**Ify on Fire:** Senior forward Ify Ibekwe came alive for the Wildcats in their road win at Ole Miss. She grabbed four rebounds in the first five minutes and locked up a double-double, her first of the season, in the first half (14 points and 10 rebounds). She ended the game with 24 points and 17 rebounds. She also pitched in with three assists, three blocks and four steals. In three games played, she's averaging a double-double with 11.3 PPG and 11.3 RPG.

**In Reserve:** Arizona's main contributors off the bench are coming from their two youngest players. Freshman Candice Warthen is averaging 7.7 PPG and 6.3 RPG in 20.3 minutes per game. Freshman Erica Barnes is averaging 7.7 PPG and 7.3 RPG in 16.3 minutes per game.

**Keeping It Balanced:** A balance offensive attack is always a goal for head coach Niya Butts and she got what she asked for against Ole Miss. Of the eight players who logged minutes, six scored points and three in double digits: Ify Ibekwe (24), Soana Lucet (17) and Davellyn Whyte (17).

**Dishing it Out:** Junior guard Shanita Arnold is making the most of her Wildcat outings. Averaging team-leading 35.0 minutes per game, she's also averaging Pac-10 leading 8.3 APG with 25 total in three contests.

**Starting Strong:** Arizona's starting five (Shanita Arnold, Ify Ibekwe, Brooke Jackson, Soana Lucet and Davellyn Whyte) are averaging at least 7.0 PPG and 2.3 RPG, including 5-5 guard Arnold.

**Keeping Up With Candice:** Freshman Candice Warthen had a stellar outing in the 71-49 win over Northern Arizona. Listed at just 5-3, she grabbed 13 boards and also scored 12 points for her first collegiate double-double.

**All in the Family:** Of the 10 Wildcats that played in the 71-49 win over Northern Arizona, all had at least two rebounds and all scored at least two points. Statistical leaders with Soana Lucet for points (15), Candice Warthen for rebounds (13), Shanita Arnold for assists (nine) and Davellyn Whyte for steals (three).

**Mirror Image:** Arizona's overtime road win at Wichita State, 81-72, was nearly identical in stature to the start of the 2009-10 season. Arizona picked up a victory in the 2009-10 season opener at Iona College, 77-70, also in overtime.

**Butts' First:** In each of her seasons at the helm of the Arizona program, third-year head coach Niya Butts' first win of each season has come in overtime: at Wichita State, 81-72, 11/12/10; at Iona, 77-70, 11/14/09; vs. Loyola Marymount, 93-88, 11/15/08.

**Double Digit Debut:** In her collegiate debut, freshman Erica Barnes stepped up big for the Wildcats in the season opener at Wichita State. The Sacramento native bolstered the Arizona stats with her first collegiate double-double, scoring 16 points and grabbing 14 boards, including 10 defensively.

**Definitely Depth:** In the season opener, Arizona posted a balance offensive attack with four of the nine players logging minutes scoring in double digit figures. Junior Shanita Arnold, freshman Erica Barnes and sophomore Davellyn Whyte led the Arizona scorers with 16 points each. Junior Brooke Jackson also chipped in with 15 points and senior Soana Lucet with nine.

**Brooke, Brooke, Brooke, Brooke Jackson:** The junior sharp shooter from Mesa, Ariz., Brooke Jackson had a stellar outing in the Cats' OT win at Wichita State. Not only did she record 15 points but she also grabbed five rebounds and two steals during Arizona's come-from-behind win. Her two takeaways came at a key point near the end of the second half and she also picked up four points from her forced turnovers.

**Last Time Out:** For the first time since the 2001-02 season, the Wildcat women's basketball team is 3-0 to start the season after a 72-70 at Ole Miss. Senior forward Ify Ibekwe was a dominant force against Ole Miss. She grabbed four rebounds in the first five minutes and locked up a double-double, her first of the season, in the first half (14 points and 10 rebounds). She ended the game with 24 points and 17 rebounds. She also pitched in with three assists, three blocks and four steals.

In the season opener vs Wichita State, she was one of four players to score in double digits (16) ... Also tallied seven assists and four steals in the Wildcats' 81-72 win at Wichita ... Picked up nine assists, four rebounds and a steal in the 71-49 win over Northern Arizona ... Matched her season best with nine assists in UA's road win at Ole Miss, 72-70 ... Also grabbed three steals and scored five points ...

*Freshman Erica Barnes*

Recorded her first collegiate double-double in the OT win at Wichita State ... Tallied 16 points and 14 rebounds, including 10 on defense ... Also dished out two assists and grabbed one steal ... **A Look Ahead:** Arizona will return to the McKale Center to host Arkansas-Pine Bluff on Mon., Nov. 22. The Wildcats will spend the Thanksgiving holiday at the Cancun Thanksgiving Classic, facing Texas A&M and Bradley.

**Preseason Picks:** Arizona was picked to finish seventh in the Pac-10 Preseason Poll. Ten-time defending champion Stanford was picked to add another crown to its mantle.

In a vote by the league media, the Wildcats were picked to finish sixth in the Pac-10 Conference this season, it was announced in the preseason poll. Additionally, senior forward Ify Ibekwe was named preseason All-Pac-10 by the league's media members.

**Welcome Back:** Arizona Wildcat women's basketball returns four starters and three additional letterwinners for the 2010-11 season. A strong senior class includes All-Pac-10 honoree Ify Ibekwe, Soana Lucet and Amanda Pierson. Now a sophomore, Davellyn Whyte returns as the defending Pac-10 Freshman of the Year. Sharp-shooter junior Brooke Jackson, who started 20 games in 2009-10, is also back to bolster the Wildcat offense.

**Fresh Faces:** Third-year head coach Niya Butts welcomes four new players to the court for the 2010-11 season. Junior transfer Taylor Dalrymple and freshmen Erica Barnes and Candice Warthen are new to the squad while junior Shanita Arnold will take to the court after sitting out 2009-10 because of NCAA transfer rules.

**Setting the Schedule:** Arizona Wildcat women's basketball faces a slate of 29 regular season games in 2010-11. Non-conference opponents include Wichita State, Ole Miss and a trip to the Cancun Thanksgiving Classic to face Texas A&M and Bradley.

The Pac-10 portion of the schedule will start with a home contest against Oregon on Dec. 31 at the McKale Center.

**Signed, Sealed, Delivered:** Head coach Niya Butts has added four National Letter of Intent student-athletes to the squad for the 2011-12 season: Erin Butler, 5-10, G, Mission Viejo, Calif. (Mission Viejo High School); Kama Griffitts, 6-0, G/F, Coeur d'Alene, Idaho (Coeur d'Alene High School/North Idaho College); Aley Rohde, 6-5, C, Cave Creek, Ariz. (Pinnacle High School); Layana White, 5-8, G, Lancaster, Calif. (Bellermine Jefferson High School). and during the 2009-10 season, she average 12.6 and 4.2 steals per game. She was named second-team All-CIF for her performance during the 2009-10 season.

## Head Coach Niya Butts

Entering her third season at the helm of the Wildcat program, women's basketball head coach Niya Butts is more energized and driven than ever to continue to build on the strong tradition of Arizona women's basketball and to take the program to new heights. With a talented class of younger players and an experienced and motivated group of veterans, the 2010-11 season is poised to be a successful stop on the road to greatness.

One of the most sought after young coaches in the country, Arizona named Butts its new women's basketball head coach on April 3, 2008, ushering in a new era of Wildcat women's basketball. She is the eighth head coach in the program's history and is the first African American female head coach at the University of Arizona.

In just two seasons, Butts has achieved a number of milestones early on in her head coaching career. During the 2009-10 campaign, the Wildcats posted their highest win total in five seasons while also achieving the most Pac-10 wins for the program in that same span. In their historic win over Oregon on Jan. 16, Arizona scored a school-record 119 points while then-freshman guard Davellyn Whyte scored a single-game record 39 points. The Cats won the Iona College Tip-Off Tournament to start the season and wrapped up by advancing to the Pac-10 Tournament Quarterfinals for the second-straight season.

Whyte and then-junior forward Ify Ibekwe were named first-team All-Pac-10 while Whyte was chosen as the Pac-10 Freshman of the Year and Ibekwe was named to the all-defensive team. Whyte was the top vote-getter on the five-player Pac-10 All-Freshman Team. Ibekwe repeated both her All-Pac-10 and All-Defensive Team awards after earning the same honors during her sophomore season.

In 2008-09, Butts led the Wildcats to a Bank of Hawaii Classic Tournament championship in the first weekend of her career, including wins over Hawai'i and Loyola Marymount, and then mentored the Wildcats to the second round of the Pac-10 Tournament, propelled by a win over Washington State. The conference portion of the slate included wins over Oregon and USC and a sweep of Washington.

Then a sophomore, Ibekwe was named to the Associated Press All-America honorable mention team. Ibekwe, a first-team All-Pac-10 selection and first-team All-Pac-10 Defensive Team honoree, led Arizona in scoring, rebounding, steals, blocked shots, free throws, field goals and double-doubles during the 2008-09 slate. She finished the season with 336 rebounds, coming up three shy of the program's single-season record set in the 2003-04 season. Her 16 double-doubles were also second all-time for a single-season behind the 21 posted in the 2002-03 campaign.

Ibekwe led the Pac-10 and finished sixth in the NCAA in rebounds per game at 11.6. She was also third in the Pac-10 in scoring at 15.7 points per game while also ending up second in blocked shots (1.8) and 4th in steals (2.1).

Butts came to Tucson from the University of Kentucky where she spent five seasons as an assistant coach. In her final season in Lexington, she served as Kentucky's associate head coach, and was the program's recruiting coordinator for three seasons. While at UK, Butts secured two top-10 recruiting classes, solidifying her status as one of the best young coaching talents in the nation.

Butts is no stranger to rebuilding programs. During her tenure at Kentucky, Butts helped coach the Wildcats to an 88-72 record (.550) over five seasons, with a trip to the NCAA Tournament in 2005-06 and three WNIT appearances. In her final season, Butts helped lead Kentucky to a 17-16 overall record, an 8-6 mark in the SEC for a fourth-place finish, and a WNIT quarterfinal appearance.

Before her stint at Kentucky, Butts spent the 2002-03 season as an assistant coach at Michigan State. Butts helped coach MSU to a 17-12 overall record that season and an appearance in the NCAA Tournament, the Spartans' first since 1997. Prior to Michigan State, Butts spent two seasons as an assistant coach at Tennessee Tech in Cookeville, Tenn., leading the Golden Eaglettes to two Ohio Valley Conference regular-season championships in both 2001 and 2002.

Butts played collegiately at the University of Tennessee for Pat Summitt, where she was a four-year letter winner and a member of two NCAA Championship teams (1997, 1998).
