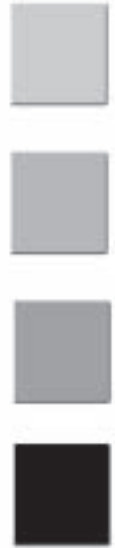
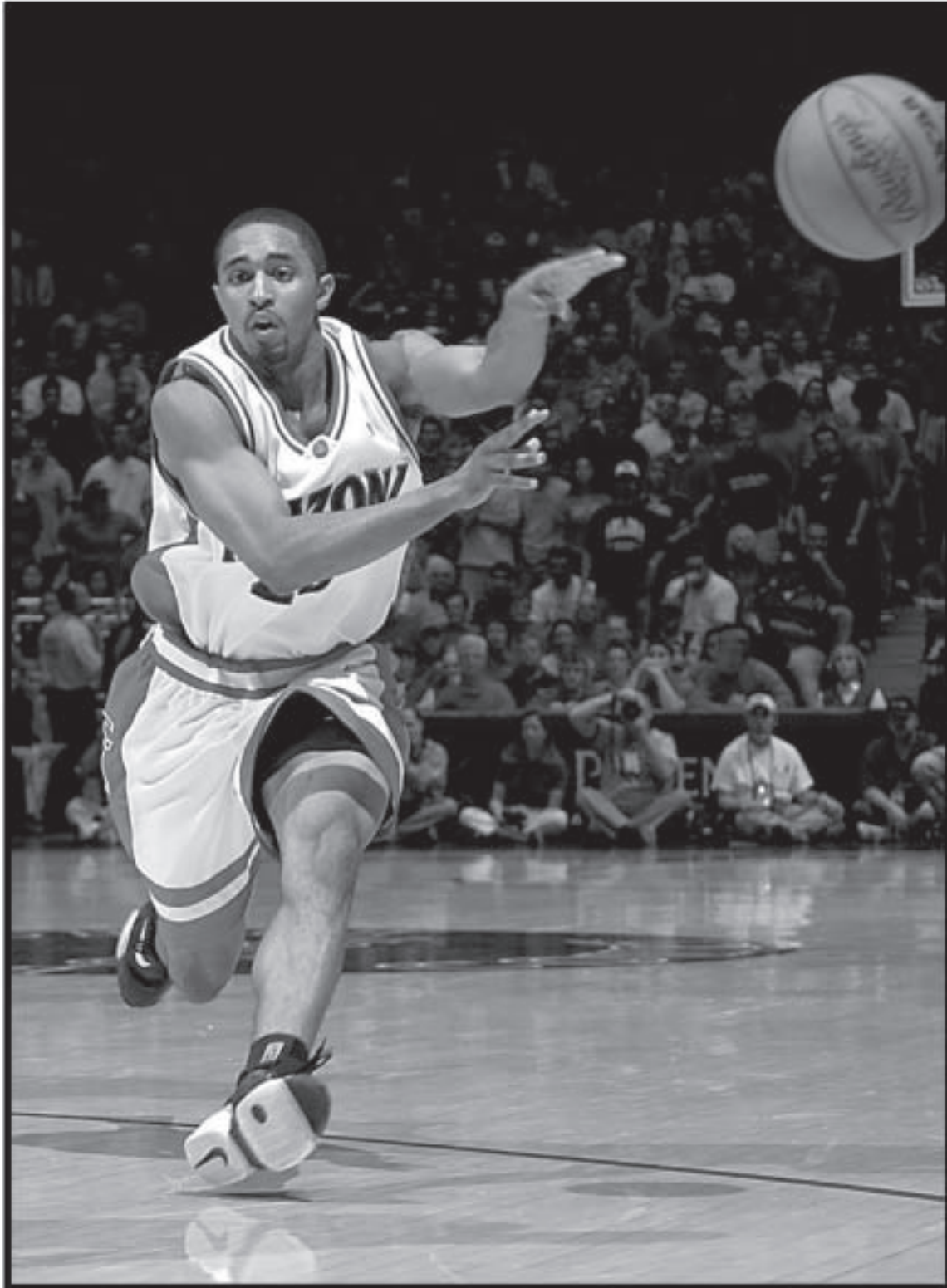

2002 Review

- Arizona Finishes as Pac-10 Tournament Champion,
- Advances to 18th Straight NCAA Tournament,
- and Achieves 15th Consecutive 20-Win Season

One can tell a lot about the stature of a program when the cliché, “They don’t rebuild, they reload,” is used to describe the talent surrounding a program.

After 14 seasons as the nation’s winningest program, that cliché was put to the test in Tucson as the Wildcats entered the 2001-02 season with an abnormally high number of question marks following its appearance in the 2001 national championship game.

The task ahead for Lute Olson and his staff in 2001-02 was to assemble a championship-caliber team from the remains of a squad that was decimated by graduation and the 2001 NBA Draft. UA lost seven of its top nine players from that 2001 NCAA runner-up and would survive on the contributions of three juniors and five key freshmen.

All told, nine scholarship players and five walk-ons would face the nation’s toughest schedule. Just how difficult was it? The Cats would face ranked opponents in its first five games of the season, a feat unmatched in college basketball history, and

go on to play 17 nationally-ranked opponents over the course of the season.

The Cats opened the season with impressive neutral-court wins over second-ranked, and eventual national champion Maryland (71-67) and fifth-ranked Florida (75-71) to win the Coaches vs. Cancer IKON Classic, then bounced No. 23 Texas, 88-74, in Austin.

Following a 105-97 setback to No. 8 Kansas, Arizona rebounded to dispatch No. 5 Illinois, 87-82, to run its record to an impressive 4-1. There was no longer any doubt as to whether these Cats could play, as the team went from being unranked in the preseason to as high as No. 4 in the *Associated Press* poll.

What followed from that point was one of Olson’s finest coaching jobs, as he guided his charges through a season that exceeded nearly everyone’s expectations by winning 24 games, capturing the Pac-10 Tournament title, and advancing to the NCAA Tournament’s “Sweet Sixteen.”

Along the way, the 2001-02 Cats posted 20 or more wins for the 15th straight season,

advanced to its 18 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance and won its fourth consecutive Pac-10 Tournament championship.

ARIZONA IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS:

As a team, Arizona ranked in the top 50 nationally in several statistical categories: 6th in scoring offense (82.1), 39th in winning percentage (.706), 45th in three-point field goals per game (7.6), 47th in free throw percentage (.731) and 49th in three-point FG percentage (.376). Individually, Jason Gardner ranked 33rd in scoring (20.4) and 25th in three-point field goals per game (3.1). Luke Walton ranked 18th in assists (6.3), and Salim Stoudamire ranked 13th in three-point FG percentage (.453) and fourth in free throw percentage (.904).



ALL-AMERICA HONORS:

Jason Gardner and Luke Walton were named to a total of seven All-America teams following the 2001-02 campaign, marking the sixth straight year in which the Cats have had at least one All-American. Gardner earned third team honors from the *Associated Press* and second team accolades from *cnni.com* and *Basketball America*, while Walton garnered kudos from the John R. Wooden Award, *Basketball Times* (3rd), *The Sporting News* (2nd) and *Basketball News* (2nd).

COACH OF THE YEAR:

UA head coach Lute Olson was also recognized by *cnni.com*, as it selected the Wildcat mentor as its national coach of the year. It is the second consecutive season in which Olson has been nationally recognized. Last year, Olson was named the Clair Bee Coach of the Year and was also honored with the John R. Wooden "Legends of Coaching" award.

ALL-CONFERENCE:

Four UA players were also recognized by the Pac-10 Conference with postseason honors. Luke Walton and Jason Gardner were named all-conference, while Salim Stoudamire and Channing Frye were named to the all-freshman team. Stoudamire was also named the Pac-10 Freshman of the Year.

FOUR STRAIGHT:

It took 12 years to do it, but Arizona captured its fourth consecutive Pac-10 Tournament championship March 9. The Cats won three consecutive (1988-90) in the league's first incarnation of the event prior to this season. All-time, UA has a 12-1 (.923) record in conference tournament play and has won 12 straight games.

M.O.P.:

Luke Walton earned Pac-10 Tournament Most Outstanding Player honors after averaging 22.7 points, 5.7 rebounds and 5.3 assists in UA's three tournament wins. In the championship-game win over USC, Walton scored 23 points, grabbed four rebounds and added eight assists in 40 minutes. He was joined on the all-tournament team by Jason Gardner and Salim Stoudamire.



total of 12 games against opponents that claimed conference championships (Big 12, Big Ten, ACC, SEC, Big East, Mountain West, West Coast, Big West, Pac-10 and Mid Continent). Eight of those foes advanced to the Sweet 16. Arizona finished this season 10-7 against nationally-ranked opponents.

UNPRECEDENTED:

Luke Walton closed his 2001-02 season as the Pac-10 leader in assists at 6.3 per game. He is the first forward to lead the Pac-10 in assists since the league began tracking the statistic in 1974-75. Walton also ranked 18th nationally in assists and no frontcourt player is ranked higher than the San Diego native. Walton, who has gained a reputation as "the most complete forward in college basketball," according to Bob

Ryan of *The Boston Globe*, was the only Pac-10 player to be ranked among the league's top 15 in scoring and the top 10 in rebounds, assists and steals.

ON TARGET:

Freshman Salim Stoudamire certainly made an impact with his outside shooting. On the season, the Portland, Ore., native shot 44.3 percent from the field, including 45.3 percent from three-point range. Stoudamire has been so accurate, he ranks second on the school's career three-point FG percentage chart behind Steve Kerr (.573). His 434 points scored this season rank sixth on the UA freshman scoring list.

400 CLUB:

The 2001-02 edition of the Arizona Wildcats accomplished a rare statistical feat: four players scored at least 400 points in a single season. Jason Gardner (692 points), Luke Walton (487), Salim Stoudamire (434) and Rick Anderson (420) enabled the 2001-02 club to join the 1999-2000 team as the only two UA squads to accomplish the feat since 1987-88.

ON THE RUN:

The 2001-02 Wildcats made a habit of big second-half runs. UA used a 21-8 run to open the second half (covering 6:26) to take control of the NCAA Tournament first-round win over UC-Santa Barbara on March 14. It marked the seventh time in which an Arizona run helped the team out of a second-half deficit:

26 points - 30-4 run over 10:23 vs. California, March 2
25 points - 27-2 run over 6:16 vs. UCLA, Jan. 19
20 points - 35-15 run over 12:22 vs. Oregon State, Jan. 6
19 points - 25-6 run over 8:28 at Texas, Nov. 17

13 points - 21-8 run over 6:26 vs. UC-Santa Barbara, March 14
12 points - 24-12 run over 7:16 vs. Kansas, Dec. 1

A CROWD FAVORITE:

Arizona set a school record for average attendance this season, averaging 14,544 fans per game, which broke last season's record of 14,533. Arizona has led the Pac-10 in attendance each season since 1984-85.

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE:

Just how tough was Arizona's 2001-02 schedule? Ten of UA's 13 non-conference opponents either won or shared its regular season conference title. Arizona played a

ANOTHER LEAGUE LEADER:

Freshman Channing Frye made quite an impact on the Pac-10 as well, finishing the season as the league's field goal percentage leader. Frye connected on 59.5 percent of his attempts (122-of-205), and improved to 60.5 percent in conference play. Frye's 59.5 FG percentage would have ranked seventh nationally had he met the minimum of five made field goals per game.

ANOTHER BREAKTHROUGH:

Not only has Rick Anderson's offensive contributions come as expected, shooting 49.2 percent from the floor and averaging 12.4 points per game (more than doubling his career scoring output this season alone), but he's also been a force on the glass. The slender 6-foot-9 forward from Long Beach, Calif., led the team in offensive (99) and total rebounds (245) this season.

FRESHMAN CONTRIBUTIONS:

The UA freshmen certainly made an impact this year, as the group combined to score 42.2 percent of the team's offense, grab 44.0 percent of the rebounds and log 49.2 percent of the minutes played.

McKALE CENTER EAST:

Arizona's season got off to a flying start in November by defeating Maryland and Florida to claim the Coaches vs. Cancer IKON Classic championship. Under Lute Olson, Arizona is 8-0 at New York City's Madison Square Garden.



OFFENSIVE BALANCE:

It's no secret that the Cats were at its collective best when all five cylinders are firing. This year, Arizona was 7-0 when five or more players finished in double figures. Additionally, Arizona is 39-3 (.929) when scoring at least 90 points since 1997-98.

A TOP-10 GUY:

Jason Gardner closed his junior season as the school's career leader in minutes per game (35.6), but the Indianapolis, Ind.,

native also ranks among the UA career leaders in nine other categories. He ranks 10th in points scored (1,512), second in three-point field goals (252) and three-point field goal attempts (676), fourth in games started (103) and minutes played (3707), fifth in free throws (402), sixth in assists (464), seventh in steals (164), and ninth in free throw attempts (516).

RECORD BREAKER:

Rick Anderson broke a 52-year old-school record by committing 119 personal fouls. That broke the former school record of 113 set by Leo Johnson in 1949-50. Anderson can take solace in the fact that his average of 3.5 fouls per game is 0.8 less than the school record for average fouls per game.

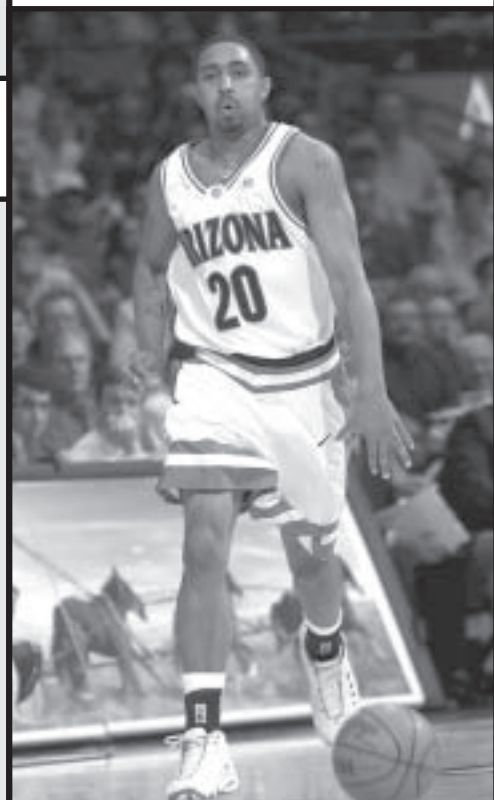

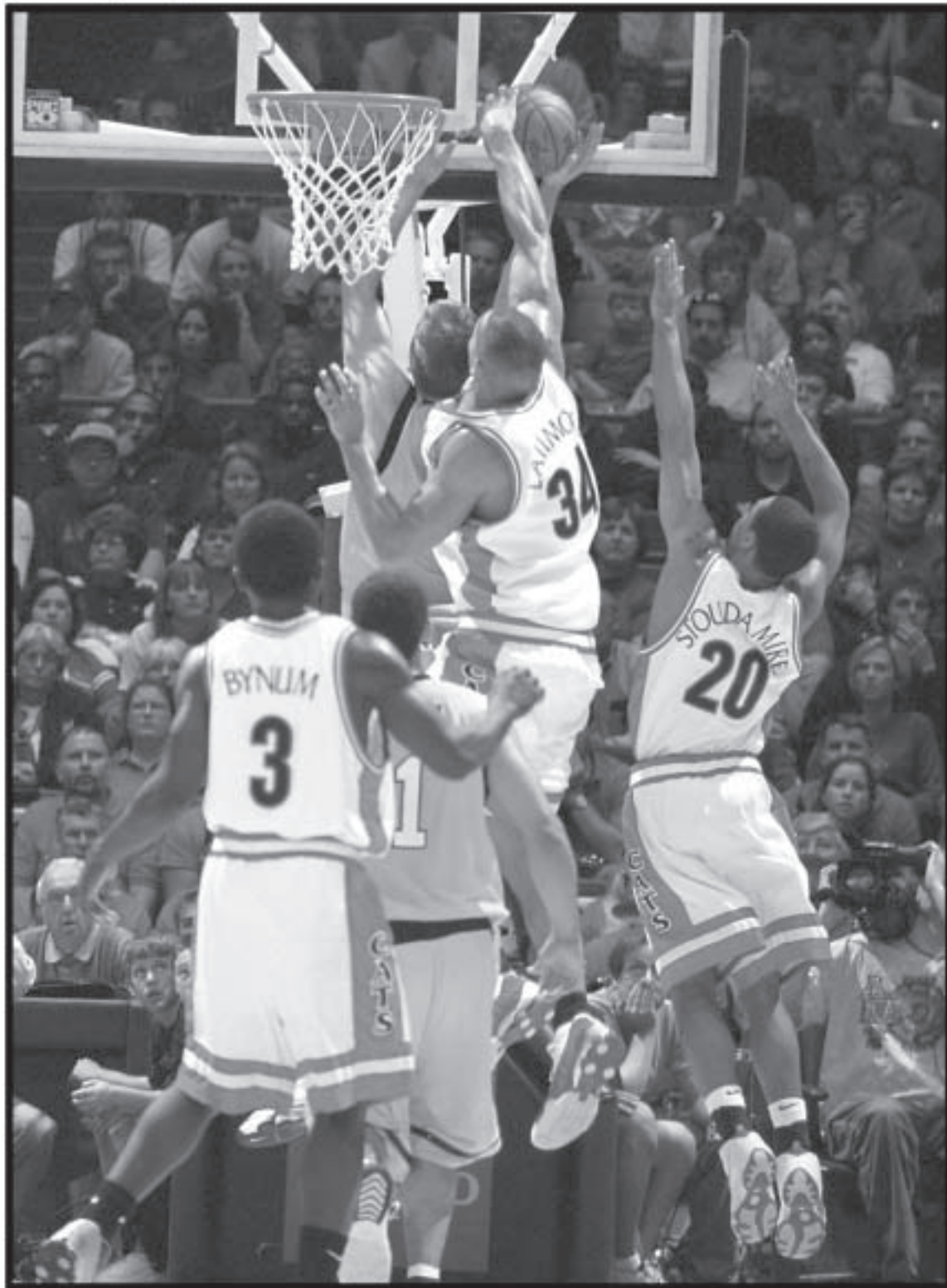
