The Event: The University of Arizona Wildcat women's golf team will open up the spring season with the hosting of the Wildcat Invitational. Held at the Golf Club at Vistoso, competition will take place Sun.-Tues., Feb. 5-7. One round of play will be contested each day with a start time of 8 a.m. MT. The Golf Club at Vistoso is a par 72, 6,250-yard course.

The Coverage: Live results are available at golfstat.com. A complete recap and results will be available at ArizonaWildcats.com after each day of competition.

The Field: Arizona, Arizona State, Colorado, Denver, Northern Arizona, New Mexico, New Mexico State, North Texas, Oregon State, Portland State, San Diego State, Stanford, UCLA and UNLV will play in Tucson this weekend.

The Line Up: Seniors Isabelle Boineau, Nikki Koller and Margarita Ramos, sophomore Haley Andreas and freshman Manon Gidali will play for the Arizona team this weekend. Juniors Kyndall Ardoin and Clemence Abrahamian and freshmen Paige Spiranac and Andrea Vilarasau will play as individuals.

Last Time Out: Arizona earned a sixth-place finish, at the Betsy Rawls Invitational, in Austin, Texas, with rounds of 304, 294 and 300 for a total of 898 (+34). Freshman Andrea Vilarasau was Arizona's top finisher in a two-way tie for eighth place. She carded rounds of 76, 68 and 75 for a three-day total of 219 (+3). Senior Isabelle Boineau finished in a three-way tie for 19th. She collected scores of 73, 76 and 76 for total of 225 (+9).
