

UA Women's Basketball Looking for Wins Down the Stretch Wildcats play host to L.A. schools this week

WHAT'S HAPPENING: The University of Arizona women's basketball team (12-12 overall, 8-7 Pac-10) will be seeking to pull out of seventh place in the Pac-10 and improve its conference tournament seeding when it plays host to the Los Angeles schools this week. The Wildcats will face UCLA on Thursday, Feb. 14, at 7 p.m., then the Cats take on USC on Saturday, Feb. 16, at 2 p.m. in the McKale Center. Arizona will end regular-season play with three straight home games.

SCOUTING ARIZONA: The Wildcats should be back at 100% this week, with the return of post players Krista Warren and LaKeisha Taylor. Arizona split last weekend's games in the Pacific Northwest, losing a close one to Washington (77-73), then drilling Washington State (106-60). The Cats are now 12-12 overall and 8-7 in Pac-10 play.

Although the McKale Center has historically been kind to the Cats, they already have five losses at home this season, their most losses in McKale since the 1994-95 team dropped seven home games.

After putting up some big numbers last weekend, senior forward Elizabeth Pickney has lifted her team-best scoring average to 17.1 ppg. Freshman guard Dee-Dee Wheeler is second in scoring, with 12.4 ppg, followed by senior center LaKeisha Taylor (10.3 ppg) and sophomore guard Aimee Grzyb (10.2 ppg).

Pickney is also the team's top rebounder, averaging 8.2 boards per game. Krista Warren is second with an average of 8.1 rpg, while Taylor is third, grabbing 6.0 rpg.

As a team, Arizona leads the Pac-10 in free throw percentage (.755), is second in scoring (75.2 ppg), second in three-point field goal percentage (.363), third in three-pointers made per game (5.88 pg), third in overall field goal percentage (.433) and third in assists (15.25 apg).

Individually, Candice Allen is second in steals (2.35 spg), Krista Warren is fifth in rebounding (8.1 rpg), and LaKeisha Taylor is fifth in overall field goal percentage (.485). Elizabeth Pickney is third in blocked shots (1.29 bpg), fourth in rebounding (8.2 rpg) and fourth in free throw percentage (.847)

INJURY REPORT: Krista Warren missed the last four games with a severe ankle sprain suffered during practice on Jan. 29. She is slated to return to action this week.

LaKeisha Taylor missed the Washington State game with a minor ankle injury but is expected to play this week.

CATS HIRE NEW ASSISTANT COACH: New assistant coach Kellee Barney (Idaho, 1983) was added to the Wildcat staff on Monday, Feb. 11. She has 16 years of Division I coaching experience, including six years as head coach at Gonzaga. She will assist with recruiting, scouting and floor work with the players. Barney replaced former assistant Karen Caires, who resigned last December.

SCOUTING UCLA: With two wins in their last four games, the Bruins are 7-16 overall and 3-11 in conference action. Last week UCLA downed Long Beach State (77-73) in its final nonconference game on Feb. 5, then dropped a 71-58 decision at rival USC last Saturday.

Sophomore forward Whitney Jones is leading the Bruins in scoring, with 9.1 points per game, followed by senior center Shalada Allen (8.6 ppg) and junior guard Natalie Nakase (8.3 ppg). Nakase has the team's best average in Pac-10 play, however, with 10.0 ppg. Senior center Malika Leatham is the Bruins' top rebounder, at 6.0 per game, followed by Allen's 5.2 rpg.

In her ninth season at UCLA, head coach Kathy Olivier (UNLV, 1982) has a 128-134 record with the Bruins.

THE SERIES vs. UCLA: The Bruins have a solid 34-13 lead in the series with Arizona. The Wildcats have won two in a row over UCLA, after snapping a five-game losing streak to the Bruins last season. The Cats split with UCLA last year, and earlier this season, Arizona logged a 71-60 victory over the Bruins in Pauley on Jan. 19. Arizona has a 7-16 all-time mark when facing UCLA at home.

LAST MEETING WITH UCLA: With a career-high 19 points from sophomore guard Aimee Grzyb, Arizona topped UCLA, 71-60, in Pauley on Jan. 19, completing its first sweep in L.A. since 1998. That was also Arizona's first win in Pauley since '98.

The first half was a low-scoring one for both teams, with UCLA holding only a 13-9 lead eight minutes into the period. On fire from three-point range, Grzyb scored all of Arizona's first nine points in the game.

Then the Wildcats scored seven unanswered points to go ahead by three (16-13) at 11:16. The teams traded buckets for four more minutes until Arizona had another seven-point run that gave it a six-point (26-20) edge with 4:53 left in the period. UCLA got back to within one (26-25) three minutes later, but the Cats used an 8-2 spurt to gain a narrow five-point (33-28) lead at halftime.

The Cats pushed their lead to 11 (43-32) at 15:22 by opening the second half with a 10-4 run. The Bruins fought back to within six points three different times over the next six minutes and were down by only eight (55-47) with 5:49 left in the game. That's when the UA ripped off seven straight points to go up by 15 (62-47), its largest lead of the game, with four minutes remaining. UCLA never got closer than the final spread of 11 points after that.

Aimee Grzyb was 5-for-7 from three-point range on her way to a career- and game-high 19 points. Krista Warren was the only other Wildcat to reach double digits in scoring, racking up 15 points and a game-high 10 rebounds for her third double-double of the season.

SCOUTING USC: The Women of Troy have won three of their last four games to improve to 13-10 overall and 9-5 in Pac-10 action. USC downed UCLA, 71-58, at home last Saturday, after coming off a split with the Washington schools in L.A. The Women of Troy will play at Arizona State on Thursday before heading to Tucson for Saturday's game.

Sophomore guard Aisha Hollans sports a team-best 17.5 ppg scoring average and is second on the squad in rebounding, with 6.4 rpg. Sophomore forward Ebony Hoffman is the team's second-leading scorer, with 14.4 ppg, and tops USC in rebounding, at 9.0 rpg. Freshman forward Rachel Woodward (11.4 ppg) and senior guard Tiffany Elmore (10.9 ppg) follow on the scoring chart.

In her fifth year with the Women of Troy, head coach Chris Gobrecht (USC, 1977) holds a 61-74 record at her alma mater. She has a career record of 393-277 in 24 years as a head coach.

THE SERIES vs. USC: The Women of Troy have a 35-12 lead in the series with Arizona, although the Wildcats have won 10 of the last 13 meetings with USC. The Cats split with USC last season and slipped by the Women of Troy, 78-74, earlier this year on Jan. 17. Arizona has a 7-15 all-time record against USC in Tucson, and the Cats haven't lost to the Women of Troy at home since 1997.

LAST MEETING WITH USC: Senior center LaKeisha Taylor drained a pair of free throws with five seconds left in the game to assure Arizona of its first Pac-10 road victory in more than a year when the Wildcats beat USC, 78-74, in the L.A. Sports Arena on Jan. 17.

The Women of Troy, who were without three of their starters due to injuries and suspensions, opened up a 13-4 lead on the Cats in the first six minutes of the game. Arizona fought back with a 17-7 run to take its first lead in the game, 21-20, with 5:35 left in the first. The two teams traded buckets for a while until the Wildcats ended the half with seven unanswered points to take a 36-29 lead into halftime.

USC quickly cut the lead to one (36-35) by opening the second half with six straight points, which Arizona answered with an 8-0 spurt to regain a nine-point (44-35) advantage at 16:18. The next six minutes were back-and-forth, with USC slowly whittling away at the Cats' lead, cutting it to three (54-51) with 10:39 to play.

Arizona went on a 17-4 tear to blow the lead open to 16 points (71-55) with 6:12 left. Then, with 4:24 remaining, USC began a stretch of 11 unanswered points, slicing Arizona's lead to only one point (75-74) with just 40 seconds left in the game. During that stretch, the Wildcats

committed four turnovers and four fouls.

Aimee Grzyb missed a shot with 25 seconds left and was fouled. She made the front end of a one-and-one, but USC rebounded the miss on her second attempt.

The Trojans were unable to convert a layup at the other end, and LaKeisha Taylor was fouled on the rebound. She went to the line for the Cats, who were up by only two (76-74) and coolly converted both her free throws to give Arizona the four-point lead and the victory. A USC trey attempt at the buzzer didn't go, and the Cats came away with their first Pac-10 road win since Jan. 6, 2001.

Taylor finished the game in a tie with Aimee Grzyb for the team scoring lead, each knocking down 15 points, and she grabbed eight boards. Elizabeth Pickney collected 14 points and 11 rebounds for her fourth double-double of the season, and Candice Allen came off the bench for 12 points, five rebounds and five steals.

ARIZONA'S LAST TIME OUT: Despite having only eight active players for the game, Arizona pounded Washington State for the second time this season, 106-60, in Pullman on Feb. 9.

The Wildcats opened the contest with seven straight points, which were answered by Washington State with its own 7-0 spurt, tying the game at 14-14 at the 12:40 mark. Less than two minutes later, the Cats were back up by seven (21-14), but the Cougars scrapped back to within four (21-17) with 10:32 left in the half.

Arizona then put on a monster 30-3 run over the next eight minutes to gain a 31-point (51-20) lead with just over two minutes remaining in the period. WSU managed to put a dent in that lead by scoring eight straight points to end the half, but the Cougars still trailed, 51-28, at the break.

The teams traded buckets through the first five minutes of the second half, then Arizona used a 10-2 run to go up by 33 points (72-39) at 13:29. The Cougars got back to within 30 points four times after that, but that was the closest they would come for the remainder of the game. With 2:02 left in the contest, Aimee Grzyb nailed a jumper to give the Cats their largest lead of the contest at 47 points (102-55).

Six Wildcats reached double-digits in scoring, led by junior guard Julie Brase's career- and game-high of 22 points. Elizabeth Pickney collected 21 points and seven rebounds, while Robin Roberson and Dee-Dee Wheeler were just one point off their career highs, with 19 apiece. Danielle Adefeso tallied new career highs of 12 points and eight rebounds, and Aimee Grzyb contributed 10 points and a career- and game-high eight assists.

HEAD COACH JOAN BONVICINI: The winningest coach in Arizona women's basketball history, Joan Bonvicini has nurtured the Wildcat program into an upward-rising powerhouse. In 11 seasons at the helm of the Arizona program, Bonvicini has guided the Wildcats to six straight postseason appearances, including four NCAA tournament berths and two in the WNIT.

In her 11th season with the Wildcats, Bonvicini holds a 191-129 (.597) mark at Arizona and is 516-200 (.721) in 23 years as a head coach. She is 23-14 in NCAA tournament play and has never lost a first-round game in 13 appearances.

Prior to taking over at the UA, Bonvicini led Long Beach State to 10 consecutive NCAA appearances, including two trips to the Final Four. She registered a 325-71 mark in 12 seasons with the 49ers.

DID YOU KNOW: Since Joan Bonvicini took over the Arizona program in 1991, the Wildcats have gone 101-92 against Pac-10 teams, although they have a 67-37 league mark over the last six seasons combined.

THE REST OF THE STAFF: Awarded the title of associate head coach in 1998, Denise Dove Ianello (Northern Illinois, 1992) is in her 10th year at the UA, functioning as both the team's recruiting coordinator and a perimeter coach. In his third year at the UA, assistant coach Curtis Loyd (Southern Utah, 1994) is involved with scouting and with coaching the post players and is the director of the Joan Bonvicini Hoop Camp. New assistant coach Kellee Barney (Idaho, 1983) was just added to the Wildcat staff on Feb. 11. She will assist primarily with recruiting, scouting and floor work with the players.

NEW WILDCAT ON THE WAY: Associate head coach Denise Dove Ianello and her husband Rob, who is the UA football recruiting coordinator and wide receivers coach, are expecting their first child in April 2002.

LOOKING AHEAD: Arizona will face rival Arizona State in the final regular-season game for both teams on Saturday, Feb. 23, at 2 p.m. in McKale. The contest will be broadcast live nationally on Fox Sports Net.

All 10 Pac-10 women's teams will head up to Eugene, Ore., for the inaugural Pac-10 Conference Tournament on Mar. 1-4.

FREE-WHEELIN': Freshman Dee-Dee Wheeler has been an exceptional rookie all season, but over the last four games, she has been phenomenal. She has averaged 17.0 points, 3.8 rebounds, 3.3 assists and 2.8 steals per game over that stretch. She has also been shooting

64.1 percent (25-39) from the floor, 61.5 percent (8-13) from three-point range and 83.3 percent (10-12) from the line. Wheeler is among the current Pac-10 leaders in seven different statistical categories.

Wheeler has reached double digits in scoring in 17 games this season. That's the highest number of double-digit scoring performances for any Wildcat freshman since Elizabeth Pickney tallied 19 during the 1998-99 season.

ASU GAME ADDED TO TELEVISION SLATE: The Wildcats' game against rival Arizona State at home on Saturday, Feb. 23, has been picked up for national broadcast on Fox Sports Net that day at 2 p.m. That's a bonus for the Cats, who are 5-0 when playing on TV this season.

IT COULD HAPPEN: Is it possible that one of the multitude of school records set by former Wildcat great Adia Barnes could be broken this season? Definitely! Elizabeth Pickney has made a total of 459 free throws for her career, only 13 shy of Barnes' record of 472, which was compiled over the 1995-98 seasons. Pickney has to drain only an average of four or more free throws per game for the remainder of the season to break Barnes' record. She is currently averaging 5.5 free throws made per game.

Barnes' record of 671 free throws attempted is in no danger of being broken, however. Pickney has amassed only 596 attempts.

THAT WAS THEN, THIS IS NOW: Over the first 13 games of the season, the Wildcats averaged only 69.2 points per game and shot only 40.2 percent from the floor, including 32.9 percent from three-point range, while gamering a paltry 5-8 record. However, over their last 11 games, the Cats have averaged 82.3 ppg and have been shooting 46.9 percent from the floor and 40.3 percent from beyond the arc while collecting a 7-4 mark.

RETURN OF THE TWIN TOWERS: After a couple of weeks of less-than-stellar performances from the senior post players, the Wildcats' "Twin Towers" -- Elizabeth Pickney and LaKeisha Taylor -- have been putting up some big numbers over the last few games.

During the last six contests, Pickney has averaged 20.8 points and 8.5 rebounds per game. She has hit 47.5 percent (38-80) of her shots from the floor, including 2-for-4 from three-point range, and has shot 83.9 percent (47-56) from the free throw line.

Over her last four games, Taylor shot 58.7 percent (27-46) from the floor and 84.2 percent (16-19) from the line while averaging 17.5 points, 10.8 rebounds and 2.0 assists per game. She pulled down a career-high 17 rebounds at Washington on Feb. 7.

STILL CLIMBING: Going over the 700-rebound mark for her career while in Washington last weekend, Elizabeth Pickney has become one of only two Wildcats ever to top both 1500 points and 700 rebounds. She has career totals of 1579 points and 709 boards. Adia Barnes was the only previous player to accomplish such a feat, with 2237 career points and 921 rebounds.

PUT UP SOME POINTS: The Cats are 6-3 this season when Elizabeth Pickney scores 20 points or more.

WINS vs. LOSSES: In Arizona's wins this year, it is out-scoring opponents by an average of 15.2 ppg, is shooting a solid 47.1 percent from the floor and 41.0 percent from three-point range, and is draining 79.9 percent of its free throws. The Cats' stats seem to flip-flop, though, in their losses. A comparison ...

NOTING THE PAC-10: Stanford (24-1 overall) continues to dominate the league and has secured at least a portion of the 2002 league title with a perfect 14-0 mark in conference action. Washington has a narrow hold on second place with a 10-4 conference mark, followed closely by Arizona State's 10-5 record. USC (9-5) is alone in fourth place, and Oregon State (9-6) is in fifth. Arizona is still tied for sixth place with Oregon, each team at 8-7. UCLA (3-11 Pac-10), California (1-13) and Washington State (0-14) round out the conference standings.

GOING POLLING: Six of the 18 opponents on the Cats' 2001-02 schedule were either ranked or receiving votes for ranking in the most recent polls.

In this week's Associated Press Poll, Stanford remains in the No. 2 spot, and Notre Dame moves back into the rankings for the first time in many weeks, now at No. 23. Washington, New Mexico and Arizona State all received votes for ranking.

In the *USA Today*/ESPN Coaches Poll, Stanford is the only opponent ranked, also at No. 2. Notre Dame, New Mexico, Arizona State, Pepperdine and Washington were among the teams receiving votes for ranking.

CLOSE BUT...: Twelve of Arizona's 24 games this season have been decided by nine points or less, with eight of those being decided by five points or less.

CHECKING THE RECORD BOOK: Wildcat senior Elizabeth Pickney is among the Arizona career leaders in 16 different statistical categories. She recently became Arizona's career leader in blocked shots, now with 144. Pickney is second in career scoring (1579), second in free throws made (459), second in free throws attempted (596), second in field goals made (556), third in total rebounds (709), third in career rebounding average (6.1 rpg), third in games started (108), tied for third in scoring average (13.5 ppg), fourth in double-doubles (11), fourth in field goals attempted (1125) and fourth in free throw percentage (.770).

Julie Brase is third in career three-point percentage (.371), seventh in career three-pointers made (79) and seventh in three-pointers attempted (213). Aimee Grzyb is fourth in three-point percentage (.361), fourth in three-pointers made (92) and fifth in three-pointers attempted (255).

THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME: The Wildcats have won 27 of their last 35 home games and are 49-13 on their home court over the last four seasons combined. During Joan Bonvicini's 11 seasons at Arizona, the Wildcats have posted a 114-48 mark in McKale Center. Arizona has a record of 180-156 on its home court since the 1976-77 season.

80 IS THE MAGIC NUMBER: It seems that the 80-point mark almost always means adding another to the "win" column for the Wildcats. In the 30-year history of UA women's basketball, the Cats have posted a 140-21 record when scoring 80 points or more in a game. Under Bonvicini, the Wildcats have gone 100-14 when topping that 80-point plateau.

BY THE NUMBERS: The Cats have hit five or more 3-pointers in 17 of this season's 24 games... Arizona has had 15 or more assists in 14 games... The Cats have had 10 or more steals in nine games... Arizona has forced its opponent into 20 or more turnovers in 10 contests... The UA has scored 80 points or better in eight games.

KEYS TO THE WIN: This season, Arizona is... 6-0 when shooting 80% or better from the line... 6-3 when forcing more turnovers than it commits... 9-2 when leading at halftime... 11-5 when scoring 70 points or more... 10-4 when shooting better than its opponent from the free throw line... 12-6 when holding its opponent to 77 points or less.

BUT ON THE LOSING END...: The Cats are... 0-6 when giving up 80 points or more... 2-8 when shooting worse from the free throw line than the opponent... 2-9 when trailing at halftime... 3-8 when making fewer three-pointers than the opponent... 6-12 when shooting less than 80% from the line... 1-7 when scoring 69 points or less... 4-8 when three or fewer players reach double digits in scoring... 3-8 when shooting under 40% from the floor.

PICKNEY BECOMES UA CAREER BLOCKS LEADER: With a career-high-tying five blocks at New Mexico on Nov. 27, Elizabeth Pickney has taken over as Arizona's career blocked shots leader. She has 144 career blocks, placing her ahead of former career leader Marte Alexander (1995-98), who had 121.

CAT SCRATCHES: The Arizona women's basketball program has a 350-417 (.456) all-time record, however it is 154-81 (.655) from 1994 to present... Joan Bonvicini has a 192-105 career record against Pac-10 teams.

ON LOCATION: This year, Arizona is 7-5 at home, 5-7 on the road and 0-0 in neutral games. Last season, the Wildcats were 15-2 at home, 4-9 in road games and 1-1 in neutral contests.

KNOCKING 'EM DOWN: Elizabeth Pickney drained 15 of her 16 free throw attempts against Oregon on Feb. 2, tying a school record for most free throws made in a game. The record was previously set by former Wildcat Angela Lackey at home against Stanford on Jan. 8, 2000.

RANKED OPPONENTS: Standing at No. 3 when the Wildcats played the Cardinal on Jan. 24, Stanford was the highest-ranked opponent Arizona has faced since playing then-No. 2 Tennessee on Mar. 20, 2000, in the second round of the NCAA tournament. Stanford was the highest-ranked regular season opponent the Cats have faced since then-No. 2 Louisiana Tech on Dec. 6, 1998.

BOMBS AWAY: Against UC Santa Barbara on Jan. 14, the Wildcats were 12-for-32 from three-point land, just one 3-pointer made away from the school record of 13. The 32 attempts set a new record, however, erasing the earlier mark of 29 set against Stanford on Jan. 12, 1998.

WHAT A GAME!: After six straight games of averaging barely 60 points a contest, the Wildcats went off for a 107-57 win over Washington State on Jan. 10. It was Arizona's biggest victory over a Division I opponent since drilling Cal State Fullerton, 87-33, on Dec. 8, 1995. The 107 points was Arizona's highest offensive output since scoring 107 in a victory over UC Santa Barbara (107-74) on Nov. 23, 1997.

The Cats scored 61 points in the second half against WSU, the highest point total for any half since the team collected 62 points in the second half at Providence on Dec. 30, 1995. The Wildcats also shot 53.9 percent from the floor against the Cougars, the UA's best shooting percentage in 20 games and its first time over 50 percent for this season.

ROUGH START: The Cats' 4-5 start was the worst start ever for a Bonvicini-coached team at Arizona and is the program's worst record through the first nine games since the 1988-89 season.

THE CATS AND PAC-10 OPENERS: Under Joan Bonvicini, Arizona has a 7-4 mark in Pac-10 openers and has won its first conference contest in seven of the last nine years.

CRASHING THE BOARDS: Junior wing Krista Warren pulled down a career-high 18 rebounds at Stephen F. Austin on Dec. 16. That's the highest individual rebound total for any Wildcat since Adia Barnes grabbed her career high of 18 against Arizona State on Jan. 7, 1995.

JOAN BONVICINI COACHES HER 700th GAME: The Dec. 16 contest at Stephen F. Austin was the 700th game of Arizona head coach Joan Bonvicini's career.

WILDCAT PICKPOCKETS: The Wildcats racked up an astounding 19 steals in their 81-80 loss to Pittsburgh at home on Dec. 2. That's the highest single-game steals total since the team collected 22 steals in a losing effort at Oregon (68-66) on Jan. 24, 1998.

CHALLENGING START: Over these first 15 days of the 2002 season, the Wildcats played six games, including five opponents that saw postseason action in 2001. That slate included last year's WNIT champion Ohio State, the NCAA champion Notre Dame and the WNIT runner-up New Mexico.

PICKNEY NAMED PAC-10 PLAYER OF THE WEEK (Nov. 26): Senior forward Elizabeth Pickney was named the Pac-10 Women's Basketball Player of the Week for Nov. 18-25.

Pickney averaged 21.0 points, 7.0 rebounds and 1.3 blocks in leading Arizona to a 3-0 start, including an upset win of defending national champion and 15th-ranked Notre Dame. On the week, Pickney shot 95.8 percent (23-of-24) from the line and hit 57.1 percent (20-of-35) from the floor.

In an 81-77 season-opening win over Pepperdine on Nov. 18, Pickney notched 12 points and six rebounds. On Nov. 21, she shot a perfect 8-for-8 from the free throw line en route to a game-high 24 points and seven rebounds as Arizona downed defending WNIT champion Ohio State, 90-76. Pickney was 8-for-13 from the floor against the Buckeyes.

In the 72-70 win over the Fighting Irish on Nov. 24, she scored a game-high 27 points and posted a team-high eight rebounds. She shot 8-for-13 from the floor and was a perfect 11-for-11 from the line, contributing to the Cats' 20-for-20 school-record performance at the stripe. Pickney scored 21 of UA's 43 second-half points, nailing a lay-up at the buzzer to lift the Cats to a two-point win.

The Player of the Week honor was the fourth of Pickney's career and the 24th all-time selection for Arizona.

CATS INK THREE DURING FALL SIGNING PERIOD: The Wildcats signed three players during the fall signing period this year. Shawntinice Polk (Hanford, Calif./Hanford HS), Svyetlana Papcevic (Sarajevo, Bosnia/Pratt Kans. CC) and Natalie Jones (Anchorage, Alaska/East Anchorage HS) all signed National Letters of Intent.

Polk originally signed with Arizona last year, but her NLI was rendered void when she failed to meet academic requirements for this school year. She signed a new letter during the early signing period last fall.

GOOD BEGINNINGS: With Joan Bonvicini at the program's helm, the Wildcats have won seven straight season openers and nine in the 11 years she has been at the UA.

CLARK WITHDRAWS FROM SCHOOL: Guard Mandakova Clark, who would have sat out this year after transferring from Rutgers, withdrew from the University of Arizona at the end of October and will not be returning to the school.

ITALY TOUR 2001: On May 18-June 2, 2001, the Wildcats went to Italy for the program's third foreign tour. The tour began in Venice then advanced to Verona, Como, Milan, Lucca, Pisa, Florence and concluded in Rome. The Cats went 5-1 against club teams in many of these cities and visited a multitude of historical sites along the way.

2000-01 IN REVIEW: Arizona certainly saw its share of ups and downs during the 2000-01 season. The Cats started the year with a short squad of 12 players, only two of whom were starters at the end of the 2000 season. Through a variety of injuries, player departures and academic issues, the Wildcat roster was decimated, and the team was down to only eight active players by season's end.

Despite all the distractions and the prevailing inexperience of last year's squad, the Wildcats finished the year with a 20-12 overall record, their fifth 20-win season in the last six years. They were 9-9 in Pac-10 play and finished in fifth place, their lowest finish since 1995.

For the first time since 1996, Arizona failed to earn an NCAA tournament berth, but it did receive a Women's National Invitation Tournament slot. The Wildcats downed Pepperdine, 85-65, in the first round of the WNIT but fell, 75-62, at New Mexico in the second round to end their season. The WNIT berth gave the Wildcats their sixth straight postseason appearance, the third-longest active postseason streak in the Pac-10.

The team set or tied 39 school records last year, including most home victories (15), most points scored in a season (2,521) and highest single season scoring average (78.8 ppg).

2000-01 ON THE INDIVIDUAL FRONT: Elizabeth Pickney ended the season as the Cats' leading scorer, with 16.4 ppg, and second-leading rebounder (6.3 rpg). Senior guard Reshea Bristol was second in scoring, with 15.6 ppg, and ended the year as the Pac-10 leader in assists (7.56 apg).

LaKeisha Taylor (9.5 ppg) and Krista Warren (9.3 ppg) were fourth and fifth, respectively, in scoring. Warren was the team's third-leading rebounder, averaging 5.4 rpg.

In addition to leading the Pac-10 in assists, Bristol was second in steals (3.0 spg), fifth in scoring and fifth in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.34). Pickney was third in the league in scoring, fourth in blocked shots (1.47 bpg), sixth in field goal percentage (.505) and ninth in rebounding. Taylor was second in field goal percentage (.587).
