrilled to join the University of Arizona men's basketball program," said Whitford. "The rich history and tradition is something of which I'm excited to be a part. I look forward to many great years in Tucson."

Prior to his tenure in Cincinnati, Whitford spent 11 seasons on the staff at Miami University (Ohio) for Charlie Coles, the last eight as the top assistant. In that span, the RedHawks

regular-season championships (1995, '97, '99, 2005) while at Miami. Whitford graduated from the University of Wisconsin in 1994 with a bachelor's degree in political science. He served as a manager for the Badger men's basketball program for three seasons. 

Walker spent the 2007-08 season as an assistant at Murray State University, where he helped the Racers to a runner-up finish in the Ohio Valley Conference. Additionally, he served as an assistant coach at Saint Louis University in 2006-07, where he directed the team's scouting efforts and helped the Billikens win 20 games for the first time in more than a decade.

He spent two seasons as an assistant at Ball State University (2004-06), spearheading the Cardinals' recruiting. During his time in Muncie, Ind., one of his key signees, Maurice
