

UA Women's Basketball Tips Off Pac-10 Play Against Bay Area Schools

WHAT'S HAPPENING: The University of Arizona women's basketball team (4-4 overall, 0-0 Pac-10) kicks off Pac-10 play this week against the Bay Area schools. The Wildcats take on sixth-ranked Stanford on Wednesday, Dec. 19, then they face California on Friday, Dec. 21. Both contests begin at 7 p.m. in the McKale Center.

SCOUTING ARIZONA: After opening the season with three straight wins, the Wildcats have been on a tailspin, losing four of their last five games to slip to 4-4 overall. This is Arizona's worst start since the 1994-95 team began that season 4-4.

Senior forward Elizabeth Pickney leads Arizona in scoring, with 18.4 points per game, and is second in rebounding, at 7.3 per game. Junior wing Krista Warren is the Cats' top rebounder, averaging 8.0 per game after pulling down a career-high 18 boards at SFA last weekend. Freshman guard Dee-Dee Wheeler is the team's second-leading scorer, at 13.6 ppg, followed by senior center LaKeisha Taylor's 11.5 ppg. Taylor is also third in rebounding, at 5.8 per game.

Sophomore guard Aimee Grzyb is fourth in scoring, averaging 9.0 ppg, followed by fellow sophomore Candice Allen, who is currently sidelined because of a concussion suffered on Nov. 30, with 9.0 ppg.

As a team, Arizona is leading the Pac-10 in free throw percentage (.789) and steals (10.62 spg) and is second in scoring offense (75.5 ppg) and three-point percentage (.346). The Cats are third in field goal percentage (.425) and three-pointers made per game (5.75 pg).

Individually, Dee-Dee Wheeler leads the league in free throw percentage (.909) and is third in steals (2.50 spg). Elizabeth Pickney is second in blocks (1.88 bpg) and fourth in scoring average (18.4 ppg). Krista Warren is third in rebounding average (8.0 rpg).

INJURY REPORT: Junior guard Julie Brase suffered a lower back sprain against Pittsburgh on Dec. 2 and missed two weeks before returning to action on Dec. 16 at Stephen F. Austin.

Sophomore guard Candice Allen suffered a grade-three concussion against Holy Cross on Nov. 30 and will miss this week's games. She will be reevaluated after Christmas break to determine her status for the Arizona State game on Dec. 30.

Freshman guard Katrina Lindner tore her right ACL during the Cats' annual Red & Blue Game on Oct. 30, and sophomore guard Jenn Chesney also tore her right ACL during preseason workouts in September. Both players will be redshirting this year.

SCOUTING STANFORD: Ranked No. 6 in the nation this week, the Cardinal were handed their first loss of the season at home on Sunday, 68-62, by No. 2 Tennessee. Stanford is 8-1 overall.

Senior Lindsey Yamasaki leads Stanford in scoring, with 18.1 points per game, and is second in rebounding, at 5.4 rpg. Sophomore forward Nicole Powell

is second in scoring, averaging 16.7 ppg, and leads the Cardinal in rebounding with 9.4 per game. Freshman guard Kelley Suminski is third on the scoring chart, posting 9.1 ppg. The Cardinal have nine players averaging five points or more per game.

Head coach Tara VanDerveer (Indiana, 1975) holds a 372-103 record in 16 years at the helm of the Stanford program. She is 524-154 in 23 years as a head coach.

THE SERIES vs. STANFORD: The Cardinal hold a solid 31-10 lead in the series with Arizona. The teams have played evenly over the last four seasons, with each team taking four of eight meetings. The Wildcats won last year's first meeting (68-65) on Jan. 6 in Palo Alto, but Stanford returned the favor with its own 74-66 win on the Cats' home court in March.

LAST MEETING WITH STANFORD: Despite a career-high 30 points from Elizabeth Pickney, Arizona was handed a 74-66 loss by Stanford at home on Mar. 8, 2001.

Stanford opened the game with a 15-4 run and maintained a double-digit lead through most of the first half. The Cats did manage to cut it to eight points (28-20) with 4:13 remaining in the period, but the Cardinal ended the half on an 8-3 spurt to take a 36-23 lead into the break.

The Wildcats picked up the intensity in the second half, opening the period with a 23-14 run that cut the Cardinal lead to four (50-46) at 12:46. Stanford promptly answered with eight unanswered points.

That was the story for the remainder of the game. Arizona came to within four points twice in the waning minutes, but Stanford always answered with runs of its own.

In addition to her 30 points, Pickney grabbed four rebounds and had a pair of steals. Then-freshman Jenn Chesney had six points, three assists and two rebounds, while Aimee Grzyb added two points and two rebounds. LaKeisha Taylor contributed five rebounds and one point.

SCOUTING CALIFORNIA: After opening the season with a 4-0 start, the Golden Bears have lost three in a row to stand at 4-3 on the year. Cal comes in to play the Wildcats after having a 13-day break in action.

Senior forward Ami Forney leads Cal in both scoring (13.6 ppg) and rebounding (6.0 rpg). Freshman forward Leigh Gregory is the only other Bear averaging in double digits in scoring, with 10.9 ppg. Cal has really spread the scoring wealth around this season, with 12 players averaging at least one point per game.

Cal head coach Caren Horstmeyer (Santa Clara, 1984) has a 16-19 record in her second season with the Golden Bears. She holds a 237-143 record in 14 years as a head coach.

THE SERIES vs. CALIFORNIA: With a 21-13 advantage over the Bears, the California series is the only Pac-10 series in which Arizona holds the lead. The Wildcats have won 12 in a row over Cal and 15 of the last 16.

LAST MEETING WITH CALIFORNIA: Four Wildcats reached double digits in scoring as Arizona downed California, 75-62, at home on Mar. 10, 2001, to end regular season play. The win ended a four-game losing skid for the UA.

The Golden Bears opened the game with seven unanswered points before Arizona responded with a 15-3 run to take a five-point lead at 11:45. Cal responded with its own 14-3 spurt, gaining a six-point (24-18) advantage with just over eight minutes remaining in the half. The Wildcats finished the period by out-scoring Cal, 19-8, and took a 37-32 lead into the break.

California made an 8-3 run at the Cats to begin the second half, tying the contest at 40-all just four minutes into the period. The Bears hung in there until Arizona went on a 10-2 run to gain a 14-point (62-48) lead with 6:46 left in the game.

Cal crawled back to within seven (69-62) at 1:47. The Wildcats then connected on 4-of-4 free throw attempts, nailed a field goal and held Cal scoreless for the remainder of the game to take the victory.

Elizabeth Pickney shot 8-for-13 from the floor on her way to a team-high 20 points, five rebounds and four blocked shots. Aimee Grzyb came off the bench for 13 points, while Candice Allen had 10 points and seven rebounds. Jenn Chesney contributed five points, and LaKeisha Taylor had three points and a rebound.

ARIZONA'S LAST TIME OUT: An 11-point halftime deficit was too much to overcome as Arizona was edged by Stephen F. Austin, 68-66, in Nacogdoches last Sunday.

The first 12 minutes of the game saw five ties and four lead changes before SFA ended the first half on a 21-9 run, taking a 42-31 lead into the break. During that stretch, the Cats went ice-cold from the floor, making only four of 13 attempts, and committed seven turnovers.

The Wildcats roared back in the second half, opening the period with a 12-2 run that cut the Ladyjacks' lead to only one (44-43) just four minutes into play. The Cats stayed close, but couldn't seem to get a lead, and were down by seven (54-47) with 10 minutes

left in the game.

Then Arizona turned up the heat, scoring 17 unanswered points to gain a 10-point (64-54) advantage at 6:59. SFA responded with back-to-back three-pointers and a couple of layups to tie the game at 64-all with just under three minutes left. Arizona's LaKeisha Taylor connected on a layup at 2:09 to give the Cats their final lead of the game, 66-64. Two Wildcat fouls, a missed layup and a turnover gave SFA the chance to slip in four more points for the win.

LaKeisha Taylor went off for a career-high-tying 23 points to go with nine rebounds. Junior wing Krista Warren grabbed a career-high 18 rebounds, the highest rebound total for any Wildcat since 1995.

Freshman guard Dee-Dee Wheeler added 10 points and six rebounds as the Cats were handed their fourth loss in the last five games. With a 4-4 record, Arizona is off to its worst start since the 1994-95 team began that season at 4-4.

HEAD COACH JOAN BONVICINI: The winningest coach in Arizona women's basketball history, Joan Bonvicini has nurtured the Wildcat program into an upward-rising powerhouse. In 11 seasons at the helm of the Arizona program, Bonvicini has guided the Wildcats to six straight postseason appearances, including four NCAA tournament berths and two in the WNIT.

In her 11th season with the Wildcats, Bonvicini holds a 183-121 (.602) mark at Arizona and is 508-192 (.726) in 23 years as a head coach. She is 23-14 in NCAA tournament play and has never lost a first-round game in 13 appearances.

Prior to taking over at the UA, Bonvicini led Long Beach State to 10 consecutive NCAA appearances, including two trips to the Final Four. She registered a 325-71 mark in 12 seasons with the 49ers.

DID YOU KNOW: Since Joan Bonvicini took over the Arizona program in 1991, the Wildcats have gone 94-85 against Pac-10 teams, although they have a 60-29 league mark over the last five seasons combined.

THE REST OF THE STAFF: Awarded the title of associate head coach in 1998, Denise Dove Ianello (Northern Illinois, 1992) is in her 10th year at the UA, functioning as both the team's recruiting coordinator and a perimeter coach. Fourth-year assistant coach Karen Caires (Cal State Northridge, 1990) works with the perimeter players and assists with scouting and recruiting. In his third year at the UA, assistant coach Curtis Loyd (Southern Utah, 1994) is involved with scouting and with coaching the post players and is the director of the Joan Bonvicini Hoop Camp.

NEW WILDCAT ON THE WAY: Associate head coach Denise Dove Ianello and her husband Rob, who is the UA football recruiting coordinator and wide receivers coach, are expecting their first child in April 2002.

THE CATS AND PAC-10 OPENERS: Under Joan Bonvicini, Arizona has a 7-3 mark in Pac-10 openers and has won its first conference contest in seven of the last eight years.

HOME GAME TIME CHANGED: The game time for the Wildcats' home contest against Oregon on Saturday, Feb. 2, has been moved to 4 p.m. to accommodate television broadcast. The game, which had originally been slated for a 2 p.m. tip, will be aired live in Tucson on KWBA channel 58 at 4 p.m. MST.

CRASHING THE BOARDS: Junior wing Krista Warren pulled down a career-high 18 rebounds at Stephen F. Austin on Dec. 16. That's the highest individual rebound total for any Wildcat since Adia Barnes grabbed her career high of 18 against Arizona State on Jan. 7, 1995.

FREE THROWS AND TURNOVERS TELL THE TALE: The Cats have been getting to the free throw line often enough during this season's games, but it's only when they shoot well, really well, from the stripe that they win. Arizona has shot 85 percent (85-100) from the line in the season's four victories. In the Cats' four losses, they hit only 71.3 percent (57-80) from the stripe. Arizona is also averaging seven more free throws made per game in its wins.

Arizona needs to take care of the ball to win too. In their wins, the Cats have averaged only 18.3 turnovers per game, but in their losses, they committed 25.0 turnovers per game.

BOMBS AWAY: Arizona is averaging 5.8 three-pointers made per game so far this year, having nailed 46 treys over the first eight games of this season. They were 10 games into the 2001 season before they collected that many three-pointers made last year.

CLOSE BUT...: Four of Arizona's eight games this season have been decided by five points or less. The Wildcats' last two losses were by a combined three points.

Arizona begins the new year with a pair of games in Oregon. The Cats play at Oregon on Friday, Jan. 4, at 7 p.m. PST, then they take on Oregon State on Sunday, Jan. 6, in Corvallis at 2 p.m. PST.

MOVIN' ON UP: Senior forward Elizabeth Pickney just moved up into the No. 2 spot on Arizona's all-time scoring list, with 1316 career points. She surpassed Timi Brown (1987-91), who had 1315 career points. Pickney will likely finish her career as the second-leading scorer in Arizona history. It would be quite difficult for her to catch Arizona's all-time leading scorer, Adia Barnes (1995-98), who racked up 2237 career points.

STRONG SCHEDULE: Seven of the 18 opponents on the Cats' 2001-02 schedule were either ranked or receiving votes for ranking in the most recent polls.

In this week's Associated Press Poll, Stanford is the only opponent ranked, standing at No. 6. Arizona State, Notre Dame and New Mexico all received votes for ranking.

In the *USA Today*/ESPN Coaches Poll, Stanford is ranked at No. 6. Arizona State, Washington, Notre Dame, Oregon and Rice were all among the teams receiving votes for ranking.

CHECKING THE RECORD BOOK: Wildcat senior Elizabeth Pickney is among the Arizona career leaders in 15 different statistical categories. She recently became Arizona's career leader in blocked shots, now with 128. Pickney is second in career scoring (1316), second in free throws made (374), second in free throws attempted (497), fourth in career rebounding average (5.7 rpg), fourth in scoring average (13.0 ppg), fourth in field goals made (469), fourth in total rebounds (571) and fifth in games started (92).

Junior guard Julie Brase is fourth in career three-point percentage (.364), is tied for eighth in career three-pointers made (59) and is 10th in three-pointers attempted (162). Only a sophomore, guard Aimee Grzyb is already third in three-point percentage (.368), seventh in three-pointers made (63) and ninth in three-pointers attempted (171).

GOTTA REBOUND: Arizona has been out-rebounded in five of the season's eight games so far. They are being out-rebounded by an average of 3.3 boards per game for the season. The biggest rebounding disparity was 17 boards, which came on Nov. 27 when the Cats were out-rebounded by New Mexico, 52-35.

The Wildcats did out-rebound Stephen F. Austin by 16 (53-37) on Dec. 16 but still were unable to pull out the win.

THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME: The Wildcats have won 23 of their last 28 home games and are 45-10 on their home court over the last four seasons combined. During Joan Bonvicini's 11 seasons at Arizona, the Wildcats have posted a 110-45 mark in McKale Center. Arizona has a record of 176-153 on its home court since the 1976-77 season.

80 IS THE MAGIC NUMBER: It seems that the 80-point mark almost always means adding another to the "win" column for the Wildcats. In the 30-year history of UA women's basketball, the Cats have posted a 136-19 record when scoring 80 points or more in a game. Under Bonvicini, the Wildcats have gone 96-12 when topping that 80-point plateau.

BY THE NUMBERS: The Cats have hit four or more 3-pointers in six of this season's eight games... Arizona has had 15 or more assists in four games... The Cats have had 12 or more steals in four games... Arizona has forced its opponent into 20 or more turnovers in three contests... The UA has scored 80 points or better in two games.

KEYS TO THE WIN: This season, Arizona is... 3-0 when shooting 80% or better from the line... 3-0 when forcing more turnovers than it commits... 4-2 when scoring 70 points or more... 3-1 when shooting better than its opponent from the free throw line... 4-2 when holding its opponent to 77 points or less.

PICKNEY BECOMES UA CAREER BLOCKS LEADER: With a career-high-tying five blocks at New Mexico on Nov. 27, senior forward Elizabeth Pickney has taken over as Arizona's career blocked shots leader. She has 128 career blocks, placing her ahead of former career leader Marte Alexander (1995-98), who had 121.

CAT SCRATCHES: The Cats are 3-0 this season when Elizabeth Pickney scores 20 points or more... The Arizona women's basketball program has a 342-409 (.455) all-time record, however it is 146-73 (.667) from 1994 to present... Joan Bonvicini has a 184-98 career record against Pac-10 teams.

ON LOCATION: This year, Arizona is 3-2 at home, 1-2 on the road and 0-0 in neutral games. Last season, the Wildcats were 15-2 at home, 4-9 in road games and 1-1 in neutral contests.

JOAN BONVICINI COACHES HER 700th GAME: The Dec. 16 contest at Stephen F. Austin was the 700th game of Arizona head coach Joan Bonvicini's career.

WILDCAT PICKPOCKETS: The Wildcats racked up an astounding 19 steals in their 81-80 loss to Pittsburgh at home on Dec. 2. That's the highest single-game steals total since the team collected 22 steals in a losing effort at Oregon (68-66) on Jan. 24, 1998.

CHALLENGING START: Over these first 15 days of the 2002 season, the Wildcats played six games, including five opponents that saw postseason action in 2001. That slate included last year's WNIT champion Ohio State, the NCAA champion Notre Dame and the WNIT runner-up New Mexico.

PICKNEY NAMED PAC-10 PLAYER OF THE WEEK (Nov. 26): Senior forward Elizabeth Pickney was named the Pac-10 Women's Basketball Player of the Week for Nov. 18-25.

Pickney averaged 21.0 points, 7.0 rebounds and 1.3 blocks in leading Arizona to a 3-0 start, including an upset win of defending national champion and 15th-ranked Notre Dame. On the week, Pickney shot 95.8 percent (23-of-24) from the line and hit 57.1 percent (20-of-35) from the floor.

In an 81-77 season-opening win over Pepperdine on Nov. 18, Pickney notched 12 points and six rebounds. On Nov. 21, she shot a perfect 8-for-8 from the free throw line en route to a game-high 24 points and seven rebounds as Arizona downed defending WNIT champion Ohio State, 90-76. Pickney was 8-for-13 from the floor against the Buckeyes.

In the 72-70 win over the Fighting Irish on Nov. 24, she scored a game-high 27 points and posted a team-high eight rebounds. She shot 8-for-13 from the floor and was a perfect 11-for-11 from the line, contributing to the Cats' 20-for-20 school-record performance at the stripe. Pickney scored 21 of UA's 43 second-half points, nailing a lay-up at the buzzer to lift the Cats to a two-point win.

The Player of the Week honor was the fourth of Pickney's career and the 24th all-time selection for Arizona.

CATS INK THREE DURING FALL SIGNING PERIOD: The Wildcats signed three players during the fall signing period this year. Shawntinice Polk (Hanford, Calif./Hanford HS), Svyetlana Papcevic (Sarajevo, Bosnia/Pratt Kans. CC) and Natalie Jones (Anchorage, Alaska/East Anchorage HS) all signed National Letters of Intent.

Polk originally signed with Arizona last year, but her NLI was rendered void when she failed to meet academic requirements for this school year. She signed a new letter during the early signing period this fall.

GOOD BEGINNINGS: With Joan Bonvicini at the program's helm, the Wildcats have won seven straight season openers and nine in the 11 years she has been at the UA.

CLARK WITHDRAWS FROM SCHOOL: Guard Mandakova Clark, who would have sat out this year after transferring from Rutgers, withdrew from the University of Arizona at the end of October and will not be returning to the school.

INAUGURAL PAC-10 CONFERENCE TOURNAMENT: The first-ever Pac-10 Conference Women's Basketball Tournament will be held on Mar. 1-4, 2002, at McArthur Court in Eugene, Ore. The winner of the tournament will receive the conference's automatic bid to the NCAA tourney.

ITALY TOUR 2001: On May 18 through June 2, the Wildcats went to Italy for the program's third foreign tour. The tour began in Venice then advanced to Verona, Como, Milan, Lucca, Pisa, Florence and concluded in Rome. The Cats went 5-1 against club teams in many of these cities and visited a multitude of historical sites along the way.

Elizabeth Pickney was the team's second-leading scorer (21.7 ppg) and third-leading rebounder (6.2 rpg). LaKeisha Taylor was the second-leading rebounder (7.5 rpg), and Candice Allen finished the tour as the third-leading scorer, with 11.7 ppg.

Seeing her first action since March 2000, Julie Brase averaged 10.5 ppg and 5.5 apg. Aimee Grzyb posted 9.2 ppg and 4.0 apg, while Jenn Chesney averaged 4.7 ppg and 3.8 rpg. Krista Warren went with the team on the trip, but was unable to play because she was still rehabilitating from an ACL injury suffered last March.

2000-01 IN REVIEW: Arizona certainly saw its share of ups and downs during the 2000-01 season. The Cats started the year with a short squad of 12 players, only two of whom were starters at the end of the 2000 season. Through a variety of injuries, player departures and academic issues, the Wildcat roster was decimated, and the team was down to only eight active players by season's end.

Despite all the distractions and the prevailing inexperience of last year's squad, the Wildcats finished the year with a 20-12 overall record, their fifth 20-win season in the last six years. They were 9-9 in Pac-10 play and finished in fifth place, their lowest finish since 1995.

For the first time since 1996, Arizona failed to earn an NCAA tournament berth, but it did receive a Women's National Invitation Tournament slot. The Wildcats downed Pepperdine, 85-65, in the first round of the WNIT but fell, 75-62, at New Mexico in the second round to end their season. The WNIT berth gave the Wildcats their sixth straight postseason appearance, the third-longest active postseason streak in the Pac-10.

The team set or tied 39 school records last year, including most home victories (15), most points scored in a season (2,521) and highest single season scoring average (78.8 ppg).

Arizona finished the year as the Pac-10 leader in scoring offense (78.8 ppg), scoring margin (+9.1 ppg), field goal percentage (.470) and assists (16.59 apg). The Cats were second in both free throw percentage (.700) and rebounding (39.8 rpg) and were third in field goal percentage defense (.400) and assist-to-turnover ratio (0.86).

2000-01 ON THE INDIVIDUAL FRONT: Junior forward Elizabeth Pickney ended the season as the Cats' leading scorer, with 16.4 ppg, and second-leading rebounder (6.3 rpg). Senior guard Reshea Bristol was second in scoring, with 15.6 ppg, and ended the year as the Pac-10 leader in assists (7.56 apg).

Junior center LaKeisha Taylor (9.5 ppg) and sophomore wing Krista Warren (9.3 ppg) were fourth and fifth, respectively, in scoring. Warren was the team's third-leading rebounder, averaging 5.4 rpg.

In addition to leading the Pac-10 in assists, Bristol was second in steals (3.0 spg), fifth in scoring and fifth in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.34). Pickney was third in the league in scoring, fourth in blocked shots (1.47 bpg), sixth in field goal percentage (.505) and ninth in rebounding. Taylor was second in field goal percentage (.587).
