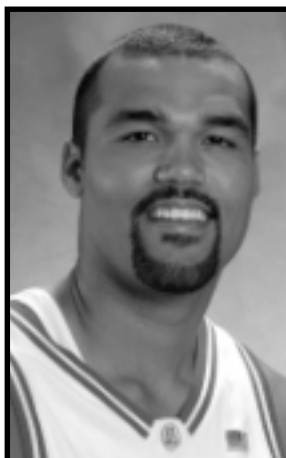

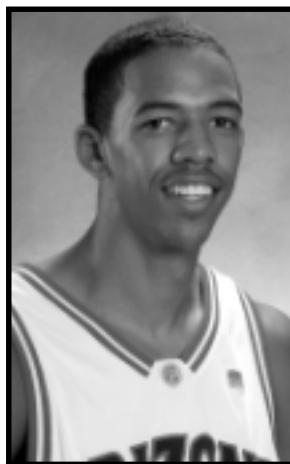
General:
