Two Individual Wins, One Team Title, NCAA Berth Cap Year

In the Clubhouse: Arizona closed the 2009-10 campaign with an appearance in the NCAA Southwest Regional, marking the program's 21st regional berth in the 22 years since the format was introduced in 1989 ... In 12 stroke play events, the Wildcats posted four top-five finishes, including a win at the Braveheart Classic on March 2 ... Two UA players claimed individual medalist honors in 2009-10: Rich Saferian at the Arizona Invitational on Feb. 2 and Tarquin MacManus at the aforementioned Braveheart Classic ... MacManus was an honorable mention all-Pac-10 selection by the league's head coaches.

The Rankings: The Wildcats are ranked 40th in the final (June 8) *Golfweekl* Sagarin Performance Index, and were receiving votes in the most recent (May 19) *Golf World*/Nike Coaches Poll. Individually, junior Tarquin MacManus was the top-ranked Wildcat nationally, checking in at No. 78 on the *Golfweekl* Sagarin Performance Index. Rich Saferian was next at No. 205.

Head Coach Rick LaRose . . . completed his 32nd season at the helm of the Arizona golf program, and in that span has established the Wildcats as one of the nation's elite programs. The only college coach to win both a men's (1992) and women's (1996) NCAA Championship, LaRose's teams have won a combined nine NCAA Regionals, six Pac-10 crowns and three Rolex Match Play titles. In NCAA Championship play, he also has six third-place finishes, two fifth-place and two sixth-place efforts to his credit. Since 1978, his men's teams have won 60 tournaments and produced 47 All-Americans. LaRose, who has coached two U.S. Amateur champions, was inducted into the Golf Coaches Association of America Hall of Fame on Jan. 22, 2003, and the Arizona Golf Hall of Fame on Nov. 23, 2009. He is assisted by Andy Barnes and volunteer Justin Silverstein.

Last Time Out: Arizona finished in a tie for 10th place at the 2010 NCAA Southwest Regional in Santee, Calif.

Arizona posted a third-round total of 304 (+16) to finish the 54-hole event with a 908 (+44) tally a share of 10th place with Missouri. UA collected two rounds at par or better in the final round, but couldn't gather the necessary momentum from the bottom of the

lineup to move up higher than 10th place.

Oregon won the event with a sixover par 870 total, 10 strokes ahead of Augusta State. California, Tennessee and UNLV each tied for third place at 886 (+22) to qualify for the NCAA Championships. Individually, CSU-Northridge's Nick Delio captured individual medalist honors with a three-under 213 total.

As was the case the entire event, Arizona was led by junior

Tarquin MacManus. The Cairns, Queensland, Australia, native shot a two-under 70 and ended in a in a tie for fifth place at even-par 216. He improved his standing in each round of play and collected his fourth top-10 finish of the season.

MacManus missed qualifying for the NCAA Championships by three strokes. Senior Rich Saferian tied for 21st place at seven-over 223, courtesy of an even-par 72 Saturday. He moved 21 places up the leader board over the final 18 holes.

The 2010 NCAA Southwest Regional was contested at Carlton Oaks Golf Club, a par-72, 7,360-yard layout.

NCAA Postseason History: By earning a place in the 2010 NCAA Southwest Regional, Arizona collected its 27th NCAA postseason appearance in program history. Since the NCAA regional format was introduced in 1989, Arizona has had a presence in all 22 regionals. Twenty-one times in that span UA has participated as team, while individual Tarquin MacManus represented the Cats in 2008, the only time during the run that Arizona did not qualify as a team. The Wildcats have 26 NCAA Men's Golf Championship appearances in its history (tied for 20th in NCAA history), but 2010 marked the first time that the team had failed to qualify when participating in a regional.

Championship Qualifications: Since Rick La Rose led Arizona to his first of 22 NCAA Championship appearances in 1987, the Wildcats have been as good as anyone when it comes to competing for the national championship. In fact, Arizona is one of just four teams nationally to appear in 22 or more national championship events in that span. Here is the list of schools with 20 or more appearances: 1.) Oklahoma State, 24; 2.) Arizona State and Florida, 23; 4.) Arizona, 22; 5.) Clemson and Georgia Tech, 21; 7.) Texas, 20. Additionally, five of the seven schools on the list have won national championships since 1987 (Georgia Tech/Texas).

All-Conference: One UA men's golfer received all-Pac-10 honors in voting done by the conference's head coaches, the league announced May 3. Targuin MacManus was an honorable mention pick, marking the third consecutive season that he has been recognized. The junior was a second-team all-conference selection in 2008 and 2009.

All-Academic: Three Arizona golfers earned a spot on the Pac-10 Conference's all-Academic squad, as Philip Bagdade, John Kostis and Kenji Hernandez were honored. Bagdade and Kostis were first-team picks, while Hernandez was a second-team honoree. To be eligible for selection to the Pac-10 all-Academic team, a studentathlete must have a minimum 3.0 overall grade point average and be either a starter or significant contributor. It marks the 10th straight year in which a Cat has been named to the all-Academic team, and the three honorees in 2010 equals a high for the program since 1990.

A Top-10 Guy: After carding rounds of 75, 71, 70 en route to an even-par 216 and a tie for fifth place at the NCAA Southwest Regional, Tarquin MacManus collected his fourth top-10 finish of the season, a figure that led the team. In fact the junior has led the club in that statistical category in each of his seasons in Tucson. Over the last three seasons, MacManus has earned a total of 12 top-10 finishes, including two victories and a runner-up placing.

Good Under Pressure: Tarquin MacManus has certainly proven himself to be a stellar golfer when it matters most. A year after winning the 2009 NCAA Southeast Regional with a 15-under par 198 – the lowest aggregate total for a UA golfer in NCAA regional action – the junior from Cairns, Queensland, Australia, posted a 216 (E) and finished in a tie for fifth place. That first-/fifth-place finishes in consecutive NCAA regionals is the third-best, back-to-back placing in Arizona history. Only Ricky Barnes, who won in 2002 and finished third in 2003, and Chris Nallen, who finished fourth in 2003 and won in 2004, topped MacManus' efforts in the last two regionals. In three career NCAA regional appearances, MacManus carries a 71.44 scoring average.

Atop the Leaderboard: Arizona is no stranger to the top of the leader board, both as a team and individually. The Wildcats claimed the Braveheart Classic, March 2, by 20 strokes with an 858 (-6) total. It was the 69th win in UA history and the first since October 2007. The 20 stroke separation was the largest margin of victory for UA since Feb. 21, 1992, when the Cats won the John Burns Intercollegiate by 21 strokes. Individually, two Cats claimed medalist honors this year, the 65th and 66th wins for the program. Rich Saferian won the Arizona Invitational, Feb. 2, with a 13-under par 200 total, while Tarquin MacManus won the Braveheart Classic with a six-under 210 tally.

Seeking Stability: Only three Wildcats – Tarquin MacManus, Rich Saferian and Jonathan Khan, managed to appear in all 12 varsity stroke play events with sophomore

Philip Bagdade appearing in the last nine consecutive. Additionally, Arizona used the same lineup in the first four events of the spring, but has switched things up in the last four appearances, including the Callaway Collegiate Match Play Championships. All told, Arizona used a total of eight different lineups in 2009-10.

Up and Down: A quick look at the statistics shows that Arizona is clearly a second round club. In its 12 stroke play events, the Wildcats' lowest scoring round is the second, with an adjusted average of 286.76. The Cats open play with an average of 289.24 in round one and post a third-round average of 291.00. Not surprisingly, Arizona low round of any tournament was registered in the second round eight times, while it's high round appeared in the third five times.

Statistically Speaking: When it comes to counting towards the team total, Rich Saferian and Jonathan Khan led the Wildcats, as both tallied a 94.6 percentage (35 of 37 rounds played). Tarquin MacManus was also above 90 percent (91.9%/ 34 of 37), while John Kostis (83.3%/10 of 12) and Philip Bagdade (78.6%/22 of 28) rounded out the top five.

Red Numbers: Five times in 2009-10 Arizona finished a tournament under par: one-under 863 at the Wolf Pack Classic in October, 28-under 824 at the Arizona Invitational and 10-under 854 at the John Burns Intercollegiate in February, six-under 858 at the Braveheart Classic in March, and six-under 846 at the ASU Thunderbird Invitational in April. All told, the Cats registered 16 under-par rounds as a team in 11 stroke play events with the lowest single round, 271 (-13), occurring Feb. 1 at the Arizona Invitational.

Lead the Way: Junior Tarquin MacManus led the team with a 71.65 stroke average, top-10 finishes (4), rounds in the 60s (11), rounds at par or better (23) and rounds played (40). The Cairns, Queensland, Australia, native was UA's top finisher in seven of 12 stroke play appearances, including a win and six additional finishes in the top-20. His seven-under 2206 tally at the Arizona Invitational earned him a fifth-place finish, while that seven-under total was his lowest tournament of the season.

Proving His Worth: Senior Rich Saferian provided a nice boost this season, collecting four top-20 finishes in 13 starts to go with a 72.68 stroke average, which ranks second on the club and is the lowest of his career. His best effort was a victory Feb. 2 at the Arizona Invitational, in which he posted a 68-66-66=200 (-13) for the first win at Arizona. He also won the U.S. Open local qualifier on May 10 at Tucson Country Club with a 67.

The Fulcrum: Junior Jonathan Khan has been a remarkably consistent player for the Cats this season, playing in all 13 varsity events, ranking third on the team with a career-low 72.89 scoring average, and sharing the team lead with 35 of 37 rounds counting towards the team total. But more often than not, UA's successes were pinned on the play of the Tucson, Ariz., native. It's no coincidence that Khan's low seven tournaments of the year were the also Arizona's low tournaments as a team.

Getting Better: Philip Bagdade continue to show progress on the golf course, as the sophomore from Eugene, Ore., posted a 73.52 scoring average (0.86 lower than 2008-09), three top-20 finishes, 13 rounds at par or better and four rounds in the 60s.

Up Next: The Arizona coaching staff signed three student-athletes to National-Letter-of-Intent. Tye Beall from El Paso, Texas, Ben Esparza from Tucson, Ariz., and Erik Oja from Sandviken, Sweden, will join the program in the Fall of 2010.

2009-10 Arizona Men's Golf Tournament Summaries

William H. Tucker Intercollegiate (10th of 17 teams)

Sept. 11-12, 2009 Albuquerque, N.M.

The University of Arizona men's golf team moved up two spots on the leader board, finishing in 10th place at the William H. Tucker Intercollegiate in Albuquerque, N.M.

The Wildcats, playing in its first event of the 2009-10 season, were in 12th place a day earlier when lightning suspended play during the second round. Arizona managed a second-round 290 and closed with a 302 (+14) to cap the 54-hole event with an 888 (+24) tally.

UNLV topped the 17-team field by 16 strokes with an 843 (-21) total. Individually, Arizona was led by Tarquin MacManus, who earned his first top-20 finish of the season. The junior from Cairns, Queensland, Australia, carded rounds of 71, 68 and 76 to finish in a tie for 13th place with a 215 (-1) total. He was the only Wildcat to post two rounds at par or better, and finished seven strokes behind a UNLV duo - Derek Ernst and Colby Smith - who shared individual medalist honors at 208 (-8).

Wolf Pack Classic (6th of 13)

Arizona carded a 286 (-2) in the final round of the Wolf Pack Classic in Reno, Nev., to finish in sixth place.

The Wildcats finished one-under par for the tournament, but couldn't make up ground on the leaders in the final round. Despite shooting a solid round of 286 (-2), the Cats finished sixteen shots behind tournament-winner Wichita State (-17).

In his fourth year with the program, Junior John Kostis is finally getting his chance in the Arizona varsity lineup. The Paradise Valley, Ariz., native placed seventh in just his second varsity event and was the top Arizona finisher. He played all three rounds at or under par, including a career-low 68 to close, and is the first Wildcat to post a top-10 finish this season.

Rich Saferian and Jonathan Khan joined Kostis in the top 20. Saferian finished in a tie for 13th place at one-under par (215). Khan tied for 17th at one-over 217.

Del Walker Intercollegiate (9th of 16)

After a stellar second round put the Cats back into contention in the tournament, Arizona shot its worst round of the tournament to fall from fourth to ninth. Colorado St. earned a nine-stroke victory.

Tarquin MacManus fell out of the top 20 when his final-round 72 (+2) took him from T11 to T21. MacManus was one under for the event.

Gifford Collegiate at CordeValle (9th of 14)

The Arizona men's golf team finished in ninth place at the Gifford Classic at CordeValle with its 1086 (+6) tournament total.

Jonathan Khan concluded his best tournament of the season with a 72 (E), keeping him at six under for the tournament, good enough seventh place. Khan became only the second UA golfer to register to a top-10 finish; John Kostis finished seventh in the Wolf Pack Classic.

Tarquin MacManus recorded his second top-20 finish of the year. His 212 (-4) tied him for 13th place. MacManus played all three rounds under par, bringing his team leading total to eight rounds played under par this season.

Stanford won the event with a score of 1056 (-24).

Western Refining College All-America Golf Classic

Nov. 23-24, 2009 El Paso, Texas

Tarquin MacManus carded rounds of 67, 76 and 75 to finish in a tie for 23rd place at the Western Refining College All-America Golf Classic in El Paso, Texas.

The junior from Cairns, Queensland, Australia, was tied for seventh place after the first 18 holes, but slipped in the remaining two rounds of this invitational-only event featuring All-Americans from the 2009 campaign.

Alabama's Hunter Hamrick won the event in sudden death with an 11-under 202 total.

Arizona Invitational (2nd of 14)

Feb. 1-2, 2010 Tucson, Ariz.

After dominating day one of the Arizona Invitational, California had to fight back on the back nine in day two to claim a one-stroke victory over host Arizona.

The Wildcats, who trailed Cal by seven strokes heading into the day, got off to a furious start, taking the lead from the Bears and expanding it to as many as five strokes. It was a close race that was eventually decided on the 18th green.

California went a combined six under on the par-5, including an eagle by its number five golfer, Eric Mina, three shots better than Arizona on the final hole. Individual medalist Rich Saferian's birdie putt lipped out, proving to be the difference in the Golden Bears' victory.

Cal shot an 823 (-29) for the tournament, one stroke better than Arizona. Fresno State carded an 838 (-14) to finish third, one stroke ahead of third-ranked Florida at thirteen under.

Arizona's Rich Saferian earned the first victory of his Wildcat career by three strokes. Saferian, who started the day in third place, shot the best round of the day, a 66 (-5) to claim victory.

Saferian's 68-66-66=200 (-13) was the lowest tournament of his career and was the first time he played all three rounds under par. This was also the lowest finish of the season for Tarquin MacManus. The junior tied for fifth place with his seven-under 206.

John Burns Intercollegiate (3rd of 17)

Arizona, who entered the day in fifth place in the event, finished sixth despite a 77 (+5) and a 79 (+7) by its top two golfers, Tarquin MacManus and Rich Saferian, respectively. Both scores are season highs for the two. MacManus' 77 came in the final round, dropping him to T43. The junior started the day tied for 16th, looking for his third consecutive top-10 finish in the event.

UNLV and Texas A&M finished the third round tied at 28-under par before the Rebels won the playoff on the first hole. Texas A&M's Andrea Pavan carded the lowest round of the day, a 65 (-7), to claim the individual medal.

Philip Bagdade collected his first top-20 finish of the season by closing out the tournament with back-to-back rounds played at par. Jonathan Khan tied for 29th at one over. After opening with a 79 (+7), Saferian played rounds two and three under par, and finished only two over par.

Braveheart Classic (1st of 15)

March 1-2, 2010 Beaumont, Calif.

The Arizona men's golf team earned its first victory of the season with a 20-stroke dominance in the Braveheart Classic. In addition, junior Tarquin MacManus used a third round 66 (-6) to take home individual medalist honors.

Five Arizona golfers finished in the top 16, including three in the top five. MacManus and Rich Saferian were two of only three golfers to finish the tournament under par. Saferian finished third at two under. Jonathan Khan shot even for the tournament, tying for fourth place, his highest finish of the year. Philip Bagdade also earned his top finish of the year; he finished 14th at four over. Brad Nicholson, who had never recorded a top-20 finish in his fourteen events played as a Wildcat, tied for 16th.

The win was Arizona's first since Oct. 9, 2007. The two year drought was Arizona's longest since not winning a tournament in 1998 or '99. The 20 stroke separation is the largest margin of victory for UA since Feb. 21, 1992, when the Cats won the John Burns Intercollegiate by 21 strokes.

This marks the second time in three events that a Wildcat has claimed the individual medal. Saferian won Arizona Invitational Feb. 2. This win was MacManus' second of his career; he won the 2009 Southeast Regional.

2009-10 Arizona Men's Golf Tournament Summaries

Southern Highlands Collegiate Masters (15th of 15)

March 12-14, 2010 Las Vegas, Nev.

The Arizona men's golf team shot a 320 (+32) in the final round of the Southern Highlands Collegiate Masters, dropping it to last place in the event. The Cats shot a 938 (+74) for the tournament.

UNLV and UCLA tied for the team title, as each posted a 35-over for the tournament. Arizona State's Jesper Kennegard shot a final-round 76 (+4) to take home the individual medal.

The 15th-place finish is the worst of the year for Arizona, which was led by Tarquin MacManus. The junior tied for 21st at 13-over. Jonathan Khan shot the best round of the day for the Cats, a 76 (+4). Khan finished 14-over and in a tie for 27th. Philip Bagdade tied for 31st with a final score of 232 (+16). Competing as an individual, John Kostis finished 66th. At 31-over, Rich Saferian tied for 75th. Brad Nicholson finished 78th.

National Invitational Tournament (4th of 14)

March 17-18, 2010 Tucson, Ariz.

Bolstered by balance from top to bottom, TCU led wire-to-wire in winning the 2010 National Invitational Tournament at Omni Tucson National Golf Course.

The Horned Frogs posted a five-under 283 Thursday en route to a three-round total of 852 (-12) to win by 10 strokes. Four of TCU's five golfers finished within two strokes of par and in the top-18 places of the field to easily distance themselves from the rest of the field. The five-man team totaled nine rounds at par or better in the 54-hole event.

Texas (852), SMU (865), Arizona (867) and California (870) rounded out the top-five places. SMU carded the low round of the day and the tournament, a 10-under 278, to earn a top-three finish.

Host Arizona, who finished in fourth place, was led by Tarquin MacManus. The junior from Cairns, Queensland, Australia, posted rounds of 68, 73 and 74 to finish in a tie for fifth place. It was his third top-10 finish of the season.

MacManus was one of three Wildcats to finish in the top 20 places, as senior Rich Saferian and junior Jonathan Khan finished in 12th and 18th places, respectively. Saferian carded an even-par 216, while Khan tallied a one-over 217.

Callaway Collegiate Match Play Championship (10th of 16)

The University of Arizona men's golf team was defeated by Indiana, 3-2, in the final round of the Callaway Collegiate Match Play Championship at the Ritz-Carlton Golf Course at Dove Mountain.

The 16th-seeded Hoosiers got two 1-up wins from the bottom of its lineup to win the consolation bracket final. Indiana finished the event with a 3-1 match play record, while Arizona fell to 2-2.

Arizona's Jonathan Khan posted a 3 and 2 victory over Indiana's David Erby. Khan, a product of Tucson, Ariz., opened the day with a win on his first hole of the day, and took the lead for good with a birdie-3 on hole 17 and pushed his lead to 3-up with wins on the next two holes. Khan closed the match with a par-4 on hole seven, the 16th hole of the day.

Freshman Trent Redfern earned Arizona's second point of the day with a 1-up win in 19 holes over Indiana's Brant Peaper. A native of Austin, Texas, Redfern and his opponent were all square through 18 holes before he won the match with a birdie-3 on hole 10, the 19th hole of the match.

In its three previous matches in the event, Arizona lost to Texas A&M, 3-2, and defeated Middle Tennessee State, 3-2, and Texas Tech, 3-2.

ASU Thunderbird Invitational (T4th of 16)

The Arizona men's golf team entered the final round of competition in the ASU Thunderbird Invitational with a two stroke lead; the Cats finished the tournament six-under and tied for fourth place.

Third-ranked Washington used a 16-under third round, the low round of the tournament, to earn the come-from-behind win.

Arizona was led by Jonathan Khan, who tied for 11th at three-under. The Cats finished in a tie for fourth with two top-five teams, No. 4 Oregon and No. 2 Stanford.

In the first two rounds, eight of the 10 rounds played by UA golfers were played at or under par. In round three, no Wildcat recorded such a round. The best round by an Arizona player was a 72 (+1), carded by Juan Pablo Hernandez, who tied for 42nd in the event.

Rich Saferian shot a 73 (+2), which dropped him out of the top-20, and into a tie for 24th. Philip Bagdade finished five-over and in a tie for 49th. Tarquin MacManus started the day in the top-20, but shot a 78 (+7) in the third round to drop him into a tie for 57th.

Competing as individuals, Trent Redfern finished in a tie for 47th and Kenii Hernandez finished 88th.

2010 Pac-10 Championships (9th of 10)

The University of Arizona men's golf team slipped to ninth place at the 2010 Pac-10 Championships in Tempe, Ariz.

With just one member of the six-man squad under par on the day, Arizona posted its highest round of the day and finished in ninth place. The final-round tally of 366 (+11) gave UA a 72-hole tally of 1,421 (+1). Just three teams in the field were under par during the final round.

Washington claimed the championship with a 1,383 (-37) total, erasing a seven-stroke deficit to start the round. The Huskies, winners of back-to-back titles, finished ahead of Stanford (1,386), USC (1,396) and host Arizona State (1,401. California's Eric Mina topped the 60-man field by one stroke to claim individual medalist honors at 16-under 268.

Junior Tarquin MacManus was the top-finishing Wildcat, posting a final-round 73 (+2) en route to a six-under 278 total and a 14th-place finish. The Cairns, Queensland, Australia, native has been Arizona's top finisher in four of the last five stroke play events and has a total of six top-20 finishes this season.

Sophomore Philip Bagdade turned in a final-round 70 (-1), which was UA's low round of the day. The effort moved him into 15th place with a five-under 279 tally. The tournament total was Bagdade's low of the season and his placing was his second-best in 2009-10.

2010 NCAA Southwest Regional (T10th of 13)

Arizona finished in a tie for 10th place at the 2010 NCAA Southwest Regional in Santee, Calif.

Arizona posted a third-round total of 304 (+16) to finish the 54-hole event with a 908 (+44) tally a share of 10th place with Missouri. UA collected two rounds at par or better in the final round, but couldn't gather the necessary momentum from the bottom of the lineup to move up higher than 10th place.

Oregon won the event with a six-over par 870 total, 10 strokes ahead of Augusta State. California, Tennessee and UNLV each tied for third place at 886 (+22) to qualify for the NCAA Championships. Individually, CSU-Northridge's Nick Delio captured individual medalist honors with a three-under 213 total.

As was the case the entire event, Arizona was led by junior Tarquin MacManus. The Cairns, Queensland, Australia, native shot a two-under 70 and ended in a in a tie for fifth place at even-par 216. He improved his standing in each round of play and collected his fourth top-10 finish of the season.

MacManus, the individual medalist at last year's NCAA Southeast Regional in Sorrento, Fla., was Arizona's top finisher in seven of 12 stroke play events this season. He missed qualifying for the NCAA Championships by three strokes.
