Arizona Travels to the NCAA Central Regional

Teeing Off: The Arizona Women's golf team placed third in the 2004 Pac-10 Women's Golf Tournament in Somis, Calif., at the Saticoy Country Club on April 19-21, 2004. The team now will prepare for competition at the NCAA Central Regional on May 6-8, 2004 in Normal, Ill.

The Course: Designed in 1962 by Robert Bruce Harris, the course accomodates approximately 36,000 rounds per year and host more than 100 tournamens. The course is Par 71 on a 6,500 yard-layout.

The Field: (1) Vanderbilt, (2) New Mexico, (3) **ARIZONA**, (4) Southern California, (5) Oklahoma, (6) Michigan State, (7) Tulsa, (8) Missouri, (9) TCU, (10) Arkansas, (11) Texas A&M, (12) Kansas State, (13) Indiana, (14) Southern Medthodist, (15) Kent State, (16) Purdue, (17) Northwestern, (19) Notre Dame, (20) Princeton, (21) Illinois State and Individuals from Wisconsin, Arkansas-Little Rock and Michigan.

Schedule: A practice round will be held on Wednesday, May 5. First round, second round and third round action of the NCAA Central Regional will tee off at 8 a.m. CST for all three rounds. Players will tee off from either the 1st or the 10th hole.

The Rankings: The Wildcats jumped up one to 10th on the *Golfweek/Sagarin* Performance Index. Arizona had been previously ranked as high as second in the poll since the beginning of the fall season, but then took a drop after their ninth place finish at the Wildcat Invitational. Individually, sophomore **Erica Blasberg** stayed in fourth with a rating of 70.39.

Marching Back: Sophomore **Alejandra Martin del Campo** got caught in the middle of a Pac-10 transfer rule that kept her ineligible all season. "Thanks to the efforts of our compliance director Bill Morgan and our faculty rep Doug Woodard, they have worked endless hours with the Pac-10 to make this rule retroactive and have gotten her eligibility restored through the NCAA," Head Coach Greg Allen said. Martin will compete with the Wildcats in Normal, Ill.

Last Time On The Course: The Arizona women's golf team finished in third, after its final round of competition at the 2004 Pac-10 Championship in Somis, Calif. The Wildcats shot a 59-over-par 923 to trail Pac-10 tournament champion, UCLA by 21 strokes after the Bruins shot a 38-over-par 902. California finished in second after shooting a 56-over-par 920. Southern California (928) and Arizona State (928) tied for fourth place. Individually, sophomore **Erica Blasberg** finished third after shooting a final round 75 (+3) placing her at 5-over-par 221 for the tournament. The sophomore from Corona, Calif. finished third in last year's Pac-10 Championship. Sophomore **Lani Elston** had her best career finish as a Wildcat, by finishing tied for fifth place with Arizona State's Tiffany Tavee at 225 (+9). Sophomore **Cassandra Kirkland** tied for 14th at 17-over-par 233. Junior **Miriam Kraschinski** tied for 41st place after shooting 28-over-par 244. While sophomore **Whitney Welch** shot a 56-over-par 272 for 57th place. Also competing for Arizona, as an individual junior **Mar Garcia** tied for 32nd after carding a 22-over-par 238.

Head Coach Greg Allen's Thoughts on the Team's Performance:

"It [Pac-10 Championship] was our best Spring finish. We went in as the fourth seed so I thought we did pretty well. Our top-3 players played well."

Coach Allen's thoughts On Junior Mar Garcia's Health Concerns and Play: "If Mar [Garcia] had played on the team we would have finished second. But we didn't know she didn't know if she could complete 18-holes on the first day. It was good for her to get out there and compete, we will have her back in the line-up for Regionals."

Coach Allen's Thoughts on Sophomore Lani Elston: "It was her best finish, by finishing in the top-ten she made all conference. She is gaining confidence, she's doing exactly what she has talked about all year; peaking at the right time and it's great to see her do that."

Coach Allen's Thoughts on Alejandra Martin: "Although Ale [Martin] has yet to compete in a college golf tournament, she will make this team better because of her attitude, work ethic and tremendous will to win."

11 and Counting: This will be the 11th consecutive year Arizona women's golf has participated in the NCAA Regionals.

Pac-10 Honors: Three of the Women's golfers received honors from the Pac-10. Sophomore **Erica Blasberg** for the second year was named to the First Team All Pac-10. Sophomore **Lani Elston** and sophomore **Cassandra Kirkland** were named to the Pac-10 honorable mention list.

Top One: Sophomore **Lani Elston's** top-5 performance at the Pac-10 Championship was her best career finish as a Wildcat. Elston tied for fifth after shooting a 225 (+9).

3...The Magical Number: The women's golf team and sophomore **Erica Blasberg** both placed third in the 2004 Pac-10 Championship. The team took third after carding a 923 (+59). Blasberg claimed the third place, individual honors, after stroking a 221 (+5).

Title Town : At the last seven Pac-10 tournament the Wildcats have won five of the Pac-10 team titles. The Wildcats additionally, won in 1992.

The Best Of The Pac-10s: In the last 12 years five Wildcats won Pac-10 championship individual meadlist honors. Annika Sorenstam (1992) was the first Arizona golfer to claim the honor, with Lorena Ochoa being the last, in 2001.

Extravaganza Allen: Wildcat Head Coach **Greg Allen** participated in the 2004 Wildcat Extravaganza, along with Athletic Director Jim Livingood and Head Football Coach Mike Stoops to name a few. The golf action will tee off on Friday, April 16 at the Wildcats home course Arizona National.

Effective Elston: Sophomore **Lani Elston** shot her career best as a Wildcat in the PING/ASU Invitational. She ended the tournament carding a 219 (+3) and also shot a career round of 69 in the final round.

Minus One: Sophomore **Erica Blasberg** did not make the trip to Austin, Texas for the Betsy Rawls Longhorn Invitational because she participated in the LPGA's Kraft Nabisco Championship which was held at Mission Hills Country Club in Rancho Mirage, Calif. on March 25-28, 2004. Blasberg shot a 15-over-par 159 to miss the cut.

Jumpin' In: Sophomore **Erica Blasberg** made an appearance in the LPGA's Welch's/Fry's Championship in Tucson, Ariz. on March 11-14th. Blasberg along with Joan Pitcock were sponsor exemption participatants in this event. Blasberg shot a 146 (+6) and did not make the cut. Several former Wildcats joined Blasberg, the list includes; Lorena Ochoa, Marisa Baena, Jenna Daniels, Natalie Gulbis, Chris Johnson, Kathryn Marshall, Laura Myerscoug

A and B: The Wildcats spilt their team for the Mountain View Collegiate. Arizona used their B-squad to compete. The squad finished 17th.

Classic Christy: Sophomore **Katie Christy** shot her best as a Wildcat in the Mountain View Collegiate. Christy finished the tournament 21-over-par 237. Saturday's afternoon round was Christy's collegiate best round of golf. She went 1-under-par 71.

Golfin' Gavin: Freshman **Rachel Gavin** played her collegiate best at the Mountain View Collegiate. Gavin shot a 242 (+26) at the tournament.

Not Sweet Home: The Wildcats suffered their worst finish of the 2003-04 season at their home tournament, the Wildcat Invitational. Arizona finished ninth out of 15 teams on their home course, Arizona National. At the 2003 Wildcat Invitational the women's golfers placed ninth also.

Drivin' in the Rain: At the Wildcat Invitational on Monday, February 23 rain drenched Arizona National and the women golfers competing. Several player blamed the rain for their woes, while others flourished in the stormy conditions.

Making The Grade: In the Dec. 20-27, 2003 issue of *Golfweek* the Arizona Women's Golfers recieved a letter grade of A. The *Golfweek* staff cited 'All four finishes in top-6, including a victory at Washington' as the reason for the A grade.

Sophomore Sensation: Sophomore **Erica Blasberg**, a pre-season All-American selection, won three individual title during the fall season. Her latest at the Pepsi-Stanford Invitational in Palo Alto, Calif. on Oct. 17-19. Blasberg's first season victory came at the Mason Rudolph Invitational on Sept. 26-28, followed by her second victory at the Edean Ihlanfeldt Invitational on Oct. 6-8.

Record Setting Blasberg: The Pepsi-Stanford Invitational was **Erica Blasberg's** best three-rounds of golf in her career at Arizona. In all three rounds Blasberg shot under par, carding a 209 (-7) to tie her with Duke's Elizabeth Janangelo for first.

Wonderful Welch: Sophomore **Whitney Welch** shot her collegiate best, by posting 73-75-73—221(+5) at the Pepsi-Stanford Invitational.

Cool Cassandra: Sophomore **Cassandra Kirkland** stayed in the top five throughout all three rounds at the NCAA Fall Preview. On her first day of competition Kirkland tied with Auburn's Nicole Hage, with both carding 4-under-par 68. On her second day, she stood atop the leader board at the Preview by shooting an even par 72. In her final round Kirkland tied with fellow Wildcat sophomore **Erica Blasberg** after shooting a 1-under-par.

New to the Greens: The Wildcat Invitational was the first event of the season for freshman **Rachel Gavin**. Gavin placed tied for 61st after shooting 31-over-par 244.

Superior Sophomores: Head coach **Greg Allen** took four sophomores to the team's first three events of the fall. **Erica Blasberg, Lani Elston, Whitney Welch** and **Cassandra Kirkland** helped the Wildcats place in the top five in the Fall's first three events.

Wildcat Coaching Staff: A six-year college coaching veteran, **Greg Allen** has led the Arizona Wildcats to nine tournament championships in just four years at the helm of the program. Included in the team's accomplishments under Allen are the 2001 and 2002 Pac-10 Conference Championships, a national runner-up finish and a 20-stroke victory at the 2001 NCAA West Regional. Allen, hired in July 2000, came to the University of Arizona from Texas where he was the assistant coach for the Longhorn's men's golf team. Prior to coaching at Texas, Allen served as Director of Tournament Operations with the American Junior Golf Association. Allen graduated from Murray State University in 1993. **Jody Niemann-Dansie**, hired in July of 2002, assists him. Niemann-Danise played two years on the LPGA after completing her collegiate eligibility. She is a graduate of Arizona State University and was a member of the 1997 and 1998 NCAA National Championship team in Tempe.

NCAA FALL PREVIEW Sept. 12-14, 2003

3rd

Arizona took to the Grand National Lake Course placed atop the leaders board. The Wildcats took third place after shooting 14-over-par 878 in the final round. Sophomore Cassandra Kirkland and sophomore Erica Blasberg tied for third place, as they ended the tournament at 1-under-par 215. Atop the leader board was, Auburn and Duke tied. The Tigers and Devils lead the Wildcats by eight strokes. Duke won on first playoff hole. Oklahoma and Oklahoma State round out the top five, as Oklahoma shot 24-over-par 888 and Oklahoma State posted a score of 31-over-par 895. On the individual leader board, Pepperdine's Carolina Llano won the competition, shooting 5-under-par 211. Llano also had a hole-in-one on the 15th hole. In second was Oklahoma's Lisa Meldrum posting a 2-under-par 214. Wildcat sensation Erica Blasberg and sophomore Cassandra Kirkland tied with two other golfers in third at 1-under-par 215. In Sunday's play Blasberg shot a 2-over-par 74. While yesterday's leader Kirkland posted 3-over-par 75 on Sunday. Sophomore Whitney Welch tied for 29th with two other golfers after shooting 9-over-par 225. Junior Mar Garcia tied for 32nd with three other golfers. Garcia carded a 226 (10-over-par). Sophomore transfer Lani Elston finished play tied for 36th after posting 11-over-par 227 in her first competition as a Wildcat.

MASON RUDOLPH INVITATIONAL 5th Sept. 26-28, 2003

The Wildcats placed fifth after shooting 27-over-par 891. Arizona finished 17 strokes behind tournament champion Georgia after the bulldogs shot a 10-over-par 874. UCLA (878) and Vanderbilt (886) occupied second and third places, respectively. Florida placed fourth with an 25-over-par 889. Individually, Arizona sophomore Erica Blasberg placed first after shooting a 213 (-3). The native of Corona, Calif., returned to the tournament where her sensational freshman season took off a year ago. Blasberg finished second, which was the first of nine consecutive top-ten finishes, including two victories. Sophomore Cassandra Kirkland tied at 28th after shooting 10-over-par 226. Sophomore Whitney Welch tied for 41st at 13-over-par 229. Sophomore Lani Elston finished 44th after shooting 14-over-par 230. Junior Mar Garcia tied for 50th after shooting 17-over-par 23. Also competing for Arizona as an individual was junior Miriam Kraschinski who tied at 57th after carding 19-over-par 235.

EDEAN IHLANFELDT INVITATIONAL Oct. 6-8, 2003

The Arizona women's golf team came from behind Wednesday to win the Edean Ihlantfeldt Invitational in Seattle, Wash. The Wildcats trailed the second-round leader California by one stroke going into the third round. Arizona stroked a 304 (+16) on Wednesday to placed first. UA shot 32-over-par 896 for the tournament. California (899) and UCLA (899) finished tied at second, three strokes behind the tournament champion Wildcats. Southern California (914) occupied third place. Oregon held fifth place with a 60-over-par 924. Individually Arizona sophomore Erica Blasberg tied for first, after shooting a 219 (+3). This is the second consecutive first place finish of the season for the native of Corona, Calif. On Sept. 26-28 Blasberg took first at the Mason Rudolph Invitational. Sophomore Whitney Welch tied for seventh after shooting 7-over-par 223. Junior Mar Garcia tied for ninth at 8-over-par 224. Sophomore Lani Elston finished tied at 28th after shooting 16-over-par 232. Sophomore Cassandra Kirkland tied for 34th after shooting 18-over-par 234.

PEPSI-STANFORD INVITATIONAL 6TH OCT. 17-19, 2003

The Arizona women's golf team finished the Stanford Women's Intercollegiate in sixth place after its final day of competition in Palo Alto, Calif. The Wildcats ended play sixth place, after shooting 14-over-par 878. Arizona finished 33 strokes behind tournament champion Duke after the Blue Devils shot a 19-under-par 845. Washington (850) and UCLA (859) occupy second and third places, respectively. California placed fourth with a 5-over-par 869. New Mexico rounded out the top-5, after carding an 875. Individually Arizona sophomore Erica Blasberg tied for first with Duke's Elizabeth Janangelo, after shooting a 209 (-7). This is the third consecutive first place finish of the season for the native of Corona, Calif. On Sept. 26-28 Blasberg took first at the Mason Rudolph Invitational and on Oct. 6-8 Blasberg tied for first at the Edean Ihlantfeldt Invitational. Sophomore Whitney Welch tied for 30th after shooting 5-over-par 221. Sophomore Lani Elston tied for 33rd at 6-over-par 222. Junior Mar Garcia finished tied at 57th after shooting 13-over-par 229.
