Media Policies



MEDIA INFORMATION

The Arizona Athletic Media Relations Office will assist media throughout the season in its coverage of Arizona women's basketball including issuing a weekly news release, daily news items, home game statistical packages, administering news conferences, practice and press row operations, credentialing and road-game access, among other services. Questions about media policies should be directed to assistant media relations director Susie Epp at sepp@arizona.edu or (520) 668-5104 or (520) 626-9395.

FACILITIES ACCESS FOR MEDIA

The team locker room, sports medicine center and strength and conditioning center are off limits to media unless special arrangements have been made through the Athletic Media Relations office.

WEEKLY MEDIA OPPORTUNITIES

Head coach Niya Butts and select players will be available 1-2 days before each contest to preview the upcoming game. These media opportunities will take place in McKale 109C and will also include access to practice. Each media opportunity will be scheduled on an individual basis and the media will be notified with ample time to plan.

PRACTICES

All local and visiting media are welcome to watch Arizona women's basketball practices and must make prior arrangements through the Athletic Media Relations office in order to attend. TV crews and photographers are welcome to shoot footage of practices, provided they stay outside the boundaries of the court. Please contact Susie Epp about covering practices.

PLAYER INTERVIEWS

All player interviews and photo requests must be arranged through Susie Epp. Interviews and photos can be conducted before or after practice or around class schedules, depending on the availability of the requested player. Player home or cell phone numbers will not be shared.

Players are not available on game days until after contests.

COACHING STAFF INTERVIEWS

All coach interviews and photo requests must be arranged through Susie Epp. Coach home or cell phone numbers will not be given out.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

All postgame press conferences and interviews will be conducted in the media room, 109C, inside the Athletic Media Relations office. Arizona players and coaches will be available in the media room following a brief cooling-off period. Visiting players and coaches will then be brought in as requested. Requests for specific players from either team need to be addressed to Susie Epp.

MEDIA CREDENTIALS

Requests for press, radio, television and photographer credentials should be emailed at least 48 hours in advance to Susie Epp in the Athletic Media Relations Office at momara@arizona.edu. Passes are available for working media only and are required for all contests. Credentials may be picked up in the Athletic Media Relations Office on the day of the game or at the McKale Center Ticket Office beginning 90 minutes prior to tip-off. Media credentials for away games will be administered through the home SID.

MEDIA PARKING

Media parking on campus from 8 a.m.-5 p.m. Monday-Friday is handled through the UA Office of News Services, Room 413, University Services Building, North Euclid Avenue at University Boulevard. All media needing parking at these times must obtain a permit from that office. All parking tickets are the responsibility of the perpetrator, not the Media Relations Office.

Parking access around the McKale Center on game day is on a first-come, first-served basis. There are no parking passes available for home games. Media parking for road games will be administered through the home SID.

PROFESSIONAL SCOUTS

Any professional scouts wishing entry to an Arizona women's basketball game must contact Susie Epp to obtain credentials. Requests should be made at least 24 hours in advance and can be emailed to sepp@arizona.edu. No parking passes are available. Scouts will have seating in the stands.

VISITING RADIO

Visiting radio stations wishing to broadcast any contests need to contact Brian Jeffries at (520) 626-7660 to make arrangements for telephone lines. You must specify the number of lines needed, as well as whether ISDN or regular phone lines are required.

GAME DAY MEDIA SERVICES

Game notes and rosters will be available in the media room (McKale Center Room 109C). Halftime and final statistics will be distributed along press row and in the media room. Full statistics, play-by-play, postgame notes and quotes will be distributed in the media room and via email.

DIRECTIONS TO MCKALE CENTER

From Tucson International Airport: Follow Tucson Boulevard out of Tucson International Airport to Kino Parkway (three miles). Turn right on Kino Parkway and head north (Kino Parkway eventually becomes Campbell Avenue) for four miles. After crossing Sixth Street, take the first left and McKale center will be on your immediate right.

From Phoenix: Take I-10 south (approximately 100 miles). When arriving in Tucson, take the Speedway Boulevard exit. Turn left onto Speedway and go two and a half miles to Campbell Avenue. Turn right onto Campbell and go approximately one-third of a mile. Entry to McKale Center will be the first right after the light at Third Street.

Entering her fifth season at the helm of the Wildcat program, women's basketball head coach Niya Butts is more energized and driven than ever to continue to build on the strong tradition of Arizona women's basketball and to take the program to new heights. With a talented class of younger players and an experienced and motivated group of veterans, the 2012-13 season is poised to be a successful stop on the road to greatness.

"Niya Butts is hard-working, energetic and dedicated," Arizona Athletics Director Greg Byrne said. "She is one of the rising stars in the coaching ranks and we are

thrilled to have her here at the University of Arizona. Her commitment to excellence, on and off the court, is unmatched and she continues to build on the tradition of Arizona women's basketball. She and her staff are great at bringing in and developing young talent. The future is bright for Coach Butts and her squad."

One of the most sought after young coaches in the country, Arizona named Butts its new women's basketball head coach on April 3, 2008, ushering in a new era of Wildcat women's basketball. She is the eighth head coach in the program's history and is the first African American female head coach at the University of Arizona.

"Exciting things are happening in women's basketball here at the University of Arizona," Butts said. "It's an honor and a privilege to coach this team and be part of this team. My staff and I are excited about the direction this team is moving and we will continue to bring in student-athletes that will contribute to our team goals, on and off the court."

In just three seasons, Butts has achieved a number of milestones early on in her head coaching career. The 2010-11 slate was the best year yet. The Wildcats made their first postseason appearance since the 2004-05 season and their first appearance in the Women's NIT since the 2000-01 season. Arizona won eight of its last 11 contests. Also in 2010-11, the Wildcats got a win against the Arizona State Sun Devils for the first time since Jan. 26, 2005.

The Wildcats' 10-8 conference record in 2010-11 is their best since the 2004-05 campaign and their 21 wins overall is the most since the 2003-04 season. The 2010-11 season marks the highest finish in the Pac-10 for Arizona - fourth - since tying for the Pac-10 regular-season crown in 2004.

Senior forward Ify Ibekwe and sophomore guard Davellyn Whyte both earned 2011 All-Pac-10 accolades. Ibekwe was named the 2011 Pac-10 Defensive Player of the Year and earned a spot on the Pac-10 All-Defensive Team. Freshman forward Erica Barnes was named honorable mention All-Pac-10 Freshman Team. In the awards given out by the Pac-10 media, Ibekwe was named All-Pac-10 and a member of the All-Pac-10 Defensive Team. Senior forward Soana Lucet was also named to the 2011 Pac-10 All-Tournament Team by members of the media. Ibekwe capped the season off with her honorable mention Associated Press All-America honor.

Overall, the Wildcats improved from 12 wins in 2008-09, to 14 wins in 2009-10, to 21 wins in 2010-11. In Pac-10 play, Arizona improved from four wins in 2008-09, to six wins in 2009-10, to 10 wins in 2010-11.

During the 2009-10 campaign, the Wildcats posted their highest win total in five seasons while also achieving the most Pac-10 wins for the program in that same span. In their historic win over Oregon on Jan. 16, Arizona scored a school-record 119 points while then-freshman Whyte scored a single-game record 39 points. The Cats won the Iona College Tip-Off Tournament to start the season and wrapped up by advancing to the Pac-10 Tournament Quarterfinals for the second-straight season.

Whyte and then-junior Ibekwe were named first-team All-Pac-10 while Whyte was chosen as the Pac-10 Freshman of the Year and Ibekwe was named to the all-defensive team. Whyte was the top vote-getter on the five-player Pac-10 All-Freshman Team. Ibekwe repeated both her All-Pac-10

and All-Defensive Team awards after earning the same honors during her sophomore season.

In 2008-09, Butts led the Wildcats to a Bank of Hawaii Classic Tournament championship in the first weekend of her career, including wins over Hawai'i and Loyola Marymount, and then mentored the Wildcats to the second round of the Pac-10 Tournament, propelled by a win over Washington State. The conference portion of the slate included wins over Oregon and USC and a sweep of Washington.

Then a sophomore, Ibekwe was named to the Associated Press All-America honorable mention team. Ibekwe, a first-team All-Pac-10 selection and first-team All-Pac-10 Defensive Team honoree, led Arizona in scoring, rebounding, steals, blocked shots, free throws, field goals and double-doubles during the 2008-09 slate. She finished the season with 336 rebounds, coming up three shy of the program's single-season record set in the 2003-04 season. Her 16 double-doubles were also second all-time for a single-season behind the 21 posted in the 2002-03 campaign.

Ibekwe led the Pac-10 and finished sixth in the NCAA in rebounds per game at 11.6. She was also third in the Pac-10 in scoring at 15.7 points per game while also ending up second in blocked shots (1.8) and 4th in steals (2.1).

Butts came to Tucson from the University of Kentucky where she spent five seasons as an assistant coach. In her final season in Lexington, she served as Kentucky's associate head coach, and was the program's recruiting coordinator for three seasons. While at UK, Butts secured two top-10 recruiting classes, solidifying her status as one of the best young coaching talents in the nation.

Butts is no stranger to rebuilding programs. During her tenure at Kentucky, Butts helped coach the Wildcats to an 88-72 record (.550) over five seasons, with a trip to the NCAA Tournament in 2005-06 and three WNIT appearances. In her final season, Butts helped lead Kentucky to a 17-16 overall record, an 8-6 mark in the SEC for a fourth-place finish, and a WNIT quarterfinal appearance.

Before her stint at Kentucky, Butts spent the 2002-03 season as an assistant coach at Michigan State. Butts helped coach MSU to a 17-12 overall record that season and an appearance in the NCAA Tournament, the Spartans' first since 1997. Prior to Michigan State, Butts spent two seasons as an assistant coach at Tennessee Tech in Cookeville, Tenn., leading the Golden Eaglettes to two Ohio Valley Conference regular-season championships in both 2001 and 2002.

Butts played collegiately at the University of Tennessee for Pat Summitt, where she was a four-year letter winner and a member of two NCAA Championship teams (1997, 1998). The Lady Vols won three SEC titles (1998, 1999, 2000) during her tenure, and she was voted the SEC's Defensive Player of the Year in 1997. She also won the Lady Vols' Unsung Hero Award that season.

Butts was a three-time Academic All-SEC selection (1998, 1999, 2000) and earned Tennessee's Academic Achiever of the Week four times. She played in 111 career games at UT and graduated in 2000 with a bachelor's degree in social work and a minor in psychology. She received a master's degree in education from Tennessee Tech in 2002.

Butts, 34, is a native of Americus, Ga. She is a proud member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated.

Brandy Manning begins his first season as an associate head coach after serving as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator for four years for Arizona women's basketball. He also works with Arizona's defense, post players, opponent scouting and player development.

Widely considered as one of the top up and coming assistant coaches in the nation, Manning joined the Arizona coaching staff prior to the 2008-09 season after spending one season as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at the University of Central Florida.

"Brandy Manning is one of the most driven and dedicated coaches and people I know," head coach Niya Butts said. "His commitment is second to none and I appreciate his recruiting efforts. He does things most coaches don't think to do or make the time to do. I know the University of Arizona will also appreciate his efforts in the coming years because of the job he does recruiting and the players he's able to bring in. He's also outstanding at player development and working with our post players. He's an absolute pleasure to work with."

In four seasons with UA, Manning has been part of a coaching staff to lead Arizona to its first postseason appearance since the 2004-05 season. During the 2011-12 season, Arizona's 11-1 start was the best in program history since the 1999-2000 season. The Cats beat UCLA twice, the first a 74-66 victory at McKale Center on Jan. 5 and the second a Pac-12 Tournament 61-57 win on March 7. The January win marked UA's first over the Bruins since 2006-07 and the first in Tucson since 2004-05.

Overall, the Wildcats improved from 12 wins in 2008-09, to 14 wins in 2009-10, to 21 wins in 2010-11. In Pac-10 play, Arizona improved from four wins in 2008-09, to six wins in 2009-10, to 10 wins in 2010-11.

The Wildcats' 10-8 conference record for the 2010-11 season is their best since the 2004-05 campaign and their 21 wins overall is the most since the 2003-04 season. The 2010-11 season marked the highest finish in the Pac-10 for Arizona (fourth), since tying for the Pac-10 regular-season crown in 2004.

With a solid recruiting reputation already intact, Manning defended his status by securing a deep and talented crop of players for head coach Niya Butts and the Wildcats. Adding the services of Davellyn Whyte, the 2010 Pac-10 Freshman of the Year, after being chosen the 2009 Arizona Gatorade Player of the Year, Manning has spearheaded the efforts to sign every player on the 2012-13 roster.

Manning was responsible for an impressive recruiting feat at UCF in his first season. With less than two months to assemble a recruiting class, he recruited eight players who were widely responsible for leading the Knights to the 2009 and 2011 Conference USA Championship and UCF's first NCAA Tournament appearance in 10 years.

Manning joined UCF from Murray State (Ky.), where he helped the Racers to a 21-10 record and a bid in the 2007 Women's National Invitation Tournament, marking just the second-ever

postseason appearance for the program.

Manning spent two years as a graduate assistant coach at the University of Louisville from 2003-05. During that time, the Cardinals posted a record of 42-19 and advanced to the 2005 Conference USA Championship game. Louisville earned a berth to the NCAA Tournament in 2005 after participating in the WNIT the season prior.

Manning, a native of Stockton, Calif., graduated from Clark Atlanta in 2002 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in psychology. He also holds a master's degree in education from Louisville. He and his wife, Nakaya, have sons Brandyn and Quintyn.



E.C. Hill is in her second season as an assistant coach with the University of Arizona Wildcat women's basketball staff. She comes to Arizona after spending the previous six seasons as an assistant coach at Northern Illinois.

"We're very excited for E.C. to join our staff," Butts said. "She's a tremendous asset and she has tons of experience as a player. She's played

at the level that our players are aspiring to be at. She has lots of energy and that's a must when you are rebuilding a program. We're excited for E.C. to join our Wildcat family."

With the Wildcats, Hill will work on the development of perimeter players, scouting opponents, game preparation and recruiting. She will also handle scheduling games.

"This is a great opportunity to work for Niya Butts," Hill said. "She's one of the greats in the coaching profession and I know I can learn a lot from her. I'm excited to join the staff with Niya, Sue Darling and Brandy Manning. Arizona is coming off a great season and I'm excited to be part of the future of Wildcat women's basketball."

In Hill's first campaign with UA in 2011-12, Arizona's 11-1 start was the best in program history since the 1999-2000 season. The Cats beat UCLA twice, the first a 74-66 victory at McKale Center on Jan. 5 and the second a Pac-12 Tournament 61-57 win on March 7. The January win marked UA's first over the Bruins since 2006-07 and the first in Tucson since 2004-05.

During her six seasons at NIU, her alma mater, Hill was instrumental in the development of perimeter players, scouting opponents, game preparation and recruiting.

Hill is an NIU Athletics and Illinois Basketball Coaches' Association Hall of Famer and her name can be found throughout the Northern Illinois women's basketball record book. As a player, she helped lead the Huskies to three-straight NCAA Tournament berths under NIU Hall of Fame coach Jane Albright.

She was named a first-team U.S. Basketball Writers' Association All-American, a Kodak District Four All-American, a preseason Street and Smith's and Basketball Times All-American, Mid-Continent Conference Player of the Year, first-team All-Mid-Con and All-Mid-Con Tournament on a 25-6 NCAA Tourney squad that won the 1993-94 Mid-Con regular-season title with an 18-0 record.

Assistant Coaches and Staff



Hill led the league and ranked 16th nationally in scoring (22.0 ppg.). A two-time Northern Illinois MVP (1992-93, 1993-94), Hill was named the North Star Conference Newcomer of the Year with a 14.2 points per game average in 1991-92.

Hill played professional basketball for the New England Blizzard (1996-99) and Chicago Condors (1998-99) in the American Basketball League, with the Charlotte Sting (2000), Phoenix Mercury (2001), Los Angeles Sparks (2001) and Orlando Miracle (2002) in the WNBA and in many cities in Europe.

Hill's first coaching opportunity came at Robert Morris College in Chicago. She served as head coach during the 2004-05 season before returning to NIU for the 2005-06 campaign.

She graduated from Northern Illinois in 1995 with a degree in communications. Hill has a daughter, Asia Janay Murray. She is a proud member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated.



Calamity McEntire is in her first year as an assistant coach with the University of Arizona Wildcat women's basketball staff. She comes to Arizona from Boise State, where she served as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator for four years, specifically handling scouting, assisting with team workouts and coaching the guards.

"We are really excited about adding Coach McEntire to our staff," Butts said. "She is going to be a big asset to our recruiting and development. It's always exciting to get someone in who is a hard worker, grinds and gets out there. We are excited to add her to our family and staff and look forward to many years ahead."

As recruiting coordinator at Boise State, McEntire brought five players to campus that made conference all-freshmen teams. She coached two athletes who earned postseason all-conference honors, two league all-defensive team members, 11 who received a total of 22 Academic All-conference honors and two who garnered ESPN the Magazine/CoSIDA Academic All-District recognition.

"It is with great excitement that I join the Wildcat family at Arizona," McEntire said. "Coach Butts made an immediate and positive impression on me. Her driven vision for the Arizona Women's Basketball program quickly convinced me that I wanted to become a Wildcat. I cannot wait to begin working with her and her staff and am honored and privileged to be a part of such an incredible tradition at the University of Arizona."

Prior to Boise State, McEntire spent two years at UC Santa Barbara, where she served as Director of Women's Basketball Operations and served as an assistant coach at Fresno State from 2004 to 2006. In addition to on-floor coaching, she managed recruiting, monitored academic progress of student athletes and oversaw

the program's community outreach endeavors. During her time at Fresno State, she helped the Bulldogs advance to the WNIT.

In her eight years of coaching, McEntire has worked with four players who combined for five all-conference honors, three who earned all-defensive team recognition, five all-freshmen team honorees and two players who made conference all-tournament teams. In addition, 18 individuals earned a combined total of 34 academic all-conference honors.

McEntire, a native of Kiowa, Okla., graduated from the University of Tennessee in 2003 with a degree in education majoring in sports management. While at Tennessee, she worked as an equipment manager for the Lady Vols from May 2001 to July 2003. She also worked as the equipment manager/gym director for the Pat Summitt Summer Basketball Camp from 2001-03.



No stranger to Arizona Athletics, **Lisa Napoleon Salgado** returns to Tucson as the Director of Operations for the Wildcat women's basketball team. The 2012-13 season will mark her second in this position at UA.

"Having Lisa back working with our program is something we're really looking forward to," head coach Niya Butts said. "She is such an asset and a very hard worker. She knows the ins and outs of our program, as well as our athletic department, and that will be a great benefit to our team."

Salgado returns to the UA campus after spending the 2010-11 year as an Academic Program Specialist in the department of Student-Athlete Academic Services at Florida State. She worked primarily with the men's and women's basketball teams.

"I'm thrilled to be back here at the University of Arizona," Salgado said. "I have great respect for Niya Butts and her program. I'm looking forward to this new role and bringing everything I can to Arizona women's basketball."

In total, Salgado has spent seven years working with the Wildcats in various roles. Most recently, she served as the Assistant Director of Student Development at the University of Arizona. She oversaw the academic progress for student-athletes in men's basketball, women's basketball and baseball.

Salgado earned a Bachelor of Arts degree at Montclair State University in 1995. She went on to teach for four years in the New Jersey school system before leaving to receive her Masters of Education in Counseling and Guidance from the University of Arizona. She earned her Doctorate in Educational Psychology in 2011, also from the University of Arizona.

She is married to Andrew Salgado and they have a daughter, Noel.
