THIS YEAR IN PAC-12 WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

The regular-season was capped by a fifth-straight NCAA Women's Final Four appearance by STANFORD, the Pac-12 regular-season and tournament champion ... In all, seven teams advanced to the postseason with CALIFORNIA joining the Cardinal in the "Big Dance." Five other Pac-12 teams participated in the WNIT, with COLORADO and WASHINGTON advancing the furthest before falling in the quarterfinals. The Pac-12 posted a 14-7 postseason mark, 12-4 in games vs. non-conference opponents ... SR F Nnemkadi Ogwumike earned a number of prestigious postseason honors, including All-America nods from the Associated Press, USBWA and WBCA. She was also selected the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award winner. Younger sister SO F Chiney Ogwumike was also named to the WNCA All-America team. ARIZONA JR G Davelyn Whyte and SO F Michelle Plouffe were Honorable Mention AP All-Americans ... Nine league teams appear in the top 25 of at least one statistical category of the NCAA final statistical rankings ... ASU broke the Pac-12 record for scoring defense, having limited its opponents to 53.2 points per game this year ... Ending the season ranked No. 2 in the AP poll and No. 3 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll, Stanford won the Pac-12 Tournament for the sixth-straight year, defeating Cal in the championship game ... Nnemkadi Ogwumike was named the Pac-12 Player of the Year by the coaches for the second time in three years. Younger sister and sophomore Chiney Ogwumike was tabbed the Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year, while Cardinal head coach Tara VanDerveer was selected the John R. Wooden Award Coach of the Year. WASHINGTON's Jazmine Davis was the Freshman of the Year, the first Husky in 24 years to win the honor ... OREGON's Amanda Johnson was selected the Toyo Tires Women's Basketball Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

2012 PAC-12 HONORS

PAC-12 PLAYER OF THE YEAR - NNEMKADI OGWUMIKE, SR., F, STANFORD

Senior forward Nnemkadi Ogwumike becomes the sixth Cardinal to earn Conference player of the year honors multiple times, following in the footsteps of Candice Wiggins (2005, 06, 08), Nicole Powell (2002, 04), Kate Starbird (1996, 97), Val Whiting (1992, 93) and Jennifer Azzi (1989, 90). She was the league's player of the year in 2010. A three-time all-conference selection and a two-time All-American, Ogwumike goes into this week's Pacific Life Pac-12 Basketball Tournament after having led Stanford to its third-straight undefeated Conference season. She leads the Pac-12 and is ranked 12th in the NCAA in scoring (21.6 ppg), is second in the league and 14th in the country in rebounding (10.5 rpg) and 16th in the nation in field goal percentage (53.9 percent). She has recorded five 30-point games and also leads the Pac-12 with 15 double-doubles. Ogwumike ranks fourth all-time in scoring in the Pac-12 record books, amassing 2,286 career points, only the seventh Cardinal to score over 2,000 points. She is also sixth all-time in the league in career rebounding, collecting 1,152 boards in 137 career games. Ogwumike was selected then Bank of the West Pac-12 Player of the Week three times this season.

PAC-12 FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR - JAZMINE DAVIS, G, WASHINGTON

Freshman guard Jazmine Davis becomes the first Husky in 24 years to be named the Conference's Freshman of the Year. Former Husky Karen Deden was named top freshman in 1988. The Pac-12's highest-scoring freshman, she averages 16.2 ppg, just 0.1 points per game from being the team's scoring leader. She is also the fourth-highest scoring freshman in the country. Davis has helped UW to 16 wins on the season, the most for the team since winning 18 in 2006-07. The Huskies' eight league victories are the most since the 2006-07 campaign. Davis has also been successful from the charity stripe, boasting a 77.3 percent shooting percentage from the free throw line, good for sixth in the league. Fifth in the Pac-12 in three-point makes, knocking down 1.86 threes per game, she is 11th in the league with a 34 percent shooting percentage from long range. Davis has recorded eight 20-point games, tying for the fourth-most in the Pac-12. Davis is the only freshman on this year's All-Pac-12 team becoming only the 14th rookie in the league's history to be voted all-conference.

PAC-12 DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR - CHINEY OGWUMIKE, SO., F, STANFORD

Sophomore forward Chiney Ogwumike becomes the second Cardinal in three years to be named Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year after former Cardinal Rosalyn Gold-Onwude was a co-recipient in 2010. Ogwumike ranks third in the Pac-12 in rebounding, hauling down 10.1 rebounds per game. Her 1.21 blocks per game is the ninth-best blocking average in the Conference. A two-time All-Pac-12 honoree after being selected last year, Ogwumike has helped the Cardinal defense limit opponents to just 54.8 points per game, good for second in the league. Stanford also boasts the best defensive field goal shooting percentage, limiting opponents to just 34 percent shooting, also the 10th-best in the NCAA. Ogwumike was named to the all-defensive squad for the second-straight year. This season, she was named Bank of the West Pac-12 Player of the Week for three-consecutive weeks from Jan. 16-30. Ogwumike was also the Conference's Freshman of the Year in 2011.

JOHN R. WOODEN PAC-12 COACH OF THE YEAR - TARA VANDERVEER, STANFORD

Leading the Cardinal to a third-straight undefeated Pac-12 season, Tara VanDerveer was voted John R. Wooden Coach of the Year for the 12th time in her 26 years at the Stanford helm. She has guided Stanford to a 12th-consecutive Conference regular-season title and 21st overall. Inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame last summer, she has mentored nine different Stanford players who have won 16 Pac-12 Player of the Year honors, including this year's winner, Nnemkadi Ogwumike. Her players have also claimed Conference Freshman of the Year award eight times and Defensive Player of the Year nods twice in the five-year history of the award. The second-ranked team in the nation according to the Associated Press and ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll, the team ranks in the top 25 in the nation in 12 different statistical categories, including 11 categories in which the Cardinal appear in the top 10. Among those categories, Stanford is third in the nation in three-point defensive field goal percentage (.235) and assist-to-turnover ration (+1.34), fourth in scoring margin (+23.0) and fifth in scoring offensive (77.8 ppg).

PAC-12 WOMEN'S TOURNAMENT MOVES TO SEATTLE

With its new partnership with Force 10 Sports Marketing, LLC, the Seattle Sports Commission and Seattle Center, the Pac-12 Conference will bring the Pac-12 Women's Basketball Tournament to KeyArena in Seattle in 2013, and will deliver unprecedented national television exposure to its women's basketball teams and student-athletes, it was announced today.

The new agreement, which runs through 2015, moves the tournament to the first full week in March to strengthen television windows and maximize national exposure. ESPN2 will televise the championship game, while all other games will be carried nationally on the Pac-12 Networks. The 2013 tournament will be played March 7-10.

"We are extremely proud of the rich heritage the Pac-12 has in women's basketball and we feel strongly that this new partnership will enhance the tournament experience for our student-athletes and fans," Pac-12 Commissioner Larry Scott said. "Seattle is a beautiful city that has proven to be a prolific women's basketball market. Force 10 Sports Marketing shares our commitment and passion for women's sports and we look forward to growing the tournament together."

The popularity of women's basketball in the Seattle market, the 12th largest in the nation, can be seen with the ground-breaking success of the WNBA's Seattle Storm. The team is consistently among the leaders in attendance in the WNBA, averaging 8,658 fans in 17 regular-season home games in 2011. They have increased attendance 10 percent the last two years.

"This is a fantastic opportunity for Seattle and the Pac-12 Conference," CEO of Force 10 Sports Marketing, LLC Karen Bryant said. "We are tremendously excited about working together to deliver a first class event for the participants, fans and the community. This region is passionate about basketball and an ideal destination for this championship tournament."

KeyArena, home to the two-time WNBA Champion Storm, has entertained more than 10 million guests as Seattle's premier venue for sports, concerts and family entertainment. Its unique design provides sports and concert fans an intimate entertainment experience with spectacular sightlines and acoustics. A commuter-friendly city, fans have a convenient link between downtown Seattle and Seattle Center with the Seattle Center Monorail.

"We are very excited to host the Pac-12 Conference and their Women's Basketball Tournament at KeyArena," Executive Director of the Seattle Sports Commission Ralph Morton said. "It is a great opportunity for us to show off our community to one of the premier conferences in the country and the thousands of fans that follow their member institutions. Seattle is an ideal destination for hosting major events and this tournament will be a great addition to the sports calendar for our region."

The Pac-12 Women's Basketball Tournament, the Conference's premier women's sporting event, enters its 12th season in 2013. The tournament made its debut in 2002 and was held at the University of Oregon's campus in Eugene, Ore. The four-day event spent the last four years in Los Angeles.

"The WNBA Seattle Storm brings such tremendous spirit and community support to KeyArena at Seattle Center; and now this premier sports and entertainment venue will host the Pac-12 women's basketball tournament," Director of Seattle Center Robert Nellams said. "We look forward to welcoming these amazing young women and bringing the community back to the Key for more outstanding women's basketball."

STANFORD CLAIMS FIRST-EVER PAC-12 CROWN

LOS ANGELES -- From beginning to end, it was all about No. 1-seed Stanford as it defeated No. 2-seed California and claimed its ninth conference tournament title with a 77-62 win.

"I thought our team worked hard defensively," said Stanford coach Tara VanDerveer. "We got out and got some transition. For us, I think the big difference, we got great games from Nnemkadi and Chiney Ogwumike, but the big difference for us is how Amber Orrange played. I thought she really stepped up big on the big stage, knocked down her free throws, took the ball to the basket, ran our team and worked hard defensively."

Stanford jumped out in front quickly in the first half by building up a 12-point lead in the first seven minutes of the game. California chipped away at this lead and even cut the deficit down to four with a 10-2 run over four minutes. However, with Stanford outscoring California 16-10 in the paint and 12-6 off of turnovers, Stanford held onto the lead and went into halftime with a 37-31 advantage.

"I think any time you put yourself in a hole, it's hard to dig yourself out," said California's Layshia Clarendon. "Even if you play even, you've already put yourself down. So that was a tough start."

The second half was all Stanford, as well. Cal could not get stops on defense and with Stanford finding an outside game to compliment its inside presence, the hole kept getting deeper for the Bears. Stanford led by as many as 21.

"We just didn't get any stops," said California head coach Lindsay Gottlieb. "I felt like today we really wanted to focus on that, because we thought if we could grind it out on the defensive end, we could play the way we wanted and to play on the offensive end."

Stanford shot 45.3 percent for the game and was led by double-double performances from Nnemkadi (29 points and 12 rebounds) and Chiney (17 points and 12 rebounds). Included in Nnemkadi's total were three three-pointers, which were her first shots from the three-point line made all year. Rounding out Stanford's leading scorers was Orrange with 13 points. Stanford was nearly perfect from the free throw line by going 14-for-16.

California struggled on offense, shooting 31.8 percent from the field. The Bears were led by Clarendon's 20 points and Brittany Boyd's 13. Reshanda Gray was held to just nine points.

ARIZONA

The Wildcats shot 37.7 percent from the field and were a perfect 13-of-13 from the free throw line in the win over UCLA to open the Pac-12 Tournament. JR G **Davellyn Whyte**, SO G **Candice Warthen** and SR G **Shanita Arnold** all scored in double figures ... In the loss to Arizona State, Whyte posted 17 points ... Whyte was named Honorable Mention All-American by the AP ... UA opened the campaign with an 11-1 mark, its best start to the season since the 1999-2000 ... The Wildcats rank 20th in the NCAA in 3-point field goal percentage.

ARIZONA STATE

Arizona State ended the season with a first-round WNIT loss at Pacific, 77-62. SR G **Alex Earl** and JR G **Deja Mann** led the team with 14 points each. SR F **Kimberly Brandon** closed out her career with her ninth-career double-double ... The Sun Devils advanced to the semifinals of the Pac-12 Tournament, losing to eventual champion Stanford. ASU held the Cardinal to a season-low 29 percent shooting ... ASU leads the Pac-12 and ranks 16th nationally in scoring defense (53.2). The Sun Devils also rank 11th in the NCAA in defensive field goal percentage (33.9) and in blocks per game (5.8) ... ASU broke the Conference's scoring defense mark set by Stanford in 2009.

CALIFORNIA

The Golden Bears fell at No. 1-seed Notre Dame, 73-62, in the second round of the NCAA Tournament, after winning their first-round game over Iowa, 84-74 ... It was the fifth-straight year the Bears have advanced at least one round in postseason play ... Cal finished second in the Conference for the third time in the last five years, reaching the league's championship game, where it fell to second-ranked Stanford ... Its 20-win campaign is the team's fifth in six years ... The Bears rank third nationally with a +12.6 rpg rebounding margin.

COLORADO

Colorado's season ended at Oklahoma State in the quarterfinal round of the WNIT ... The Buffaloes drained 15 three-pointers and JR G **Chucky Jeffery** recorded her second-career triple-double and the Pac-12's second this year, but could not overtake Oklahoma State. Jeffery finished with 12 points, 12 rebounds and 10 assists. It was the second triple-double in the Pac-12 and 13th in the nation this season ... CU's 21 wins are the most since the 2003-04 team finished 22-8. Its 12-0 start to the season was the best since 1992-93.

OREGON

The Ducks fell to Washington in the first round. SR G/F **Jasmin Holliday** led Oregon with 17 points while fellow senior F **Amanda Johnson** added 10 points, eight rebounds and three steals ... Johnson is the only player in Oregon history to rank in the top five for points (5th), rebounds (4th), steals (5th) and three-pointers (5th). She has 1,505 career points ... UO ranks eighth in the country in 3-pt field goals made per game (7.7).

OREGON STATE

OSU advanced to the third round of the WNIT, where its run ended against Washington, 55-49 ... The Beavers had a major turnaround this season, winning 11 more games than all of last year and posting its first 20-win season since 2008-09 ... OSU's nine league wins are also the most since that year ... JR F/C **Patricia Bright** ranks sixth in the NCAA with 3.48 blocks per game and broke the school record for blocks in a season. As a team, the Beavers average 5.5 blocks to rank 14th in the country ... In his second season at the helm, **Scott Rueck** was named the media's Pac-12 Coach of the Year.

STANFORD

Stanford advanced to its fifth-straight NCAA Final Four, falling to eventual national champion Baylor ... Stanford won its sixth-straight and ninth overall tournament title, appearing in all 11 Pac-12 Tournament title games ... SR F **Nnemkadi Ogwumike**, a three-time Most Outstanding Player, tied the league tournament record with 71 points while setting the record with 27 field goals made. She is averaging 22.5 ppg to rank eighth nationally ... Nnemkadi has been named to several All-America teams and her sister, SO F **Chiney**, joined her on the AP All-America squad. The duo became the first sisters to ever be named AP All-Americans in the same year ... Nnemkadi was named the Most Outstanding Player of the NCAA Fresno Regional, and Chiney was all-tournament. Nnemkadi was also named to the All-NCAA Final Four team ... Nnemkadi was also the winner of the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award.

UCLA

JR G/F **Markel Walker** led the Bruins with 22 points and 11 rebounds in the loss to Arizona. SR G **Rebekah Gardner** added 21 points ... Earlier this season, Walker posted the Conference's first triple-double since 2004. She is the Pac-12's leading rebounder (11.0) and ranks ninth in the NCAA ... Walker became the 26th member of the program's 1,000-point club against ASU. She finishes with 1,101 points.

USC

The Trojans had their six game win streak snapped by Washington State. SR G **Briana Gilbreath** led USC with 17 points and 10 rebounds, while JR F **Christina Marinacci** delivered 13 points and SO F **Cassie Harberts** hauled in 12 rebounds ... SR G **Ashley Corral** moved to third all-time with 466 assists ... USC has won at least 10 Conference games the last three years in a row ... The Trojans played the 11th-toughest schedule in the country this season.

UTAH

The Utes defeated in-state foe Utah State, 69-58, in the first round of the WNIT, using a second-half comeback that saw Utah overcome a deficit that grew to 14 points. The team's season was ended, however, with a road loss to Conference foe Washington, 52-39 ... The Utes have had a couple of sophomore forwards lead the team all year, with **Michelle Plouffe** and **Taryn Wicijowski** averaging team highs of 14.1 and 13.2 ppg, respectively. Wicijowski is the team's rebounding leader at 8.7, while Plouffe has averaged 8.2 rpg ... Plouffe was named Honorable Mention AP All-American.

WASHINGTON

The Huskies ended their season in the WNIT quarterfinals, falling to San Diego. SR C **Regina Rogers** scored 20 points to go with 13 rebounds in her final collegiate game. ... Washington advanced to the second round of the Pac-12 Tournament, their first Conference tournament win since 2009 ... G **Jazmine Davis** was named the Pac-12 Freshman of the Year, the first Huskie to win the award since 1988 ... UW's 20 victories are the most since 2002-03 ... Rogers ranks third in the NCAA in field goal percentage (59.4).

WASHINGTON STATE

The Cougars won their first-ever Conference tournament games, upsetting Oregon State and USC before falling to Cal in the semifinals. With the 11th seed, WSU was the lowest seed to make the tournament semifinals ... The Cougars hit 10 three-pointers against USC and shot 44.6 percent overall in the game ... WSU's 13 wins are the most since the 1995-96 team won 17 ... Earlier this season, SR G **Jazmine Perkins** became the first player, men's or women's, in WSU history to record 1,000 points, 700 rebounds and 250 steals.







2012 NCAA Division I Women's BASKETBALL CHAMPIONSHIP
