The Game: The Arizona Wildcats and the Georgia Southern Eagles will officially open the 2011-12 slate with a contest at Hanner Fieldhouse, in Statesboro, Ga., on Fri., Nov. 11. Tip-off is set for 5 p.m. ET.

The Coverage: Arizona women's basketball games can be heard live on KTUC AM 1400. All broadcasts will start 15 minutes prior to tip-off for the pregame show. Derrick Palmer (play-by-play) and Molly O'Mara (color) will call the action this season. Visit ArizonaWildcats.com for all of your live stats and video needs.

Scouting the Wildcats: Under fourth-year head coach Niya Butts, Arizona returns five letterwinners and welcomes six newcomers, including three true freshmen, for the 2011-12 season. Junior guard Davellyn Whyte, a two-time All-Pac-12 honoree, leads the Cats with her returning 15.8 points and 4.6 rebounds per game from a year ago. Senior guard Shanita Arnold led UA in assists in 2010-11 with her 4.9 per game.

Scouting the Eagles: The Georgia Southern Eagles were picked seventh in a pre-season poll of the Southern Conference's 11 head coaches. Junior Meredyth Frye was also named to the league's Preseason All-Conference team. The Eagles open the 2011-12 season on Nov. 11 against Arizona.

Georgia Southern finished last season with a 12-18 record and a 9-11 mark in the Southern Conference. Frye led the team with 11.6 points per game last season and was second on the team with 5.2 rebounds per contest.

Last Time Out: With five players scoring in double figures, including two off the bench, the Wildcats routed Grand Canyon University, 81-54, in exhibition play at McKale Center. Sophomore guard Candice Warthen led all scorers with 15 points. She also grabbed

three rebounds and handed out seven assists. Along with Warthen's 15, freshman guard Erin Butler had 14, junior guard Davellyn Whyte had 13, junior guard Lindsey Fearing had 12 and sophomore forward Erica Barnes scored 10. Junior forward Cheshi Poston led Arizona at the glass with 10 boards while scoring nine points. Whyte also had eight steals.

Georgia On My Mind: This weekend's games will mark a homecoming for a few members of the Arizona women's basketball family. Head coach Niya Butts hails from Americus, sophomore guard Candice Warthen and video coordinator Jaamal Rhodes are from Warrenton, athletic trainer Bryce Sorrier is a native of Statesboro and assistant coach Brandy Manning attended Clark Atlanta University.

Exhibition Play: In Arizona's two exhibition games, sophomore guard Candice Warthen averaged 16.5 ppg while dishing out 4.0 apg. Four players averaged in double figures as junior forward Cheshi Poston and sophomore forward Erica Barnes led at the glass with 7.5 rpg.

Historic Season: The 2010-11 season marked the highest finish in the Pac-10 for Arizona - fourth - since tying for the Pac-10 regular-season crown in 2004. The Wildcats' 10-8 conference record last season is their best since the 2004-05 campaign and their 21 wins overall is the most since the 2003-04 season.

Overall, Arizona improved from 12 wins in 2008-09, to 14 wins in 2009-10, to 21 wins in 2010-11. In Pac-10 play, Arizona improved from four wins in 2008-09, to six wins in 2009-10, to 10 wins in 2010-11.

Home Cooking: Arizona was an efficient 11-3 at home in McKale Center during the 2010-11 season, an improvement from the 8-6 mark from the 2009-10 slate. More than half of last season's victories came on Olson Court.

Welcome Back: Arizona returns two starters and three additional letterwinners for the 2011-12 season. Senior guards Shanita Arnold and Reiko Thomas will lead the Wildcats with help from two-time All-Pac-10 honoree junior Davellyn Whyte and sophomores Erica Barnes (honorable mention All-Pac-10 Freshman Team) and Candice Warthen.

Fresh Faces: Fourth-year head coach Niya Butts welcomes six new players to the court for the 2011-12 season. Erin Butler, Aley Rohde and Layana White are true freshmen while Lindsey Fearing, Cheylene Harper and Cheshi Poston are junior transfers.

Preseason Picks: Arizona was picked to finish ninth in the 2011-12 Pac-12 Preseason Poll that was released in late October. For the 11th season in a row, defending champion Stanford was picked to add another crown to its mantle.

Setting the Schedule: Arizona faces a slate of 30 regular season games in 2011-12. The Wildcats will face 10 teams that advanced to the NCAA or WNIT Tournaments last season. Arizona will prep for the Pac-12 teams with a schedule of two exhibition and 12 non-conference games. The Wildcats will travel to play at Georgia Southern, at Georgia State, at New Mexico State and at Arkansas-Pine Bluff. In the friendly confines of McKale Center, UA will host Wichita State, North Texas, Long Beach State, New Mexico and UNLV.

At the Hukilau Invitational, hosted by BYU-Hawai'i, Arizona will face BYU on Dec. 1, Syracuse on Dec. 2 and BYU-Hawai'i on Dec. 3. The tournament will take place in Laie, Hawai'i, on the island of Oahu.

The Pac-12 portion will start with a game at Arizona State on December 31. The Wildcats will make trips to conference foes Oregon (1/12), Oregon State (1/15), Washington (1/26), Washington State (1/28), Colorado (2/9), Utah (2/11), USC (2/23) and UCLA (2/25). Arizona will host UCLA (1/5), USC (1/7), Utah (1/19), Colorado (1/21), California (2/2), Stanford (2/4), Washington State (2/16), Washington (2/18) and Arizona State (3/3).

Solid Opponents: In the non-conference match-ups, Wichita State to the first round, BYU to the third round and Syracuse to the fourth round all advanced to the WNIT last season. In conference action, Arizona State, UCLA, Utah and Stanford advanced to the NCAA Tournament last season. The Cardinal was an NCAA Final Four squad. USC, Colorado and California played in the WNIT and the Women of Troy advanced to the WNIT Championship game.

Something New: The 2011-12 season will mark the first time Arizona has faced BYU-Hawai'i, Georgia State and Georgia Southern. Additionally, the Wildcats will face seven teams with new head coaches for the 2011-12 slate: New Mexico State, North Texas, New Mexico, UCLA, Utah, Washington and California.

Head Coach Niya Butts

Entering her fourth season at the helm of the Wildcat program, women's basketball head coach Niya Butts is more energized and driven than ever to continue to build on the strong tradition of Arizona women's basketball and to take the program to new heights. With a talented class of younger players and an experienced and motivated group of veterans, the 2011-12 season is poised to be a successful stop on the road to greatness.

One of the most sought after young coaches in the country, Arizona named Butts its new women's basketball head coach on April 3, 2008, ushering in a new era of Wildcat women's basketball. She is the eighth head coach in the program's history and is the first African American female head coach at the University of Arizona.

In just three seasons, Butts has achieved a number of milestones early on in her head coaching career. The 2010-11 slate was the best year yet. The Wildcats made their first postseason appearance since the 2004-05 season and their first appearance in the Women's NIT since the 2000-01 season. Arizona won eight of its last 11 contests. Also in 2010-11, the Wildcats got a win against the Arizona State Sun Devils for the first time since Jan. 26, 2005.

The Wildcats' 10-8 conference record in 2010-11 is their best since the 2004-05 campaign and their 21 wins overall is the most since the 2003-04 season. The 2010-11 season marks the highest finish in the Pac-10 for Arizona (fourth), since tying for the Pac-10 regular-season crown in 2004.

Senior forward Ify Ibekwe and sophomore guard Davellyn Whyte both earned 2011 All-Pac-10 accolades. Ibekwe was named the 2011 Pac-10 Defensive Player of the Year and earned a spot on the Pac-10 All-Defensive Team. Freshman forward Erica Barnes was named honorable mention All-Pac-10 Freshman Team. In the awards given out by the Pac-10 media, Ibekwe was named All-Pac-10 and a member of the All-Pac-10 Defensive Team. Senior forward Soana Lucet was also named to the 2011 Pac-10 All-Tournament Team by members of the media. Ibekwe capped the season off with her honorable mention Associated Press All-America honor.

Overall, the Wildcats improved from 12 wins in 2008-09, to 14 wins in 2009-10, to 21 wins in 2010-11. In Pac-10 play, Arizona improved from four wins in 2008-09, to six wins in 2009-10, to 10 wins in 2010-11.

During the 2009-10 campaign, the Wildcats posted their highest win total in five seasons while also achieving the most Pac-10 wins for the program in that same span. In their historic win over Oregon on Jan. 16, Arizona scored a school-record 119 points while then-freshman Whyte scored a single-game record 39 points. The Cats won the Iona College Tip-Off Tournament to start the season and wrapped up by advancing to the Pac-10 Tournament Quarterfinals for the second-straight season.

Whyte and then-junior Ibekwe were named first-team All-Pac-10 while Whyte was chosen as the Pac-10 Freshman of the Year and Ibekwe was named to the all-defensive team. Whyte was the top vote-getter on the five-player Pac-10 All-Freshman Team. Ibekwe repeated both her All-Pac-10 and All-Defensive Team awards after earning the same honors during her sophomore season.

In 2008-09, Butts led the Wildcats to a Bank of Hawaii Classic Tournament championship in the first weekend of her career, including wins over Hawai'i and Loyola Marymount, and then mentored the Wildcats to the second round of the Pac-10 Tournament, propelled by a win over Washington State. The conference portion of the slate included wins over Oregon and USC and a sweep of Washington.

Butts came to Tucson from the University of Kentucky where she spent five seasons as an assistant coach. In her final season in Lexington, she served as Kentucky's associate head coach, and was the program's recruiting coordinator for three seasons. While at UK, Butts secured two top-10 recruiting classes, solidifying her status as one of the best young coaching talents in the nation.

Before her stint at Kentucky, Butts spent the 2002-03 season as an assistant coach at Michigan State. Butts helped coach MSU to a 17-12 overall record that season and an appearance in the NCAA Tournament, the Spartans' first since 1997. Prior to Michigan State, Butts spent two seasons as an assistant coach at Tennessee Tech in Cookeville, Tenn., leading the Golden Eagles to two Ohio Valley Conference regular-season championships in both 2001 and 2002.

Butts played collegiately at the University of Tennessee for Pat Summitt, where she was a four-year letter winner and a member of two NCAA Championship teams (1997, 1998). The Lady Vols won three SEC titles (1998, 1999, 2000) during her tenure, and she was voted the SEC's Defensive Player of the Year in 1997. She also won the Lady Vols' Unsung Hero Award that season.

Butts was a three-time Academic All-SEC selection (1998, 1999, 2000) and earned Tennessee's Academic Achiever of the Week four times. She played in 111 career games at UT and graduated in 2000 with a bachelor's degree in social work and a minor in psychology. She received a master's degree in education from Tennessee Tech in 2002.

Butts, 33, is a native of Americus, Ga.
