- Ka'Deem Carey set a Pac-12 record with 366 rushing yards last week. He ranks No. 2 in single-season school history for yards and touchdowns.

Some Game Themes: Bowl-eligible Arizona travels for the final time in the regular season seeking an elusive first road victory to cross another item of Rich Rodriguez's first-year to-do list . . . The task will be a challenging one against a Utah squad needing to win out to put itself among the Pac-12 bowl contenders ... An on-paper matchup of high-powered offense (Arizona) against stout defense (Utah) . . . At the same time, the Utes rank second-to-last in the conference total offense, while the Wildcats check in at the same position for total defense. So something has to give . . . The big guestion for the visitor's will be whether fifth-year senior quarterback Matt Scott returns to the lineup after missing last week's game . . . In Scott's absence, Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Week Ka'Deem Carey ran for a conference-record 366 yards and enters this week as the Pac-12's leading rusher . . . The Utes counter with a stifling rush defense led by national honors candidate Star Lotulelei up front ... Utah also boasts an experienced and talented running back in John White, who had a pair of scores against the Cats in Tucson last November in one of his many career 100-yard rushing games . . . Can the Cats"D' slow that ground game and put pressure on guarterback Travis Wilson? The Utes rank 92nd nationally in sacks allowed, and Wilson has thrown more picks (six) than touchdowns (four) on the season. Or will Wilson and the Utes offense take advantage of UA's thin and youthful defense that has struggled this season, notably on the road? Keep an eye on special teams, where Utah's Reggie Dunn has game-changing potential in the kicking game with his three touchdowns on seven returns

this year . . . An 8 p.m. start in the Mountain Time Zone, the first of two-straight late-night matchups

for the Cats, who close out their slate against rival Arizona State in Tucson next week.

The Coaches: *Arizona* – Rich Rodriguez (West Virginia '86), first year at Arizona (64) and 18th as a head coach overall (126-88-2). Rodriguez was introduced as the 30th head coach of the UA football program on Nov. 22, 2011. He carries Division I records of 6-4 at Arizona, 60-26 at West Virginia (2001-2007) and 15-22 at Michigan (2008-10). He began his head coaching career at Salem (W.Va.) University in 1988 and then coached at Glenville State (W.Va.) from 1990-96. Rodriguez's West Virginia teams were Big East Champions in 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2007 while appearing in two BCS bowls, the 2005 Sugar Bowl with a victory over Georgia for an 11-1 record and a victory over Oklahoma in the 2007 Fiesta Bowl to finish 10-2 shortly after Rodriguez had left for Michigan. *Utah* - Kyle Whittingham (BYU'84), eighth year at Utah (70-31) and overall as a head coach. He was AFCA 2008 National Coach of the Year following the Utes' 13-0 mark and victory over Alabama in the Sugar Bowl. He was a linebacker at BYU from 1978-81 and began his coaching career in Provo as a G.A. in 1985. He coached at Eastern Utah and Idaho State before joining the Utah staff in 1994. He was DC in Salt Lake City from 1995-2004. He is 2-0 against Arizona with his first career regular season victory coming in Salt Lake City in 2005 the school's first Pac-12 Conference road win coming a year ago in Tucson.

2011 UA-Utah Rewind (full recap/stats on page 7): Arizona accumulated 457 yards but most of it was between the 20s as the Cats dropped a Pac-12 Homecoming tilt to Utah, 34-31. UA ventured twice into the red zone and came away empty-handed. The first came on the opening drive when it reached the Utes 15 yardline and subsequently tried a fake field goal that didn't work. The second came in the fourth guarter when a 1st-and-goal at the Útah 1 turned into a nightmare when Conroy Black stepped in front of a Nick Foles pass and took it back to midfield with UA trailing 27-14. The Utes cashed in on that drive and put the game away. Way earlier, a Greg Bird block of a UA punt at Arizona's 25 yard-line set Utah up for a six-yard scoring drive; and a first of the two interceptions off Foles inside UA's half of the field set up a 30-yard scoring drive. Utah, to its credit, made the most of 332 yards in total offense by protecting the ball (no turnovers to UA's three) and taking advantage of four red-zone trips with four scores. Another partially blocked punt by Bird hurt UA's field position and in the end the Cats played a lot of the game on their end of the field. Foles threw for 326 yards and two scores by David Douglas, who had a career-high 10 catches for a career-high 156 yards. Three UA backs totaled 137 vards led by sophomore Daniel Jenkins' best-ever 57 markers (6 carries) and a score of 29 yards as time wound down. The Cats had 28 first downs, 6.1 yards per play, a season-low (tying) three penalties and converted eight of 14 third downs, but special teams' play and three turnovers spoiled any chances at momentum. The victory was Utah's first-ever Pac-12 road win.

Last Week: Ka'Deem Carey carried the Wildcats to a 56-31 homecoming victory against Colorado in a rare 11:30 a.m. kickoff at Arizona Stadium. In the process, Carey gained 366 rushing yards on 25 carries to shatter the school record (288) and break the Pac-12 record (357). Nearly half his rushes (12) went for 10-plus yards and he had four of 30-plus yards, including bursts of 71, 64 and 46 yards. His 14.6 yards per carry average easily set a new school record for players with a minimum of 20 attempts. He scored five times on the ground, which set a new school record and tied the conference record. To boot, Carey had 34 receiving yards, giving him an even 400 all-purpose yards — another school record. But before all of that happened, the game was off to an inauspicious start for the Cats, who were without their starting quarterback Matt Scott. Junior B.J. Denker filled in and fumbled on his first play inside the five-yard line, setting up an easy Colorado touchdown on the next play. Arizona found itself down 10-7 going into the second guarter, when Denker and the offense settled into a rhythm. The southpaw completed 12-of-14 passes on the day for 136 yards, including a pair of touchdown tosses to Dan Buckner. Denker also added 44 rushing yards of his own to go with his 214.5 pass efficiency rating, the highest single-game mark for a UA quarterback this season. The Buffs found some offense, too, but it wasn't enough to match the Wildcats who moved the ball at will. CU's 437 yards of offense came on 76 snaps, while the Cats needed just 52 plays to rack up 574 yards — an astounding 11.0 yards per play. A consistent Buffs' ground game produced 224 yards led by Christian Powell's 137 markers and two scores on 32 totes. It helped produce a 41:48-18:12 advantage in time of possession, which was meaningless since the Cats didn't need the ball long to score and top 50 points for the fourth time at home this season. The win improved Arizona to 6-4, making them bowl eligible for the fourth time in five season, but the first since 2010.

Bowl-Eligible: While not yet guaranteed a bowl berth, Arizona (6-4) is bowl-eligible for the fourth time in five seasons after missing out a year ago. It's an impressive accomplishment for a program that went nine full seasons between bowl appearances (1998 Holiday Bowl to 2008 Las Vegas Bowl). The Wildcats also appeared in the 2009 Holiday Bowl and 2010 Alamo Bowl under former head coach Mike Stoops. This year, the Pac-12 has tie-ins with eight total bowls. Currently, seven schools are bowl eligible, with Arizona State (5-4) and Utah (4-6) still vying for eligibility. The Pac-12 bowl partners include, in order of selection after the Rose Bowl present by Vizio in Pasadena (Jan. 1): the Valero Alamo Bowl in San Antonio (Dec. 29), Bridgeport Education Holiday Bowl in San Diego (Dec. 27), Hyundai Sun Bowl in El Paso (Dec. 31), the MAACO Bowl Las Vegas (Dec. 22), the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl in San Francisco (Dec. 29), and the Gildan New Mexico Bowl in Albuquerque (Dec. 15).

Done In Year One: With six wins (6-4), Rich Rodriguez has his charges eligible for a bowl in his first season in the Old Pueblo. Rodriguez, who has led his teams to seven bowl games, is the first Arizona coach to lead a team to a bowl game in his first campaign. Mike Stoops (2004-2011), who coached in three bowl games, did not take the Wildcats to the postseason until his fifth season (2008). Dick Tomey (1987-2000), the winningest coach in program history, guided the school to seven bowls in his tenure, needed three years for his first bowl-bound season (1989).

Another Rodriguez Feat: Rich Rodriguez's six wins in his first season at Arizona are not only the most he has had in an initial season at a school, but also the most for a first-year Wildcat coach since Jim Young's squad went 8-3 and tied for the WAC title in 1973. Young's '73 club opened 8-1 and was poised for a bowl, but two straight losses and fewer bowl destinations in that era kept the Wildcats home for the holidays. The coaches since young have posted the following first-year records at Arizona: Tony Mason (5-7, 1977), Larry Smith (5-6, 1980), Dick Tomey (4-4-3, 1987), John Mackovic (5-6, 2001) and Mike Stoops (3-8, 2004).

Strength of Schedule: Jeff Sagarin ranks Arizona's schedules as the 10th-toughest in the nation to date, with six of the Wildcats 10 games to date being against teams in his top 30 (2-4 record). Looking at the BCS Stadnings this week, seven of UA's opponents are currently ranked with the Wildcats going 3-4 against those teams. Eight of UA's nine FBS opponents have earned an AP Top-25 ranking at some point this season. The combined record of UA's eight FBS opponents this season is 61-27.

Carey The Load: Sophomore running back Ka'Deem Carey, a local product out of Canyon del Oro High School, has emerged as UA's featured back and one of the most underrated players in the Pac-12 through the first nine games of the season. On the Maxwell Award Watch List earlier this year, Carey ranks leads the Pac-12 with 138.1 rushing yards per game and checks in second in all-purpose yardage (167.8 ypg). The 5-foot-11, 195-pounder has 19 total scores (18 rushing, one receiving) to rank second among all Pac-12 players and rank tied for sixth-most nationally in scoring. Carey has topped 100 yards rushing seven times this season alone, just a year after the Wildcats broke 100 yards as a team only five times in 12 contests in 2011. Five of his 100-yard games have come against Pac-12 schools. He boasts a 5.73 yards per carry average in career (315-1806, 24 TD), the 11th-best career average for active FBS players with minimum 300 rush attempts.

Carey's Record Day: Ka'Deem Carey rushed 25 times for 366 yards and five touchdowns last Saturday against Colorado, setting or matching several school and conference records. Here's a summary:

- Carey's 366 rushing yards were the ninth-most ever in an FBS (formerly Division I) game, including the most in 2012. The figure also broke Washington State's Rueben Mayes' conference record of 357 yards gained at Oregon on Oct. 27, 1984. The previous Arizona school record was held by Trung Canidate, who rushed for 288 yards against Arizona State on Nov. 27, 1998, at Arizona Stadium.
- Carey's five touchdown runs set a new Arizona record for single-game rushing scores and tied the conference record held by multiple players, including Oregon's Kenjon Barner who had five rushing scores against USC on Nov. 3. The five scores matched Art Luppino's record for single-game total touchdowns (four by rushing) set on Sept. 18, 1954, against New Mexico State. With a pair of extra points in that 1954 game, Luppino set the school record for single-game points scored (32). Carey's 30 last Saturday now rank second all-time at UA.
- Carey shattered the single-game school record for yards per carry (14.6) for a palyer with 20 or more rushing attempts in a game. The previous mark was established by Don Beasley, who ran 21 times for 193 yards (9.2 ypc) against Arizona State on Nov. 28, 1953.
- Carey added 34 receiving yards to finish with an even 400 all-purpose yards in the game another UA record. The previous mark was held by Art Luppino, who gained 359 against New Mexico State on Sept. 18, 1954.

Ka'Deem Carey in the FBS National Rankings:

- Ranks tied for No. 2 with 1,381 rushing yards (leads Pac-12).
- Ranks tied for No. 5 with 18 rushing touchdowns and tied for No. 4 with 19 total touchdowns.
- Ranks No. 2 with 1,662 total yards from scrimmage (leads Pac-12).
- Ranks No. 9 with 1,678 all-purpose yards (second in Pac-12).
- Ranks No. 5 with 39 rushing plays of 10-plus yards.
- Ranks No. 4 with 14 rushing plays of 20-plus yards.
- Ranks tied for No. 7 with 48 plays from scrimmage of 10-plus yards.
- Ranks tied for No. 6 with 18 plays from scrimmage of 20-plus yards.

Carey No. 2: Ka'Deem Carey's 1,381 rushing yards and 18 rushing touchdowns rank No. 2 in the UA single-season charts. Carey trails Trung Canidate's 1,602 yards in 1999 and Art Luppino's 21 touchdowns in 1954 for the top spot in each category. Carey currently ranks No. 8 in single-season school history for all-purpose yards (1,678) and No. 4 for single-season points scored (114).

Matt's The Man: Quarterback Matt Scott, who redshirted in 2011, is putting together a stellar senior season, if statistics are any indication. The Corona, Calif., native entered 2012 with five previous career starts and is now a 14-game starter (9-5 record) as a Wildcat. He possesses a complete repertoire of skills at the quarterback position, including ability to make all the throws on the field and hurt defenses with his legs. Here's a look at his career statistics:

- Became Arizona's 30th head coach on Nov. 22, 2011.
- A four-time Big East Champion at West Virginia, where he led the program to a 60-26 record as head coach from 2001-07.
- · Led West Virginia to three 11-win seasons.
- Spent three seasons at Michigan (2008-2011), while compiling a 15-22 record and guiding the Wolverines to the Gator Bowl in his final season.
- Guided his teams to bowl games in seven of his 10 FBS seasons. His teams are 3-4 in bowls, including 2-0 in BCS games.
- Prior to accepting the head coach position at West Virginia, spent time as an assistant at Clemson (1999-200), Tulane (1997-98), West Virginia (1985, 1989) and the head coach of Glenville State (1990-96) following three years at Salem Univ. where he had his first head coaching experience (1988).
- In his 18-year head coaching career, has led teams to seven conference championships and four 10-plus victory seasons.
- During four seasons as an offensive coordinator at Tulane (1997-1998) and Clemson (1999-200), his teams went a combined 34-13.
- Rodriguez-coached players have rushed for 1,000 yards in a season nine times in 10 seasons as FBS head coach.
- His teams at WVU and Michigan averaged 30.5 ppg over his 10 seasons in charge at those schools.
- Has a career 64-6 FBS record when scoring 30 or more points and is 37-2 when scoring 40 or more. Was 49-1 in 30-plus point games and 28-0 in 40-plus point games at West Virginia.

Tracking Matt: Senior quarterback Matt Scott has emerged as one of the most prolific passers in the country in his first full season as a starter. Scott's 2,848 passing yards lead all Pac-12 passers and rank No. 8 in the nation. Added with more than 40 rushing yards per game, Scott is averaging 357.4 yards in total offense per game, which also leads the Pac-12 and ranks No. 4 nationally. Scott, who is averaging 11.8 yards per completion, has the 12th-most passing plays of 10-plus yards (113) of any quarterback in the country. He also has 40 passes of 20 or more yards, which ranks tied for 14th-most among FBS quarterbacks. It's all amounts to Scott challenging some single season and career top-10 offensive charts. Here's a look at a few:

- Scott has four of Arizona's top-10 all-time single-game total offense performances (485 at Stanford, 469 vs. USC, 461 vs. Toledo, and 432 vs. Oregon State)
- 3,217 total offense yards in 2012 already rank No. 3 in single-season history.
- Scott has moved into a tie for fourth-place in single-season history with 20 passing touchdowns. Four more
 will push him into the No. 2 spot. He needs eight more to tie the record.
- Scott (2,848 yards) ranks No. 6 on the school's single-season passing yardage list. He is 240 yards away from moving up to No. 5.
- Scott's 242 pass completions rank No. 6 in single-season history.
- Scott's 26 career passing touchdowns rank No. 10 in program history.
- Scott's 62.7 percent completion percentage would rank No. 6 in single-season history if it were to hold up through season's end.

Dynamic Duo: Running back Ka'Deem Carey (1,381 rushing yards) and receiver Austin Hill (1,023 receiving yards) are just the second pair of Wildcats to post 1,000-yard rushing and receiving seasons in the same year. The only duo to previously do so was the school's all-time leading rusher, Trung Canidate (1,603 yards in 1999) and the school's No. 2 all-time receiver, Dennis Northcutt (1,422 yards in 1999), in the 1999 season. Interestingly, both Canidate and Northcutt set and still hold the single-season school records for rushing/receiving yards in those respective campaigns. This year's dynamic duo could soon become a 3,000-1,000-1,000 trio if quarterback Matt Scott collects 152 more passing yards to reach the 3,000-yard benchmark. The 1999 squad passed for over 3,000 yards as a team, but split production between Keith Smith (1,903 yards) and Ortege Jenkins (1,082).

Total Offense: Arizona has 5,260 yards of total offense to date, already the fifth-most all-time at the school. The school's single-season record (5,712 in 2010) will almost certainly be broken in Rich Rodriguez's first season in Tucson. In fact, UA's 526 yards per game would put the Wildcats into the top spot this week if they reached their season average. However, the Cats are averaging just over 400 yards per game in their three road contests of the season, so we won't put the cart before the horse in that respect — it's just another record to keep an eye on in a season full of record-breaking numbers.

Top-10 Day: While Ka'Deem Carey deserves much of the credit for a 438-yard rushing day, so too do linemen Mickey Maucus (LT), Cayman Bundage (LG), Kyle Quinn (C), Shane Zink (RG) and Fabbians Ebbele (RT) who started along the offensive line. Guard Trace Biskin rotated in all game long at the guard spots and tight ends Drew Robinson and Michael Cooper also played a big role in the point-of-attack blocking to pave the way for Carey's conference record 366 rushing yards. B.J. Denker (44 yards), Garci Wharton (19 yards), Jared Baker (five yards) and Daniel Jenkins (four yards) each chipped in rushing yards. The team's 438 rushing yards tie for the eighth-most all-time in a single game (438 vs. UTEP in 1973). The total was the most in game for the Wildcats since rolling up 460 against at Oregon State on Nov. 13, 1999.

Biletnikoff Semifinalist: Sophomore receiver Austin Hill is one of ten semifinalists for the 2012 Biletnikoff Award, presented to the nation's top receiver. Hill has turned in a stellar season and is one of 11 receivers in the FBS with more than 1,000 receiving yards to date. His biggest game came against No. 10 USC on Oct. 27 in which he racked up a career-best 259 receiving yards, the second-highest total in UA single-game history. On 10 grabs in that game, he set a UA single-game mark for yards per reception (25.9) and currently boasts a season average of 16.5 yards per catch. In the USC game alone, Hill had five receptions of 20-plus yards, including a career-long 60-yarder to continue a trend of making big plays all season long. In fact, Hill ranks tied for No. 4 in the nation in receptions of 20-plus yards (18) and third for 30-plus yards (11). He averages 102.3 yards per game, good enough for the No. 3 spot in the Pac-12 and No. 11 nationally.

Dan's The Man: In the receiving jamboree, senior Dan Buckner has been overshadowed by youngster Austin Hill, but the upperclassman has turned in a strong campaign. Buckner is second on the team in several receiving categories, including receptions (57), yards (716) and touchdowns (5). He averages 12.6 yards per grab — also second-best on the squad. With a pair of 100-yard receiving games, Buckner joins Hill (four 100-yard games) as one of three Pac-12 duos with multiple 100-yard games. Buckner is tied for No. 23 nationally with 34 receptions of 10-plus yards. He has 11 over 20 yards. His two touchdowns scores against Colorado were a new individual single-game best.

Red Zone Turnaround: The Wildcats hope to continue their run of success in the red zone. After an 0-for-5 effort in the red zone in a loss at Oregon on Sept. 22, Arizona has scored on 31 of its last 33 (94 percent) forays into the scoring zone, including a perfect 7-for-7 (all touchdowns) last week against Colorado. Of those, 26 (79 percent) have resulted in touchdowns. Both numbers are improvements over the team's season average of 78 percent overall and 63 percent touchdowns in the red zone.

Denker in the Books: Junior quarterback B.J. Denker did everything he had to do in his first career start against Colorado last Saturday, and his solid all-around effort will put him in the Arizona records book even if running back Ka'Deem Carey did most of the work. Combining Carey's 366 rushing yards with Denker's 44 yards, the duo totaled 410 rushing yards between them. That combined rushing total puts them over the 393 yards tallied between Kenny Cardella (200) and Don Beasley (193) against Arizona State on Nov. 28, 1954. That total had stood as the school record for most combined rushing yards gained by two Arizona players in the same game.

Mr. Efficiency: Backup quarterback B.J. Denker completed 12-of-14 passes for 136 yards and two touchdowns in his first start at Arizona. With no interceptions, he produced a 214.46 pass efficiency rating — the highest for a UA quarterback this season (previous high was Matt Scott's 212.29 vs. Washington). Denker spread the ball evenly to the Wildcats' top three receiving targets: Austin Hill (3-29), Dan Buckner (3-38) and David Richards (3-39). Denker's two touchdown tosses (21 and nine yards, respectively), went to Buckner who set a career-high with a pair of scores in the game. Running back Ka'Deem Carey caught a pair of passes for 34 yards as part of his 400-yard all-purpose day.

Boomin' Bonano: John Bonano quietly put himself into the Arizona record books last Saturday, converting his 69th-consecutive point after touchdown try after the Wildcats' final score against Colorado. The previous school record of 68-straight made PATs was held by Max Zendejas (1982-84) and Jason Bondzio (2007-08). In 2012, Bonano is 45-for-45 on his PAT tries after connecting on all 24 attempts a season ago when he took over the job at mid-season. Prior to Bonano assuming the role last October, the Wildcats had missed five PATs (13-for-18) in the first half of the 2011 season. In addition to his PAT duties this year, Bonano is 10-for-16 on field goal tries with a long of 46. He has made six of his last seven field goal attempts. The senior, who boasts a 3.92 GPA as a physiology major, has accounted for 75 points scored, which is 20 shy of breaking into UA's single-season top-10.

Seven Times Seven: After turning the ball over on its first offensive play, Arizona responded by scoring touchdowns on its next seven possessions. On those seven drives, the Wildcats ran 40 plays and gained 475 yards in just over 11 minutes of possession. The average time of possession on the second scoring drives was about 1:36, with two possessions lasting just 24 and 28 seconds respectively. Recent similar consecutive touchdown drive spurts include six-straight touchdown drives to open the game against UCLA in 2011 and six-straight to begin the 2008 season-opener against Idaho. In 2009 against Washington State, the Wildcats scored on seven-consecutive possessions, but two were field goals.

Conversion Game: Want to have success converting third downs? Don't get to third down. Last Saturday against Colorado, the Wildcats faced just six third down conversion plays, converting three of those. Otherwise, Arizona's 21 first downs typically came on first and second down conversions (17 of the 21, in fact). The Wildcats picked up eight first downs and scored five touchdowns on first down plays. They collected nine first downs on second down plays. Ka'Deem Carey and the rushing attack averaged 12.4 yards per carry on first down plays, while B.J. Denker was a perfect 7-for-7 passing on second downs to move the chains four times. Both of Denker's touchdown throws came on second down.

Did You Know? Ka'Deem Carey's 366 rushing yards last week against Colorado are more net yards than Washington State (329) has all season ... Carey's 1,381 rushing yards are more than the season total of 40 FBS schools to date ... Carey has rushed for 1,037 yards and has five 100-yard games in seven Pac-12 games this season (148.5 ypg) ... Arizona had forced a turnover in all but one game this season (loss at UCLA) and has turned it over at least once in all but one game (win vs. Oklahoma State) ... Arizona has trailed at some point in every game this season except one (South Carolina State) ... The Wildcats have "lost" the time of possession statistic in seven straight games and in eight of the 10 contests this season ... Opponents have scored the first points of a game in seven of the last nine games against the Wildcats.

Young Defense: Arizona has played 40 freshmen or sophomores this season, comprising more than half of the nearly 75 Wildcats to see the field. The Wildcats have played 10 true freshmen, the fourth-most of any Pac-12 school and among the top-20 nationally (research courtesy of David Plati at Colorado). With redshirts mixed in, UA has played more than 20 freshmen, most on defense where the Cats continue to learn Jeff Casteel's 3-3-5 scheme. Of the 110 defensive starts to date, more than half (62 total or 56.4 percent) have been turned in by freshmen or sophomores. The Wildcats have 43 starts from its junior class, and only five starts (each by Dominique Austin) by seniors, meaning over 95 percent of the defensive starters will return next season. Austin and fellow defensive linemen Chris Merrill and Willie Mobley are the only seniors that have appeared on the defensive two-deep this season. Last week true freshmen C.J. Dozier (LB) and Vince Miles (FS) made their first career starts.

Big Play Bondurant: Perhaps one of the most underrated defenders in the Pac-12 is "Spur" safety Tra'Mayne Bondurant. The true sophomore has a nose for the football and has proven to be a pest for opposing teams. The Vallejo, Calif., native is third on the team with 63 total tackles, but he leads all players and ranks 11th in the Pac-12 with 11.5 tackles for loss. The 11.5 stops behind the line surpass UA's season leader from a year ago, since-departed linebacker Derek Earls, who had 7.0 TFLs. Bondurant, who has five passes broken up, a forced fumble and a pair of interceptions, including one against Colorado last week.

Nov. 12 (Offensive POW) -- Ka'Deem Carey, RB 56-31 win vs. Colorado School/Pac-12 record 336 rushing yards, 5 TD, 400 all-purpose yards. **Rodriguez's 1,000-Yard Rushers:** Ka'Deem Carey became the first running back to post a 1,000-yard season under head coach Rich Rodriguez since Steve Slaton did so at West Virginia in 2007. At Michigan, only dual-threat quarterback Dennard Robinson (2010) mounted a 1,000-yard season during Rodriguez's three seasons. At West Virginia, Slaton had three-straight 1,000-yard campaigns, including in 2007, 2006 and 2005. His quarterback during those years, Pat White, also turned in 1,000-yard seasons in 2006 and 2007. Prior to the Slaton-White years, running backs Avon Cobourne (2001 and 2002) and Quincy Wilson (2003) had 1,000-yard seasons under Rodriguez. Added up, and with Carey included, that's 10 (ten) 1,000-yard rushers over 11 seasons as an FBS head coach for Rodriguez.

A Budding Star: Converted safety Marquis Flowers continues to develop as a linebacker, a position he was switched to about a week before the start of the season. At 6-foot-3, 221 pounds, Flowers is Arizona's biggest linebacker and ranks as team's leader with 5.5 sacks. Flowers is also second on the squad with 11.0 tackles for loss and second with 75 total tackles. He has added two interceptions, three pass breakups and has forced two fumbles. He has accounted for four takeaways in the last four games (forced fumble vs. Washington and two INTs and forced fumble vs. USC). Flowers was the Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Week last week for his effort against USC on Oct. 27.

Man In The Middle: Junior Jake Fischer has been a stalwart middle linebacker in Arizona's new 3-3-5 defensive scheme implemented this season by defense coordinator Jeff Casteel. Fischer, who missed the 2011 season with an ACL injury, ranks No. 3 among Pac-12 players and No. 44 nationally with 9.0 tackles per game (90 total). That's just a handful of tackles shy of 10 per game for the slightly undersized 6-foot, 215-pounder. Don't tell that to Fischer, though, who has shown a nose for the ball this season. Fischer has 5.5 tackles for loss, two pass breakups, two forced fumbles and a pair of fumble recoveries. He was named Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Week following a career-high 13-tackle season debut against Toledo on Sept. 1.

Gilbert Becoming a Force: True sophomore defensive lineman Reggie Gilbert is coming into his own as a pass-rusher for the Wildcats. The Laveen, Ariz., native has started six games this season and is second on the team with 3.5 sacks. Gilbert has totaled 5.5 tackles for loss, which ranks tied for third on the club, to go with his 14 total tackles. He also has one fumble recovery this season.

Sack Attack: Arizona has just 15 sacks on the season, but it's an area the young Wildcat defense is beginning to show improvement. Consider the club had only three sacks after four games to start the season. Now the Wildcats have registered a sack in six-consecutive games and have 12 total over those half-dozen contests. They would love to get a few more this week against Utah, a squad giving up 2.5 per game.

Kickin' Kyle: Senior punter Kyle Dugandzic is putting together a strong season, even if he is averaging less than four punts per game. Dugandzic's overall average is a hefty 43.5 yards per boot, with six 50-plus yarders. He has helped UA rank No. 3 in the conference and No. 22 nationally in net punting (39.7). He was named the Pac-12 Special Teams Player of the Week (Oct. 1) in a losing cause after a sensational performance against Oregon State that included a career-long 70-yard boomer and four of five total punts landing inside the 20-yard line. He again placed four punts inside the 20-yardline against USC three weeks ago. In that respect, Dugandzic has placed 17 of his 40 punts inside the 20-yard line and has just one touchback.

1,000-Yard Career: Quarterback Matt Scott sits at 1,001 career rushing yards, pushing him past a career benchmark not often achieved at the position (should be noted a QB risks losing yardage due to sacks in future games). UA's all-time leader for quarterback rushing is Ronnie Veal, who collected 1,419 yards and 27 touchdowns from 1987-90. Scott recently moved past Jim Krohn's 987 yards from 1976-79.

Building for the Future: The Lowell-Stevens Football Facility, scheduled to open in August 2013, marks a dynamic shift in the Arizona football culture as it will become the centerpiece of the program on the north end of Arizona Stadium. Supported by private funds, including significant leadership gifts from David and Edith Lowell and from Jeff and Sharon Stevens, the \$72.3 million project will provide the Wildcats with one of the premier football facilities in the nation. The facility will be a four-floor operations center with strength training, sports-medicine, coaches offices, locker rooms, meeting rooms, equipment and facility service areas. The structure will enclose the north end of the stadium and create a full bowl with nearly 4,000 premium spectator seats, including a donor lounge with outdoor seating. Additionally, stairways and elevator towers for the concourse will connect the structure to the existing east and west stadium sections. Restrooms, amenity areas and a cafeteria will also serve the campus community. Arizona Stadium has an official capacity of 51,811 for this season, but once work is completed on the Lowell-Stevens Football Facility, the venue will near the some 57,000 seats it has held in recent years.

Up Next: Arizona closes its regular season slate with the annual battle for the Territorial Cup — the nation's oldest recognized rivalry trophy game — against Arizona State on Friday, Nov. 23. The game will be televised nationally on ESPN and will kick off at 8 p.m. MST.

TUCSON, **Ariz**. **(AP)** - John Hays threw for 199 yards and a pair of touchdowns, and Utah's defense hounded Arizona quarterback Nick Foles into a pair of big mistakes en route to a 34-21 win over the Wildcats on Saturday.

Utah (5-4, 2-4 Pac-12) had another solid defensive game, hitting Foles early and often to set up two interceptions.

Hays continued to build confidence after his solid start against Oregon State last week, connecting on 12 of 21 passes. John White added 109 yards and a pair of touchdowns on the ground, moving Utah within a game of becoming bowl eligible for the ninth straight season.

Needing to win its final four games to become bowl eligible, Arizona (2-7, 1-6) fell flat.

The Wildcats had trouble protecting Foles and had some ugly miscues on special teams in the first half, including two blocked punts and a badly botched fake field goal.

Foles hit 25 of 43 passes for 326 yards and had a pair of touchdown passes to David Douglas, but threw two interceptions, including one in the end zone with the Wildcats on Utah's 2-yard line in the fourth quarter. Douglas finished with 10 catches for a career-high 156 yards.

The game figured to be a clash of strengths. Arizona has one of the nation's best passing offenses behind Foles, the nation's leader with over 32 completions per game.

Utah, despite its struggles in the Pac-12, has the nation's 22nd-ranked defense, allowing just over 325 yards per game, and is second in the conference in defensive scoring.

The advantage went to the Utes.

Utah pressured Foles relentlessly, sacking him twice in the first half while forcing him to make numerous throws on the run or with someone in his face throughout the game.

The Utes forced an interception in the second quarter by getting to Foles, who threw offbalance and Utah linebacker Matt Martinez made a diving grab at Arizona's 30-yard line. White scored four plays later on an 18-yard run off of the left tackle to put Utah up 17-0.

Utah had sustained success on special teams, too, breaking through to block two punts in the first half.

Greg Bird got to Kyle Dugandzic's first punt of the game, setting up a 32-yard field goal by Coleman Peterson. He missed from 42 yards after another partially-blocked punt in the second quarter.

Utah's offense wasn't bad, either.

Arizona stacked the box to stop the run early in the game and Utah made them pay for it, using play-action to spring DeVonte Christopher for a 65-yard touchdown pass from Hays that put the Utes up 10-0 on the second play of the second quarter.

Hays also opened the second half with a 44-yard touchdown pass to Reggie Dunn after Arizona cornerback Lyle Brown slipped, putting the Utes up 27-7.

Arizona's offense struggled before finally showing some life late in the second quarter, moving 73 yards in seven plays to set up Douglas' acrobatic 23-yard touchdown catch from Foles. Douglas made the catch over his shoulder while diving and barely got his foot in for the highlight-worthy score.

Foles hit Douglas again late in the third quarter, throwing on the run for a 42-yard touch-down that cut Utah's lead to 27-14.

Foles again had the Wildcats driving midway through the fourth quarter, but his lazy fade pass in the end zone from the 2-yard line was picked off by Utah's Conroy Black, who returned it across midfield. White followed with an 11-yard score to put the game out of reach.

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) -- Toledo coach Matt Campbell flipped a coin to determine his starting quarterback on Saturday. Unfortunately for him and the Rockets, who took snaps for Arizona did not come down to chance.

Arizona quarterback Matt Scott, scrambling to his right, barely inbounds and with a defender grabbing his jersey, tossed a 10-yard touchdown pass to Terrence Miller in overtime to give the Wildcats a 24-17 victory on Saturday night.

Arizona pulled out Rich Rodriguez's coaching debut after its kicker, John Bonano, missed a 25-yard field goal as regulation ended. Bonano missed a 24-yarder earlier in the game.

Scott threw for a career-high 387 yards and rushed for 74 yards. Ka'Deem Carey had 147 yards on 20 carries, including a 73-yard touchdown run.

Arizona amassed 624 yards, second-most in school history, to Toledo's 358 but had two touch-downs called back by penalties, turned the ball over three times and missed the two short field goals.

Terrance Owens threw a 59-yard TD pass to Alonzo Russell for the Rockets, who have never beaten a Pac-12 team.

With both teams disdaining the huddle, the game was played at a frenetic pace. In all, the teams combined for 182 plays, 94 by Toledo and 88 by Arizona.

Campbell, at 32 the youngest head coach in the FBS subdivision, flipped a coin to decide which of his experienced quarterbacks would start. Austin Dantin won the toss, but Owens replaced him after two series.

Owens didn't return after he was hit hard and fumbled the ball away in the third quarter. Owens was 11 of 22 for 134 yards, Dantin 10 of 25 for 63 yards.

Scott, who sat out last season as a redshirt junior while Nick Foles completed his college eligibility, kept Arizona's offense on the move all night. He completed 30 of 46 passes, including two touchdowns. He was intercepted once.

Dan Buckner caught 10 for 116 yards and Austin Hill seven for 139 yards, including a spectacular, diving, fingertip grab of Scott's 30-yard pass for Arizona's first touchdown.

Arizona seemed to have the game in hand when Scott rushed for 31 yards in three carries as the Wildcats drove to the Toledo 5 in the waning seconds, but he was tackled near the right hash mark, leaving Bonano a slight angle on his kick. The attempt wasn't even close, hooking far to the left to send the game into overtime.

Toledo, with both quarterbacks and several other significant players returning from last season's 9-4 team, moved the ball most of the night on the young, susceptible Arizona defense. But the Wildcats stopped David Fluellen for a 2-yard loss on third-and-1 at the Arizona 21, forcing the Rockets to settle for Jeremiah Detmer's 40-yard field goal that tied it at 17-17 with 14:18 to play.

Arizona led 3-0 after the first quarter on Bonano's 26-yard field goal.

After Detmer missed a 48-yard field goal, Arizona quickly advanced to the Rockets' 9-yard line. But after Richard Morrison caught a short pass from Scott, he dropped the ball, and Toledo's Toll Molls recovered at the Rockets' 6.

Toledo took it downfield from there, going 94 yards in 10 plays, with Owens finding Russell wide open on the 59-yard touchdown play that made it 7-3 with 13:55 left in the half. The Wildcats came back with a 10-play, 64-yard scoring drive, ending with Hill's diving grab to put Arizona ahead 10-7 with 12:04 left in the half.

Arizona had a 67-yard touchdown run by Daniel Jenkins negated by a holding penalty. Toledo regained the lead with a 63-yard drive aided by a defensive holding penalty and personal foul against Arizona.

Owens had a 23-yard pass to Cordale Scott on the drive, which ended with Cassius McDowell scoring on a 1-yard run to put the Rockets ahead 14-10 with 12:04 left in the second quarter, a lead that held until halftime.

Arizona blew another scoring opportunity in the second quarter when Scott threw over the middle to Hill on a 32-yard play, but the receiver fumbled when he was hit, and the ball bounced into the hands of Toledo's Robert Bell at the Rockets' 34-yard line.

TUCSON, Ariz. -- Oklahoma State quarterback Wes Lunt set a Big 12 freshman record by throwing for 436 yards and connected with Tracy Moore for four touchdown passes.

The Cowboys piled up 636 yards of offense, the second straight week they eclipsed 600 yards, and scored 38 points.

Those weren't the numbers that mattered.

Lunt threw three interceptions and Oklahoma State set a school record with 167 penalty yards, sending the 18th-ranked Cowboys to a frustrating 59-38 loss to Arizona in the desert on Saturday night.

Arizona (2-0) fell into a quick 14-0 hole before scoring the next 30 points as Oklahoma State (1-1) unraveled under a shower of yellow flags. Even with all the penalties, the Cowboys settled down enough to rally within two points late in the third quarter.

The Wildcats wouldn't let them any closer, scoring 29 points after the 3-minute mark of the third quarter to run away from the Cowboys.

Ka'Deem Carey ran for 147 yards in his debut as the featured back last week and followed it up by scoring four touchdowns while rushing for 126 yards on 26 carries.

Matt Scott also had a nice follow-up to his dazzling opener, throwing for 320 yards and two touchdowns on 28-of-41 passing while running for 55 yards and another score.

Together, they helped Arizona take a step toward becoming relevant again.

Lunt hit 37 of 60 passes and threw for the fourth-most yards in school history in his second game as Oklahoma State's starter. He also had some shaky moments, tossing three interceptions, including one returned 48 yards for a touchdown by Jonathan McKnight in the fourth quarter.

Joseph Randle added 123 yards on 23 carries but the Cowboys just couldn't seem to stay out of their own way, committing 15 penalties and turning it over four times.

Defensive tackle Calvin Barnett was called for consecutive personal fouls on one play, setting up Scott's 15-yard touchdown pass to Richard Morrison.

A fumble by Randle on the next drive, followed by a late-hit penalty on cornerback Broderick Brown, set up a 22-yard field goal by John Bonano.

A fourth personal foul by Oklahoma State in the half, on linebacker Shaun Lewis for hitting Scott as he slid, led to a third field goal by Bonano, a 24-yarder. Carey added a 1-yard touchdown run - with a little help from teammates - late in the quarter to put Arizona up 23-14 at halftime.

Oklahoma State had nine penalties for 110 yards in the half and its last drive ended when Arizona's Jared Tevis intercepted a tipped pass by Lunt at the Wildcats' 29.

The second half opened the same way: Barnett was flagged for a late hit on the opening play and Arizona scored on a 13-yard screen pass from Scott to Carey for a 30-14 lead.

But the score seemed to snap the Cowboys out of their funk.

Lunt hit Morgan for a 9-yard touchdown pass and the Cowboys kept marching on Arizona the next drive, setting up Jeremy Smith's 10-yard touchdown run that cut Arizona's lead to 30-28.

It turned out to be their last gasp.

The Wildcats raced down the field on their next drive, setting up Scott's 8-yard touchdown run up the middle. Lunt, facing pressure for one of the few times all game, threw up a weak pass early in the fourth quarter and McKnight picked it off for an easy touchdown. Oklahoma State was called for pass interference on the 2-point try - naturally - and Arizona converted on the second attempt to go up 45-31.

Carey sealed it with a 25-yard TD run up the middle and added a 1-yarder for good measure in the closing minutes to send the Zona Zoo into a frenzy and the Wildcats to a look-at-us win.

"There's some excited guys in the locker room and I'm proud of them," Rodriguez said. "It's a nice win, the guys played and made the plays when they needed to."

And with it should come some extra - and wanted - attention.

▼TUCSON, **Ariz.** (**AP**) — South Carolina State had trouble stopping No. 24 Arizona's offense, allowing the Wildcats to run a whopping 102 plays.

It was just as bad for the Bulldogs on offense, maybe even worse.

Overmatched against the bigger, fasters Wildcats, South Carolina State managed just eight first downs in a 56-0 loss to Arizona on Saturday night.

Arizona knocked off No. 18 Oklahoma State last week and opens the Pac-12 next weekend at No. 4 Oregon. Sandwiched in between was a game against the Bulldogs, one the Wildcats couldn't afford to take lightly.

They didn't.

Instead of a letdown as coach Rich Rodriguez feared, Arizona (3-0) handled a from the Football Championship Subdivision as any good program would, racing out to a 28-0 lead by halftime and a school-record 43 first downs overall.

Matt Scott threw for 288 yards and three touchdowns on 30-of-36 passing, and added a 10-yard scoring run in another stellar performance to start his senior season.

Arizona's try-to-keep-up-with-us offense ran a school-record 102 plays and had 689 total yards, two short of another record.

The defense was just as dominant, holding South Carolina State (1-2) to 154 total yards for its first shutout in four years.

Yep, this was just the kind of confidence-building tuneup the Wildcats needed before heading to rowdy Autzen Stadium for their first road game of the season.

South Carolina State had little chance against Arizona's athleticism, unable to top the Wildcats from marching down the field or get anything going on offense.

The Bulldogs failed to crack double-digits in first downs and had virtually no running game, gaining 65 yards on 29 carries. Quarterback Richard Cue trouble against Arizona's speedy defenders, badly missing several receivers while going 12 for 25 for 89 yards with an interception.

After rolling over Oklahoma State 59-38 last week, the Wildcats moved into The Associated Press poll for the first time in nearly two years.

They needed an easy win with a tough Pac-12 run coming up next. After the Ducks next weekend, Arizona plays a conference schedule that includes No. 2 Southern California, No. 21 Stanford, No. 22 UCLA and rival Arizona State.

The Wildcats had no trouble moving the ball against the Bulldogs, but did have a little problem getting out of their own way in the early going.

Arizona raced to a touchdown on its first possession, Scott capping it with a 15-yard touchdown pass to Richard Morrison.

Moving quickly again, the Wildcats lost the ball near midfield when Morrison fumbled and the Bulldogs recovered. Another fast-moving drive ended with John Bonano, the reigning Pac-12 special teams player of the week, pushing a 25-yard field goal wide right.

Those turned out to be just blips in the Wildcats' march of dominance.

Scott hit Taimi Tutogi on a 14-yard touchdown to open the second quarter after the Bulldogs bit hard on a play-action fake. Ka'Deem Carey capped the next drive with a 7-yard touchdown run around the right end.

Scott closed out the impressive first half by pinballing off several defenders into the end zone for a 10-yard run that made it 28-0.

Scott, who entered the game tied with Syracuse's Ryan Nassib for the national lead with 836 total yards, threw for 175 yards and ran for 61 more in the first half.

Arizona's offense had 323 yards by halftime and its defense held South Carolina State to 69.

If it wasn't over already, the Wildcats made sure in the third quarter, when Scott hit Dan Buckner on a 27-yard touchdown pass and Jenkins carried half of South Carolina State's defense with him on a 5-yard scoring run that made it 42-0.

By then, pretty much all of Arizona's starters were on the sideline, resting up for what will certainly be a much tougher task against the fast-flying Ducks.

The Wildcats will at least go there on a high instead of coming off letdown after taking care of the Bulldogs.

EUGENE, Ore. (AP) — Redshirt freshman Marcus Mariota threw for 260 yards and two touchdowns, including a 55-yard scoring pass to freshman Bralon Addison late in the third quarter, and No. 3 Oregon beat No. 22 Arizona 49-0 Saturday night.

Billed as an offensive juggernaut between the Pac-12's fastest scoring teams, Oregon didn't find its stride until the second half — and Arizona never did — and the Ducks (4-0, 1-0) got their seventh straight conference-opening victory.

Much had been made about the meeting between the quick-striking Ducks under Chip Kelly and Arizona's spread offense under no-huddle, up-tempo pioneer Rich Rodriguez. Oregon went into it the averaging 54 points per game, while Arizona wasn't far behind with an average of a little more than 46 points.

However, Arizona (3-1, 0-1) couldn't find the end zone and quarterback Matt Scott, a fifth-year senior who spent the last two season's behind Nick Foles, passed for 210 yards but was intercepted three times — one returned for a touchdown.

The game got off to a sloppy start as Oregon failed on fourth down and each team turned the ball over before Mariota found Daryle Hawkins with a 17-yard touchdown pass midway through the first quarter.

Arizona got as close as the 2-yard line on the next series, but couldn't punch it in and turned the ball over on downs. The Wildcats' struggles' continued when John Bonano's 31-yard field goal was blocked early in the second quarter.

Rob Beard hit a 27-yard field goal to increase Oregon's advantage to 10-0. It was the Ducks' first FG of the season. Beard added a 41-yarder late in the first half to make it 13-0 at the break.

While both offenses appeared to sputter at times, defenses made the difference in the first half. Oregon's hybrid 3-4 under longtime defensive coordinator Nick Aliotti held the Wildcats to 141 yards in total offense in the first 30 minutes. Meanwhile, Arizona's new 3-3-5 defense kept the normally prolific Ducks from piling on points.

There was more of the same to open the second half, and the first two possessions by both teams ended in punts.

But then the Ducks started rolling. De'Anthony Thomas returned Arizona's third-straight punt 38 yards, setting up a 35-yard pass to Colt Lyerla, who finished it off with a 1-yard touchdown run. The drive took just three plays and 29 seconds.

Kiko Alonso intercepted Scott, leading to Mariota's long TD pass to Addison, before Ifo Ekpre-Olomu ran his interception back 54 yards to make it 35-0.

Bryan Bennett added an 8-yard scoring run with 4:02 left in the game before Troy Hill intercepted Scott's backup, B.J. Denker, for a 29-yeard touchdown and the final margin.

Arizona opened coach Rodriguez's tenure with a victory over Toledo before upsetting then-No. 18 Oklahoma State 59-38 in their second game. Last weekend in a 56-0 win over South Carolina State, the Wildcats ran a school-record 102 offensive plays.

The Wildcats were the first big test for Oregon, which opened the season with victories over Arkansas State, Fresno State and lower-division Tennessee Tech.

Before this season, Arizona hadn't been ranked in the AP Top 25 since November 2010, when the No. 20 Wildcats were knocked out with a 48-29 loss to the then-No. 1 Ducks.

Last season, Oregon defeated Arizona 56-31 in Tucson.

Oregon's last shutout of Arizona came in 1964, when the Ducks won 21-0 at Hayward Field in Eugene.

TUCSON, Ariz. -- A momentum-swinging game hanging in the balance, Oregon State coach Mike Riley pulled out a play he had been saving all game.

So what if he would have liked more space to run it. This was the time to do — and it couldn't have worked out any better.

Sean Mannion threw for a career-high 433 yards and hit Connor Hamlett on a 9-yard pass with 1:09 left for his third touchdown, lifting No. 18 Oregon State to wild 38-35 win over Arizona Saturday night.

Oregon State (3-0, 1-1 Pac-12) took a 17-0 lead, Arizona charged back and the teams traded scores in the second half of a game filled with big plays and 1,158 yards of combined offense.

Arizona (3-2, 0-1 Pac-12) landed a big blow in the can-you-top this second half, going up 35-31 with 5:34 left when Matt Scott hit Austin Hill on a 7-yard touchdown. The problem was that it left too much time for Mannion.

Knowing his team had moved the ball all game against the Wildcats, the calm-and-cool sophomore guided the Beavers 75 yards down the field in 10 plays. Facing a third-and-5 with just over a minute left, Mannion called out a play that sent one receiver into the left flat and Hamlett down the sideline. Arizona's defenders followed the receiver in the flat and Mannion whipped a pass to Hamlet, who slipped just inside the pylon for the winning score.

Mannion finished 29 of 45 for the fifth-most passing yards in school history while setting a career high for the second week. He hit Markus Wheaton 10 times for 166 yards and a pair of touchdowns, and Brandin Cooks nine times for 149 yards.

Storm Woods added for 161 yards and a touchdown for the Beavers, off to their first 3-0 start since 2002. Arizona nearly kept up with them.

Scott fought through a sprained ankle in the second half to throw for a career-high 403 yards and three touchdowns, but had two interceptions, including one near midfield in the final minute. Ka'Deem Carey ran for 115 yards and two touchdowns. Dan Buckner caught six passes for 119 yards and a score.

It wasn't enough for Arizona, which has lost two straight after opening 3-0.

Mannion was sharp early, hitting Cooks on a 57-yard pass in the first quarter to set up a 2-yard touch-down pass to Wheaton in the back of the end zone.

Next series, Mannion hit Wheaton for a 51-yard gain, leading to Trevor Romaine's 30-yard field goal.

Mannion found Kevin Cummings next, on a 38-yard pass to position Tyler Anderson for a 1-yard touchdown dive that put the Beavers up 17-0.

Arizona's offense tried to answer after sputtering early.

The Beavers bogged Arizona down in the first quarter and held when the Wildcats had their first sustained drive, which ended with John Bonano pushing a 30-yard field goal wide right after Scott was called for intentional grounding.

That wasn't a good sign for the Wildcats, who went 0-for-6 in the red zone in a 49-0 loss to Oregon last week.

Arizona managed to end its red-zone woes late in the second quarter, though, when the officials checked the replay to see if Carey fumbled at the 1-yard line and determined he actually went into the end zone for a score that cut Oregon State's lead to 17-7.

Arizona kept rolling on its opening drive of the second half, quickly marching 91 yards in 10 plays for a 3-yard pass from Scott to Hill.

The Wildcats needed a minute to score again, this one a 24-yard run up the middle by Carey, who carried a couple of Oregon State defenders into the end zone with him to put Arizona up 21-17.

Scott made a mistake on the next drive, when Jordan Poyer missed an interception at midfield, then got it when the ball caromed off Richard Morrison. That set up a 1-yard touchdown run by Woods to give Oregon State the lead back.

Woods followed with a mistake of his own, losing a fumble at Oregon State's 40. Scott then threw to the corner of the end zone to Buckner, who's over-the-shoulder, 16-yard TD catch put the Wildcats up 28-24.

Mannion's turn was next. Using a pump fake, he got the entire right side of Arizona's defense to bite and winged a 20-yard touchdown to Wheaton that put the Beavers back out front.

Scott answered, marching the Wildcats for a 7-yard touchdown pass to Hill, who dived in the final yard to make it 35-31.

He just left too much time for Mannion and the Beavers, who head home to play Washington State next week with plenty of momentum on their side.

STANFORD, Calif. -- Josh Nunes bailed out Stanford's defense for a change and started to erase doubts about whether he's the right man to replace Andrew Luck after all.

Nunes threw for a career-high 360 yards and two touchdowns and ran for three more scores, rallying No. 18 Stanford from a two-touchdown deficit to stun Arizona 54-48 in overtime Saturday.

Chase Thomas intercepted a tipped pass by Matt Scott in the extra period and Stepfan Taylor ran for a 21-yard touchdown two plays later to end a week of second-guessing Nunes with a wild celebration in the Cardinal (4-1, 2-1 Pac-12) side of the north end zone.

The offense failed to find the end zone in a 17-13 loss at Washington last week. Nunes underthrew several passes or misfired completely, and critics began to mount enough for Shaw to open his weekly news conference defending his new quarterback and boldly calling any question about a change "asinine."

Nunes followed his coach's words with his most solid game of the season. He completed 21 of 34 passes, scrambled for first downs and -- most importantly -- offset Scott's record-setting performance.

Scott completed 45 of 69 passes — both school records — for 491 yards and three touchdowns until Henry Anderson tipped his final pass in overtime that Thomas intercepted. Arizona (3-3, 0-3) amassed 617 total yards — same as Stanford — but lost for the third straight game and is still winless in conference play.

For most of the afternoon, the Wildcats scored at will and looked more like the team that beat Oklahoma State to start 3-0 than the one that lost to Oregon and Oregon State the previous two weeks. Facing its third straight ranked opponent, Arizona's aerial attack shredded Stanford's defense in a way few have the past few seasons.

The Wildcats became the first team to eclipse 400 yards passing against the Cardinal since Oklahoma in the 2009 Sun Bowl. The Sooners threw for 418 yards in that 31-27 win over the Cardinal.

Arizona's defense couldn't hold up when it counted.

Nunes ran his second short touchdown to trim Arizona's lead to 48-41 with 6:34 remaining. The Cardinal held the Wildcats to only their third three-and-out on the next possession, and Nunes led a drive that will help ease concerns about Luck's successor.

The redshirt junior ran for 16 yards on third-and-7 from midfield, threw 17 yards to tight end Zach Ertz on fourth-and-9 from Arizona's 20 and ran for the tying touchdown with 45 seconds left in regulation.

This time, Stanford's offense showed some fight from the start.

Taylor, who finished with 142 yards rushing and two touchdowns, ran for 35 yards on seven carries before Nunes lofted an 11-yard touchdown pass to Ertz in the corner of the end zone to give the Cardinal a 7-0 lead on the game's first possession.

While the offense finally found its rhythm, Stanford's defense struggled to slow down Arizona's uptempo style.

Ka'Deem Carey ran for 13 yards for the first of his three touchdowns, and John Bonano kicked a 34-yard field goal to give the Wildcats a 10-7 lead later in the second quarter.

Nunes stayed steady and sharp, finding Levine Toilolo for a 12-yard touchdown pass to put Stanford back ahead 14-10. Bonano kicked a 33-yard field goal to slice Stanford's lead to 14-13 at half.

The pace picked up even more following the break.

Scott threaded a 27-yard strike to Terrence Miller inches short of the goal line that set up Carey's short touchdown run to put Arizona in front 20-14 less than 2 minutes into the third quarter.

Although the Cardinal prefer to play grind-it-out games and control the clock, Arizona simply wouldn't let them.

The teams traded touchdowns for most of the second half until Jourdon Grandon stripped Ty Montgomery after a 16-yard catch early in the fourth quarter. Arizona recovered and took over at Stanford's 45.

Scott quickly led the offense down field and hooked up with Miller for a 10-yard completion that gave the Wildcats a 48-34 lead — the biggest either side had all afternoon. Scott nearly set the school passing record set by Willie Tuitama, who threw for a school-record 510 yards in a 48-41 win over Washington on Oct. 27, 2007.

TUCSON, Ariz. -- Matt Scott threw for 256 yards and four touchdowns, Ka'Deem Carey ran for 172 yards and Arizona raced out of its bye week with a 52-17 rout over Washington Saturday night.

Arizona (4-3, 1-3 Pac-12) went into its bye worn down and beaten up after three straight losses to ranked opponents.

Refreshed and mostly recuperated, the Wildcats had their way with Washington's defense from the opening drive, eclipsing 500 total yards (533) for the sixth time this season.

Scott finished 14 of 22, throwing two touchdowns to Austin Hill, and ran for another score. Carey scored on a 2-yard run, and Richard Morrison added a 63-yard touchdown on a punt return to give coach Rich Rodriguez his first Pac-12 win.

Washington (3-4, 1-3) had no chance against Arizona's fast-paced offense, and quarterback Keith Price had another so-so game in the Huskies' third straight loss.

Price matched Scott with 256 yards passing, but his line didn't look quite as good, needing 52 attempts to get there and with two interceptions to offset his one touchdown.

Washington played a brutal schedule the first half of the season, facing four teams in the top 11 of the AP poll. The Huskies were run over in two of those, on the road against LSU and Oregon, but beat Stanford and stayed close to USC last week despite four turnovers and a blocked punt.

It didn't figure to get any easier against Arizona and its go-all-the-time offense, particularly since it didn't go so well the last time the Huskies faced an up-tempo team.

Of course, that was against arguably the fastest team in the country, No. 2 Oregon, which ran past them for a 52-21 victory.

Preparing for a no-huddle team and seeing one live should have helped the Huskies against Arizona, which had run more plays than all but one team before its bye week.

It didn'

Snapping the ball almost as soon as the officials placed it, the Wildcats picked Washington's defense apart behind Carey's quick-burst running and Scott's pinpoint passing.

Scott set Pac-12 records for completions (45) and attempts (69) while throwing for 491 yards and three touchdowns in Arizona's 54-48 loss to Stanford two weeks ago.

The fifth-year senior didn't have to work quite as hard against Washington.

He opened by getting two Washington defenders to bite on a pump fake to set up a floating, 27-yard touchdown pass to David Richards.

Scott did it next with his legs, scoring on a 1-yard run, then his arm, finding Garic Wharton on a 33-yard touchdown pass on fourth-and-3 to put Arizona up 24-3. He also had a quick answer to Washington's first touchdown -- a 6-yard pass from Price to Austin Seferian-Jenkins -- by hitting Hill on a 53-yard touchdown.

Scott's only real mistake came in the closing seconds of the first half, when he was hit, and his fluttering pass was picked off by Washington linebacker Travis Feeney at midfield. He rumbled to the 3-yard line, setting up Bishop Sankey's 1-yard touchdown run that cut Arizona's lead to 31-17 at halftime

The miscue did little to slow the Wildcats down.

Arizona gained about 10 yards when

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) — His team trailing by 15 in the third quarter, Arizona coach Rich Rodriguez urged his players to show a little life. Even after the Wildcats scored, they — and much of the stadium — remained quiet.

Matt Scott woke them up.

Scott didn't get a chance to play in Arizona's shootout loss to Southern California last year, but sure put his imprint on the rematch, accounting for 469 total yards and four touchdowns in the Wildcats' 39-36 upset of the 10th-ranked Trojans on Saturday.

The Wildcats (5-3, 2-3 Pac-12) had come up short in close games during their first season under Rodriguez and appeared to be headed toward another disappointment as USC receiver Marqise Lee raced past them into the Pac-12 record book.

Scott wouldn't let Arizona come up short again.

The fifth-year senior ran for 100 yards and got Arizona's comeback started with a 10-yard touchdown run late in the third quarter. He threw for 369 yards, 259 of that on 10 catches by Austin Hill, and finished 27 for 50 passing.

Scott capped his day with his third touchdown pass, a 7-yarder to David Richards that put Arizona up 39-28 with just over five minutes left. He was wobbly and unable to play on Arizona's final possession after taking a hard hit, but had already done enough to give the Wildcats their biggest win under Rodriguez.

Margise Lee had a huge day for USC (6-2, 4-2), eclipsing the Pac-12 record for receiving yards by halftime. He finished with 16 catches for 345 yards and two touchdowns, ending up with 469 all-purpose yards after a couple of big kick returns.

Matt Barkley put up big numbers, too, matching Carson Palmer's school record for 400-yard games with his third, throwing for 493 yards and three touchdowns on 31-of-49 passing.

USC finished with 618 total yards and pulled within three on Silas Redd's 10-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter, but couldn't overcome five turnovers — two on interceptions by Barkley — and 13 penalties for 117 yards.

The Trojans' last shot ended when Barkley's heave on the final play was swatted down, leaving them stuck on 799 wins as a program while putting a huge dent in their national championship hopes.

USC won last year's offensive shootout 48-41, surviving Arizona's second-half comeback thanks to Barkley's school-record 468 yards and four touchdowns passing.

They spent the first half of the rematch trying to get out of their own way.

Barkley threw his two interceptions — and nearly several others — and overthrew tight end Xavier Grimble in the end zone on a fourth down. Redd also lost a fumble in the first half and safety Jawanza Starling lost a fumble on an interception return.

USC also had eight penalties for 79 yards in the first half, including a taunting call against safety T.J. McDonald that extended Arizona's opening drive. Scott capped that by hitting Johnny Jackson on an 8-yard touchdown pass.

Arizona had a few discipline problems of its own.

The Wildcats had a 1-yard touchdown run by Ka'Deem Carey wiped out by a holding call and kicker John Bonano pushed a 37-yard field goal wide right after another hold erased his make from 27 on the first half's final play.

USC shook off its mistakes behind some big plays in the first half by Barkley and Lee.

Barkley connected with Grimble on a 12-yard touchdown early in the second quarter, then found Lee late, hitting him in stride for a 49-yard touchdown that put the Trojans up 14-10.

Lee kept getting open and Barkley kept finding him, setting up a 3-yard touchdown run by D.J. Morgan that put the Trojans up 21-13 late in the second quarter.

Lee opened the second half with a 44-yard touchdown catch to put USC up 28-13 and break the Pac-12 record of 293 yards receiving set by Oregon State's Mike Hass against Boise State in 2004.

So was Scott

He scored on the 10-yard run, then found Dan Buckner on a 9-yard touchdown pass to pull Arizona within 28-26 after the Wildcats recovered a fumble by Morgan.

Carey scored on a 7-yard touchdown run the next drive, Scott extended the lead to 39-28 with his TD pass to Richards.

Redd scored and USC got ball back for a final drive, but came up short when Arizona knocked Barkley's final heave harmlessly to the turf, giving Arizona its first tight win after disappointing losses Stanford and Oregon State.

PASADENA, Calif. (AP) -- Johnathan Franklin couldn't stop smiling after becoming UCLA's career rushing leader. The wide grin wasn't just about what he accomplished personally Saturday night at the Rose Rowl

Franklin gained 162 yards, redshirt freshman Brett Hundley passed for 288 yards and three touchdowns, and UCLA (No. 25 AP) overwhelmed Arizona (No. 22 BCS, No. 24 AP) 66-10 to move into first place in the Pac-12 South.

And that position is something UCLA hasn't experienced in 14 years — a possible berth in the Rose Bowl game. The Bruins know if they win their final three games plus the Pac-12 championship game that they'll be playing in Pasadena on New Year's Day.

Their confidence should be soaring after such an impressive win against an opponent that seemed poised to give them a hard-fought game. UCLA entered as a three-point favorite.

Franklin entered needing 21 yards to overtake Gaston Green, who gained 3,731 yards from 1984-87.

Franklin moved into the top spot with a 37-yard touchdown run on his third carry, capping a 75-yard, nine-play drive following the opening kickoff that put the Bruins (7-2, 4-2 Pac-12) ahead for good.

Franklin, who carried 24 times and scored twice, raised his career rushing total to 3,873 yards as the Bruins, off to their best start since 2005, raced to a 42-3 halftime lead in snapping a five-game losing streak to the Wildcats (5-4, 2-4) who beat them 48-12 in Tucson last year.

The Bruins called a timeout after Franklin's record-breaking run to allow teammates to congratulate him. The crowd of 81,673 at the Rose Bowl joined in the celebration. Franklin came into the game as the country's seventh-leading rusher.

The 66 points were the most scored by the Bruins since Oct. 4, 1997, when they beat Houston 66-10.

UCLA gained 371 yards of its 611 yards in the first half against a shaky Arizona defense, which came into the game ranked 110th out of 120 teams in total defense.

The Wildcats, ranked fourth nationally in total offense with a 553.6-yard average, gained just 83 of their 257 yards in the opening 30 minutes.

Hundley, who completed 16 straight passes at one stage, finished with 23 completions in 28 attempts without being intercepted.

The win gave the Bruins a better record than crosstown rival Southern California through nine games for the first time since 2001. The 18th-ranked Trojans (6-3, 4-3) lost to No. 2 Oregon 62-51 earlier Saturday.

Arizona's Matt Scott, ranked second nationally in total offense at 386.1 yards per game, completed 15 of 25 passes for 124 yards before being shaken up and leaving the game midway through the third quarter. Scott was unable to finish his team's 39-36 upset of USC last weekend after being injured late in the game.

Regarding the game, Rodriguez said he was embarrassed by his team's performance.

Arizona's Ka'Deem Carey, the country's 12th-leading rusher, was held to 54 yards on 16 carries.

The Bruins took a 21-0 lead before Arizona got a first down, scoring on Franklin's record-setting run, a 6-yard keeper by Hundley seven plays after an 18-yard punt by Kyle Dugandzic gave UCLA the ball at the Wildcats 34-yard line, and a 17-yard pass from Hundley to Jordan Payton that finished an 85-yard drive.

David Allen recovered a muffed punt by Arizona's Richard Morrison at the Wildcats 39-yard line early in the second quarter, and Damien Thigpen scored on a 1-yard run three plays later to make it 28-0.

John Bonano's 28-yard field goal midway through the second period put Arizona on the scoreboard, but Franklin scored on a 2-yard run to cap a 75-yard, 11-play drive. A 36-yard punt return by Randall Goforth to the Arizona 32 set up a 1-yard TD pass from Hundley to Joseph Fauria with 14 seconds left before halftime.

Ka'imi Fairbairn's 25-yard field goal early in the third quarter made it 45-3 before the usually high-scoring Wildcats finally scored a touchdown on Carey's 2-yard run.

B.J. Denker, who relieved Scott, fumbled on his second play and Cassius Marsh recovered for the Bruins. Hundley threw a 28-yard scoring pass to Fauria on the next play to make it 52-10. Steven Manfro scored on a 14-yard run and Melvin Emesibe added a 1-yard plunge in the final period for UCLA.

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) - Ka'Deem Carey ran for a Pac-12 record 366 yards and scored five touchdowns, powering Arizona to a 56-31 rout of Colorado on Saturday.

Carey, who carried 25 times, broke the record of 357 rushing yards set by Washington State's Rueben Mayes at Oregon on Oct. 27, 1984. The sophomore's five rushing TDs — of 10, 13, 30, 8 and 3 yards — tied a conference record. Carey, whose longest gain of the day was 71 yards, smashed the school record of 288 yards set by Trung Canidate against Arizona State in 1998.

Arizona's Ka'Deem Carey ran for 366 yards and 5 touchdowns Saturday, becoming the seventh player since 2000 with at least 300 yards and 5 touchdowns in the same game. Here's a look:

With Pac-12 leading passer Matt Scott out with a concussion, junior college transfer B.J. Denker completed 12-of-14 passes for 136 yards and two touchdowns in his first start for Arizona (6-4, 3-4). He also ran for 44 yards and a touchdown as the Wildcats became bowl eligible with their sixth win, rebounding from a 66-10 embarrassment at UCLA the previous week.

In his first start this season, Colorado's Nick Hirschman was 12 of 13 for 123 yards and one interception. Connor Wood relieved Hirschman and went 4 of 7 for 90 yards and a touchdown. Christian Powell rushed for 137 yards and two scores for the Buffaloes (1-9, 1-6), and Donta Abron gained 83 yards in 13 attempts.

Wood connected on a 71-yard pass play to Scott Fernandez for a touchdown that cut the lead to 49-31 with 10:22 left. It was Fernandez's first career catch. But after the subsequent kickoff, Carey broke through on a 64-yard run to the Colorado 3, then scored from there to provide the final 56-31 score.

The Buffaloes had the ball for 41 minutes, 48 seconds, yet still lost by 25.

Denker and Carey messed up a handoff on Arizona's first offensive play, and Derrick Webb recovered for the Buffaloes at the Arizona 7. Powell rumbled into the end zone on the next play and Colorado led 7-0.

The Wildcats scored touchdowns on their next seven possessions.

First came a nine-play, 80-yard drive, capped by Carey rushing 10 yards for the first of his three first-half touchdowns. Denker was 3 of 3 for 42 yards on the drive.

The Buffaloes mounted their longest drive, in time elapsed, of the season, consuming 8:24 to go 69 yards in 15 plays. On fourth-and-goal at the 1, Colorado chose Will Oliver's 18-yard field goal, which put the underdog Buffs up 10-7.

The lead lasted just under two minutes. Denker completed three straight passes, then Carey rushed in from the 13 and Arizona was up for good, 14-10 with 13:31 left in the half.

Hirschman, replacing Jordan Webb -- who started the first nine games -- completed his first eight passes before his toss into the left flat went right into the hands of Tra'Mayne Bondurant. Had he not bobbled the ball, Bondurant would have scored easily, as he did with an interception return at Colorado last season.

As it was, Arizona took over at the Colorado 49. Garic Wharton gained 19 on an end-around, then Carey broke a series of tackles in a 30-yard run that made it 21-10.

Another long, time-consuming drive moved the Buffaloes 75 yards in 13 plays, using up 7:51. Powell scored from the 1 to cut it to 21-17 with 2:44 left in the half.

That was plenty of time for Arizona, even without Scott. Carey started the drive with a 26-yard run and had another for 21 yards to set up Denker's 21-yard scoring pass to Dan Buckner, and Arizona led 28-17 at the half.
