Arizona Heads to Corvallis, Ore., for 2002 Pac-10 Championships

On the Tee: Bolstered by two strong finishes in its last two events, the Arizona Wildcats head to Corvallis, Ore., for the 2002 Pacific-10 Conference Championships, April 25-27 ... After a slow start to the spring, UA is averaging 284.33 strokes over its last six rounds and has been under par in five ... Arizona has six top-five finishes in 10 team events this year.

The Rankings: After opening the season as the nation's second-ranked team, Arizona closed the fall portion of the schedule ranked No. 11 by *Golf World* magazine and currently hold down a No. 13 ranking by *Golf World*, 18th in the Precept/GCAA Coaches Poll and No. 22 in the *Golfweek*/Sagarin Performance Index. *Golf World* also selected UA junior Ricky Barnes as the nation's Preseason Player of the Year and included sophomore Chris Nallen in its "50 College Players to Watch" list. Individually, three UA players are ranked in the top 135 nationally in the *Golfweek*/Sagarin Performance Index. In case you wondered, Arizona is ranked No. 4 nationally in the GCAA Fan Poll.

A Look at the 2002 Pacific-10 Conference Championships: Oregon State hosts the 2002 Pacific-10 Conference Championships, April 25-27 at Trysting Tree Golf Club, a par 72, 7,022-yard layout. The 10-team tournament includes Arizona, Arizona State, California, Oregon, Stanford, UCLA, USC, Washington, Washington State, and host Oregon State. Three of those teams (Arizona, USC, Washington) are ranked in the April 18 Precept/GCAA Coaches Poll. The 72-hole event features 36 holes on Thursday and 18 on Friday and Saturday. Six players will compete for each team with the top five scores counting in each round. Play is scheduled to begin at 7:30 a.m. PDT on Thursday and 8 a.m. thereafter. Arizona has won this event twice in its history (1987/1991) and claimed six individual winners since joining the league in 1978-79.

Head Coach Rick LaRose . . . is in his 24th season at the helm of the Arizona golf program, and in that span has established the Wildcats as one of the finest programs in the nation. The only college coach to win both a men's (1992) and women's (1996) NCAA Championship, LaRose's teams have won seven NCAA Regionals, five Pac-10 crowns and three Rolex Match Play titles. In NCAA

Championship play, he also has five third-place finishes, a fifth-place and two sixth-place efforts to his credit. Since 1978, his men's teams have won 44 tournaments and produced 57 All-Americans. He is assisted by John Knauer.

Last Time Out: UA posted its lowest tournament total of the year to tie for fifth place at the ASU Thunderbird/Savane Invitational.

Arizona's 845 (-19) total was its lowest of the season by eight

strokes and placed the team in a tie for fifth with TCU in the 16-team field. Arizona, who notched three sub-par rounds in a tournament for the first time this season, posted the eighth-lowest team total in the ASU Thunderbird/Savane Invitational since 1988. Texas won its second straight event in the state in the last six days with an 832 (-32) total.

Individually, Arizona was led by junior Ricky Barnes, who finished tied for 10th place with a seven-under 209 total. Barnes' final-round 70 gave him his lowest tournament total of the season. All told, Arizona collected 11 rounds at par or better from its fiveman lineup in the two-day event.

Also competing for the Wildcats was sophomore Chris Nallen, who tied for 19th place at 211 (-5), freshman Kipp Riehle, who tied for 38th place at 215 (-1), sophomore Andy Connell, who tied for 47th place at 217 (+1) and junior Reid Hatley, who tied for 63rd at 220 (+4). Two UA freshman also competed as individuals. Nick Juszczak and Nathan Lashley both tied for 72nd place at 223 (+7).

Last Year at the Pac-10 Championships: Sophomore Ricky Barnes shot a final-round 68 to win the individual title at the 2001 Pacific-10 Conference Men's Golf Championships. Barnes, who led the event wire-to-wire, claimed individual medalist honors with a four-round total of 268 (-16). It was the fourth career victory for Barnes, and his second of the year. Barnes' 16-under-par total was a record low for a UA golfer at the Pac-10 Championships. His title marked the sixth time a Wildcat golfer has won the Pac-10 championship since UA joined the league in 1978-79.

Barnes was one of just two golfers in the 60-player field to register four consecutive rounds in the 60s. He won the tournament by three strokes over Hunter Mahan of USC. who tallied a 271 total (-13). UA freshman Chris Nallen continued his run of strong play by posting a fifth-place finish with a 276 total (-8).

The duo of Barnes and Nallen helped the Wildcats finish in third place as a team. UA tallied a 355 team total (E) on Sunday and finished with a 1,408 total (-12). Arizona, which placed fifth in this event last season, finished eight strokes behind USC, which won the tourney with a 1,400 total (-20).

Sophomore Reid Hatley closed the tournament with two sub-par rounds and finished in 11th place. Hatley fired a one-under-par 70 Sunday and posted a 282 total (-2). Also competing for the Wildcats were juniors Cody Beyer and Ben Clark and freshman Andy Connell. Beyer finished in 41st place at 293 (+9), while Connell finished tied for 42nd at 294 (+10) and Clark finished tied for 49th at 296 (+10).

Hogan Award: Sophomore Chris Nallen was Tuesday named one of 20 semifinalists for the Ben Hogan Award, which honors the nation's outstanding male college golfer. The award, given by the Friends of Golf, Colonial Country Club and the Golf Coaches Association of America, is based on play from May 1, 2001-May 1, 2002.

Defending Champion: Junior Ricky Barnes heads into the conference championships looking to defend the individual title he won after shooting a four-round 268 (-16) last season. If he could pull off the feat, Barnes would join Arizona's Jason Gore (1993/ 1994) and Arizona State's Paul Casey (1998/1999/2000) as the only players to win back-to-back conference titles since UA and ASU joined the league in 1978-79.

Been Here Before: The Trysting Tree Golf Club is certainly one that the field is familiar with, as nine of 10 league members participated in last year's NCAA West Regional on the same layout. The Cats tallied a three-over-par 867 and finished second in the event behind Arizona State. Four of the six UA golfers in the lineup for the 2002 Pac-10 Championships appeared in last year's Regional, including Chris Nallen, who finished tied for fourth at 213 (-3).

Steady Improvement: As mentioned earlier, Arizona heads into the Pac-10 Champion-ships playing some of its best golf of the season, as the squad has posted five consecutive rounds under par. Furthermore, the Cats have carded an improved tournament total in each of the last five tournaments. Seven of UA's nine sub-par team rounds have come in spring competition.

Really Red Numbers: Since posting a 77 and equaling his worst round of the season on March 25, sophomore Chris Nallen has been red hot. In the eight rounds since then, the Blairstwon, N.J., native has earned two top-five finishes (including a runner-up finish at the U.S. Collegiate Championships) and is averaging 68.88 strokes per round. Seven of those eight rounds have been under par, including four in the 60s.

A Top-10 Guy: Nallen earned runner-up honors with a 65-73-68=206 (-10) total at the PING-U.S. Collegiate Championships, April 7, and put his name in the UA record books as well. His three-round score tied for 10th place on the UA scoring list for low tournament aggregate total and score in relation to par. In his two-year career, Nallen has eight top-10 finishes, including one career victory, in 24 starts.

Snapping Out of It: Ricky Barnes may be reaching the light at the end of the tunnel. After struggling for much of the season with his putter, the junior carded a 70-69-70=209

(-7) last week at the ASU Thunderbird/Savane Invitational, which was his best tournament total since early February. It marked the first time all season that Barnes has been under par in all three rounds of a tournament and his second sub-par total of 2001-02. He enters the Pac-10 Championships with a 72.55 stroke average this season, 1.50 strokes higher than his career stroke average entering the year. Prior to last weekend, Barnes had been over par in 10 of last 12 rounds.

Rock Solid: Junior Reid Hatley continues to be one the least-heralded golfers in the UA lineup, but his contributions are key to Wildcat success. Remarkably consistent, Hatley has picked up the pace lately by posting a 72.25 stroke average over the last eight events (24 rounds). Included in that span are 12 rounds at par or better, which have helped Hatley to a pair of top-10 and three top-20 finishes. His three-under 213 and a tie for seventh place at the John Burns Intercollegiate in February both equaled season bests for the Spokane, Wash., native.

In Relief: With the format change for the Pac-10 Championships that counts five scores out of six golfers, freshman Nathan Lashley joins the UA lineup for the weekend. Lashley proved his worth by posting a 75.46 stroke average in 10 tournaments this season. His run of solid play started in Oregon with a tie for 25th place March 26, as he carded a 76-71-72=219 (+3) total at Oregon Duck Invitational. Lashley is averaging 73.58 strokes in his last four appearances with the UA varsity. Additionally, he's posted a 71.33 stroke average in the final round of his last three appearances.

Stepping Up: Sophomore Andy Connell's efforts over the last two weeks were as important as any in helping the team earn top-five finishes at the PING-U.S. Collegiate Championships and the ASU Thunderbird/Savane Invitational. The Denver, Colo., native has averaged 73.50 strokes over the last two events, including a season-low 217 (+1) finish last week in Tempe, Ariz. In the last two weeks, Connell has posted his best placement (T34), low tournament total, set a season-low round (69), and collected all four of his sub-par rounds this season.

In the 60s: UA carded four more sub-70 rounds last week to bring the team's 2001-02 total to 22 rounds in the 60s. Individually, Nallen leads the way with eight, Barnes has four, and freshman Kipp Riehle has three.

Preseason Player of the Year: Junior Ricky Barnes was tabbed by *Golf World* magazine as the No. 1 men's college golfer in the nation. The Stockton, Calif., native has 13 top-10 finishes in his two-year career, including four victories. His 71.05 career stroke average is the lowest in school history. Sophomore Chris Nallen was named to the publication's "50 College Golfers to Watch" list.

Early Signees: University of Arizona men's golf coach Rick LaRose signed three student-athletes to National Letters-of-Intent during the November signing period. Zack Amole (Devner, Pa./Cocalico H.S.), Brett Carter (Phoenix, Ariz./Mountain Pointe H.S.) and Blaine Peffley (Lebanon, Pa./Cedar Crest H.S.) will join the Wildcat golf program in the Fall 2002.

A Quick Look Back at the Fall Schedule: Arizona collected two top-five finishes in four fall team events, including a fourth-place effort at the Jerry Pate National Intercollegiate in October. Playing with a lineup that featured two freshmen and no seniors for the majority of the fall, the Wildcats improved its scoring average with each passing tournament and finished the fall with a 291.00 stroke average. Sophomore Chris Nallen collected two top-10 and three top-20 finishes in five individual events and finished with a team-leading 71.53 stroke average.

2000-01 In Review: Arizona closed another highly-successful season with its 15th consecutive berth in the NCAA Championships. The Cats finished third for the second straight season. No team west of the Central Time Zone has finished ahead of UA at the NCAA Championships in the last two years. Arizona earned two team championships in 2000-01, including the CGF Match Play National Championship in November, and three individual wins. Ricky Barnes and Chris Nallen were named to the 2000-01 GCAA NCAA Division I Ping All-America team on June 3.

Posted his best finish of the year with a fourth-place effort at the PING-Arizona Intercollegiate Feb. 4-5, where he carded a 71-67-69=207 (-6) ... Shot 71-72-75=218 (+5) to finish 23rd at the Savane College All-America Golf Classic in El Paso ... Posted his worst round of the year (79) in the final 18 to finish tied for 28th at the Jerry Pate National Intercollegiate after shooting 72-70-79=221 (+8) ... Was threeunder par over the last two rounds to finish tied for 35th at the Taylor Made Red River Classic at 216 (E) ... Finished tied for 29th place at The Preview by Ping and Golfweek with an eightover-par 221 total ... Finished tied for 10th place at the William H. Tucker Intercollegiate with a 73-75-69=217 (+1) ... It was his 14th career top-10 finish and his 28th career round in the 60s.

Ben Clark

Senior, Austin, Texas 74.83 stroke avg.

Left the squad at the end of the fall semester ... Collected a tie for 21st place at the 49er Collegiate Classic on Nov. 9 after carding a 75-72-77=224 (+11) ... Was UA's top finisher at the Fresno Lexus Classic, shooting a 76-69-80=225 (+9) to place in a tie for 41st ... He equaled his career low with a second-round 69.

Andy Connell

Sophomore, Denver, Colo. 75.94 stroke avg.

Connell continues to improve with each performance, and is a collective three-under par over his last five rounds ... Has a 73.5 stroke average over his last two tournaments ... Shot a oneunder 69-70-78=217 to tie for 47th place at the ASU Thunderbird/Savane Invitational ... Collected his first two sub-par rounds (including a second round 69) of the season at the PING-U.S. Collegiate Championships, April 5-7, to earn his best finish of the season (T34th) with an 84-69-71=224 (+8) ... Carded a 75-76-79=230 (+14) at the Oregon Duck Invitational on March 25-26, for a then-season low in his second varsity appearance of the season ... Shot a 77 (+5) in stroke play match vs. Skidmore College on March 14 and earned six points in the UA junior varsity win ... Saw his second action of the season on Feb. 4-5 at the PING-Arizona Intercollegiate, where he shot a 78-74-80=232 (+19) to finish in 98th place ... His second-round 74 was a season low round ... Freshman has seen action in six junior varsity events and played as an individual at the PING-U.S. Collegiate Championships ... Tied for 34th place at the PING-U.S. Collegiate Championships, April 5-7, with a 72-74-78=224 (+8) ... Posted his first career top-20 finish after carding a 74-75-72=221 (+5) to finish in 11th place at the Anteater Invitational on March 25-26, the top UA finisher ... Posted a 76 (+4) total in the stroke play match vs. Skidmore College on March 14, and earned two points in the UA junior varsity win ... Finished tied for 43rd at the Herb Wimberly Collegiate Classic March 1-2 with a 238 (+22) total ... William H. Tucker Intercollegiate (3rd of 20)

Sept. 21-22, 2001 Albuquerque, N.M.

The University of Arizona men's golf team posted the lowest team total in the final round to finish in third place at the William H. Tucker Intercollegiate.

The Wildcats, who opened the season ranked No. 2 in the nation, fired a final-round 285 (-3) to finish with a team total of 871 (+7), which was good enough for third place in the 20-team field. The Cats entered Saturday's final round in seventh place before making the charge to finish third.

Tournament-host New Mexico won the event with a total of 859 (-5), the only team in the field to finish under par. The Lobos finished 11 strokes ahead of runner-up Pepperdine (870). Brigham Young's Manuel Merizalde captured individual medalist honors with a three-round total of 209 (-7).

Leading the way for Arizona was freshman Kipp Riehle. Making his collegiate debut, Riehle shot a final-round 71 to finish in a tie for sixth place at 214 (-2). Included in the effort was a second-round 69. Two other UA golfers finished in the top 13 spots. Ricky Barnes, the *Golf World* magazine preseason Player of the Year, shot a 69 (-3) Saturday to finish in a three-way tie for 10th place at 217 (+1), while sophomore Chris Nallen finished tied for 13th place at 218 (+2).

The Preview by Ping & Golfweek (13th of 15)

The Wildcats' 16-over-par 300 in Sunday's final round gave the squad an 893 total (+41) to finish 13th in the field of 15. Clemson won the tournament by one stroke with a three-round total of 862 (+10). Wake Forest (863), Texas (864), Ohio State (867) and Virginia Tech (871) rounded out the top five places.

Sophomore Chris Nallen was the only Wildcat golfer to finish in the top 20, as the Blairstwon, N.J., native posted a three-round total of 219 (+6) to finish in a tie for 19th place. His two-over-par 73 on Sunday clinched his second top-20 finish of the season. Junior Ricky Barnes also carded a final-round 73, his low round of the tournament, to finish tied for 29th place at 221 (+8).

Other UA finishers included Reid Hatley, tied for 52nd place at 226 (+13); Kipp Riehle, tied for 55th place at 227 (+14) and Nathan Lashley, tied for 70th place at 232 (+19).

Taylor Made Red River Classic (11th of 15)

Even with its top three finishers at par or better, the Wildcats were unable to make a move in the final 18 holes and finished in 11th place with an 866 (+2) total. The total is the Cats best 54-hole score of the season, but placed the squad in the middle of the pack, as 10 of the 15 teams came in at par or better. Texas tallied an 834 total (-30) to win the event by 10 strokes over USC (844). TCU, Oklahoma State and Ohio State rounded out the top five finishers.

Chris Nallen earned his first top-10 finish of the year by placing sixth in the 84-man field. The sophomore carded a final-round 70 (-2) Tuesday to finish with a three-round total of 208 (-8). Teammate Reid Hatley also posted his best finish of the season by finishing tied for 19^{th} place at 213 (-3), while Ricky Barnes finished the tournament with two sub-par rounds to tie for 35^{th} place at 216 (E).

Other UA finishers included freshmen Kipp Riehle, who tied for 77th place at 230 (+14), and Nathan Lashley, who tied for 79th place at 232 (+16).

Jerry Pate National Intercollegiate (4th of 12)

After posting its best 36-hole total of the year, the Wildcats tallied a 12-over-par 296 to finish fourth in the event with an 862 (+10) total. Despite the fact that just one UA golfer was below par in Tuesday's final round, Arizona's 862 total was its lowest tournament score this season. Oklahoma State, which entered the final round tied for second place with the Wildcats, won the 12-team event with an 851 (-1) total.

Junior Reid Hatley was Arizona's top finisher in the event, tying for seventh place in the 60-man field. Hatley shot a one-under-par 70 in the final round to

finish the event with a 213 (E) total. It was Hatley's first top-10 finish this season and the fifth of his career. Clemson's D.J. Trahan and Oklahoma State's Hunter Mahan shared medalist honors at 205 (-8).

Chris Nallen continued his run of solid performances, as the sophomore finished tied for 13th place at 215 (+2). Nallen, who has finished in the top 20 in all four fall events, tallied a final-round 75. Senior Tim Weiss, playing with the UA varsity for the first time since the 1999 NCAA Championships, finished tied for 21st place with a 217 (+4) total. Weiss' 217 total equaled the third-lowest tournament total of his career.

Savane College All-America Golf Classic (individuals only)

Chris Nallen shot a final-round 70 to finish in a tie for eighth place at the Savane College All-America Golf Classic.

Nallen, a sophomore from Blairstown, N.J., carded a one-under 70 in the final round to finish with a three-round total of 213 (E). His eighth-place finish marks the second straight year in which a UA golfer has finished in the top-10 of this invitation-only event. Toledo's Brad Haven captured medalist honors with a 202 (-11) total in the field of 24.

UA teammate Ricky Barnes, who won this event last year with a tournament-record 196 (-17) total, finished 22^{nd} after a final-round 75 (+4). His three-round total of 218 (+5) was 16 shots off the pace set by Haven.

PING-Arizona Intercollegiate (T4th of 20)

Feb. 4-5, 2002 Tucson, Ariz.

Fresno State posted 10-under par totals over the last two rounds to win the 2002 PING-Arizona Intercollegiate at The Raven at Sabino Springs.

Fresno State, who posted the low round of the tournament with a 270 (-14) in the second round, shot a final-round 288 (+4) to win the 20-team event by one stroke over Oklahoma State (849).

Oklahoma State's Hunter Mahan captured individual medalist honors with a three-round total of 203 (-10). Mahan shot a final-round 68 (-3) to win the event by two strokes over Nick Watney of Fresno State.

On the strength of two top-five individual performances, tournament-host Arizona finished in a tie for fourth place with an 853 (+1) total. The tournament total was a season low for the Wildcats and was the squad's third top-five finish of the season. Arizona was two strokes out of the lead heading into Tuesday's final round, but a seven-over-par 291 ended the Cats chances of earning its first team title since last April's U.S. Intercollegiate.

Ricky Barnes, who was six-under par in the final two rounds, shot a final round 69 (-2) to finish in fourth place at 207 (-6). For Barnes, it was his low tournament of the season. Teammate Chris Nallen also finished tied for fifth place with a three-round total of 209 (-4). Nallen's second-round 66 (-5) was a season low.

Also competing for the Arizona varsity was freshman Nathan Lashley, who tied for 42nd place at 218 (+5), junior Reid Hatley, who tied for 49th place at 219 (+6) and sophomore Andy Connell, who finished 98th at 232 (+19).

The Arizona junior varsity finished tied for 13th place with a three-round total of 871 (+19). Brian Woolf and Kipp Riehle both tied for 13th place after final-round 68s (-31). Brandon Smith (224/T73rd), Steven Eshbach (225/T79th) and Tim Weiss (234/T99th) rounded out the junior varsity participants.

Nick Jusczak, who competed as an individual, tied for 36th place after his three-round total of 217 (+4).

John Burns Intercollegiate (T6th of 20)

After first-round struggles left the team in 14th place, the Wildcats moved up eight places in the tournament's final 36 holes. UA's final round 291 left the Cats with a three-round total of 878 (+12) and tied with California. San Diego State, who led the event wire to wire, won the tournament with a three-round total of 853 (-11).

Individually, Arizona was led by junior Reid Hatley. The Spokane, Wash., product carded a final-round 68 (-4) and finished tied for seventh place at 213 (-3). It was Hatley's second top-10 finish of the year, and his 68 was Arizona's low round of the tournament.

Also competing for the Wildcats was sophomore Chris Nallen, who finished tied for 22nd place at 218 (+2). It was the first time in seven events this season that Nallen has failed to finish in the top 20. Freshman Kipp

2002 Las Vegas Collegiate (8th of 16)

March 8-10, 2002 Las Vegas, Nev.

Arizona fired a final round of 3-over-par 291, its best team score of the 54-hole tournament, at the Las Vegas Collegiate to finish in eighth place.

Leading the final round charge for Arizona was junior Ricky Barnes, who posted a third-round of 2-under 70 to finish tied for 19th. Georgia Tech claimed the tournament title after shooting a final-round 281 to close the tournament at 20-under-par 844. Troy Matteson of Georgia Tech took the individual title after he carded his second consecutive round of 3-under 69. Matteson finished 54 holes tied with Camilo Villegas of Florida, but won the individual crown in a playoff.

Chris Nallen posted Arizona's best finish, taking a tie for 12th place at 1-over-par for the tournament. Nallen shot 1-over 73 Sunday. Junior Reid Hatley joined Barnes in an eight-golfer tie for 19th place. Hatley posted rounds 72, 73 and 73 to wrap up action at 218.

Also competing for the Widlcats was freshman Kipp Riehle, who tied for 45th place at 9-over-par. Riehle fired a final round of 4-over-par 76 Sunday. Senior Tim Weiss rounded out the Arizona lineup, taking 74th place after shooting 3-over 75 Sunday to finish the tournament at 18-over.

Oregon Duck Invitational (8th of 16)

The finish enabled Arizona to post its sixth top-10 finish in eight events this season. UA's final-round 289 enabled the squad to finish the three-round event with a 874 (+10) total in the 16-team event. Tournament-host Oregon won the invitational with an 849 (-15) total, one stroke ahead of runner-up Washington State.

Individually, Arizona was led by sophomore Chris Nallen, who finished in a tie for fifth place with a 211 (-5) total. Bolstered by back-to-back rounds in the 60s, Nallen collected his fourth top-five finish of the year. He has been Arizona's top finisher four times in 2001-02. Washington State's Jon Reehoorn earned individual medalist honors with a three-round total of 206 (-10).

UA junior Reid Haltey also posted a top-20 finish, as the native of Spokane, Wash., carded an even-par 216 for the tournament to finish in a tie for 16th place. It was his fifth top-20 finish of the year. Teammate Nathan Lashley, competing as an individual, posted his collegiate-low total in relation to par to tie for 25th place at 219 (+3).

Also competing for the Wildcats was Ricky Barnes, who tied for 37^{th} place at 221 (+5), Kipp Riehle, who tied for 62^{nd} place at 228 (+12), and Andy Connell, who tied for 73^{rd} place at 230 (+14).

PING-U.S. Collegiate Championships (2nd of 10)

Texas held a nine-stroke lead heading into the final round and, once again, Arizona made it close by carding its second straight sub-par team total. The Wildcats' 284 (-4) total shaved seven strokes off the Longhorn lead, but it was UT's depth that made the difference. Three Texas individuals finished in the top-20 places to give the squad a three-round total of 859 (-5) and the two-stroke win over Arizona. No team, however, played the final 36 holes better than Arizona's cumulative five-under-par tally, while UA's 861 total was the team's second-lowest total of the year.

Leading the way for Arizona was sophomore Chris Nallen, whoposted a three-round 206 (-10) to finish in second place individually. It was a career-low tournament for Nallen, and his total tied for the 10th best score in UA history in both aggregate total and in relation to par. The native of Blairstown, N.J., shot a final-round 68 (-4) to break 70 for the fourth time in his last six rounds played. Oklahoma State's Hunter Mahan carded a three-under 69 Sunday to claim individual medalist honors at 204 (-12).

UA junior Ricky Barnes finished in a tie for 20th place with a three-round 221 (+5). For Barnes, who was two-over on Sunday, it was his fourth top-20 finish of the season. Junior Reid Hatley and freshman Kipp Riehle tied for

 24^{th} at 222 (+6), while sophomore Andy Connell finished tied for 34^{th} place at 224 (+8). Connell, who shot a one-under 71 on Sunday, was a collective four-under par over the last 36 holes.

ASU Thunderbird/Savane Invitational (T5th of 16)

April 12-13, 2002 Tempe, Ariz.

The Cats posted its lowest tournament total of the season to tie for fifth placeat the ASU Thunderbird/Savane Invitational.

Arizona's 845 (-19) total was its lowest of the season by eight strokes and placed the team in a tie for fifth with TCU in the 16-team field. Arizona, who notched three sub-par rounds in a tournament for the first time this season, posted the eighth-lowest team total in the ASU Thunderbird/Savane Invitational since 1988. Texas won its second straight tournament in the state in the last six days with an 832 (-32) total.

Individually, Arizona was ledby junior Ricky Barnes, who finished tied for 10th place with a seven-under 209 total. Barnes' final-round 70 gave him his lowest tournament total of the season. All told, Arizona collected 11 rounds at par or better from its five-man lineup in the two-day event.

Also competing for the Wildcats was sophomore Chris Nallen, who tied for 19th place at 211 (-5), freshman Kipp Riehle, who tied for 38th place at 215 (-1), sophomore Andy Connell, who tied for 47th place at 217 (+1) and junior Reid Hatley, who tied for 63th at 220 (+4). Two UA freshman also competed as individuals. Nick Juszczak and Nathan Lashley both tied for 72th place at 223 (+7).
