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GymCats Working Hard to Make Impact

Relying on the seniors and standouts as well as bringing in new talent serve as a springboard for success in the 2011-12 season

How do you feel about the upcoming season?

"We've had a great off season, but we know a team is only as good as its last meet so we need to keep building. I'm looking towards us building as a team, getting a little healthier, being able to install some new gymnastics and just sort of returning to levels that we haven't been at in a few years. I feel like as a team we're pretty experienced; we have a lot of veterans, and I feel like we're going to use that to our advantage to compete very well meet in meet out."

"As far as the season is concerned, it's going to be one of the toughest yet. I like our schedule as far as the way the meets are laid out, but I also know that every competition is going to be a dogfight. As long as we take each meet one weekend as a time and move on from our mistakes we should be good to go."

How do you think the seniors are going to contribute this year?

"All four of the seniors have done an incredible job for us. I mean, you look at Katie and Deanna – they're doing the best gymnastics of their career. The fact that both of them are Pac-10 and NCAA Regional medalists and finalists as well as first team all-conference members really speaks to their talent level."

"Becca now seems to be doing her very best work as well; in fact she's even looking the best she's been on vault in the past couple of years."

"We've been through the ringer with Britnie and her injuries and the fact that she's able

to do the two events at the level she's doing them right now – I couldn't ask more of the senior class."

"A lot of the weight is on their shoulders. I don't think they would want it any other way. I'm proud of them for all they're doing, and they're going to do a bulk of the competing and we'll just take it from there."

What are your expectations for Aubree Cristello?

"Aubree very well could be the top or most consistent gymnast on the team. You're talking about a girl who has only been here for two years and has been first team all-conference in the all-around two years in a row in one of the toughest conferences in the nation."

"We rely on her: she's a rock, she's steady, and she's someone I really have confidence in when I put her wherever I put her, even when she's dealing with issues. She's done so much already. She's only halfway through her career and has already established herself to the faithful as one of those solid veterans that you always count on. I don't see her role with the team getting anything but more important if that is even possible."

Which of the freshman do you think will make the biggest splash?

"Well you know it's a little bit up and down. I would've said something different the last few months than today – all of the freshmen have had some issue with injury. Kristin is fighting with an injury right now, if we can get her healthy she will make an impact. Allie is fighting with an injury right now that is really limiting her, and Danielle has been coming

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back off of an injury ever since she arrived on campus. Amber was dealing with some injuries in her legs right at the end of the fall semester and is just now starting to turn it on.”

“I think you may see one freshman or two in one meet and another set in another meet. It’s really going to be an up and down rollercoaster for them in regards getting experience and breaking into the lineups because we have a lot of really good athletes already on the team. Ultimately two or three years from now the freshman class will have really distinguished itself, but I think it’s going to be a little bit slow starting for them for a number of reasons.”

What are your main points of emphasis for the team this season?

“Don’t count falls. Pay attention to little details – the devil is in the details. We have all of the difficulty and big skills we could ever use but extra steps, not hitting 180 on leaps, not getting turns around, not hitting handstands – all of that stuff adds up so quickly. You’ve got to hit routines and you’ve got to stay on the equipment.”

What is the competition like within the gym to be in the lineup?

“It’s crazy. It’s to the point where we can’t even finalize a lineup until way late. We’re looking at eight or nine deep on beam and bars. Floor and vault right now are sort of our thinnest events due to our leg injuries, but the people who are there are doing a great job. I think it’s tough. If someone isn’t practicing well or is nicked up, we have enough talent that they don’t just get a pass. For the sake of the team you can go with someone stronger because there is always going to be someone waiting there. That’s really going to be a benefit, and it’s definitely made us stronger.”

Speak on your opinion of the new conference:

“Well, what can you say? I don’t know what the official rules are as far as adding championships for the members that we’ve added or whatever, but if you add the championships that Utah brings, as well as their level of gymnastics, combined with the championships that UCLA has already won as well as just all of the top quality gymnastics that there already is I think we easily could now be at the forefront of gymnastics conferences – simply with the addition of Utah. Now, that doesn’t make it any easier for the rest of us in the conference obviously, but every meet is going to be huge. I don’t know how many sports in our conference can say this, but I can predict and see every team making the post season. I think that’s unheard of in any other sport.”

What are your thoughts on Deanna for her final season?

“She’s always been incredibly motivated and she loves gymnastics. She was made to be a gymnast. You look at her, she’s a big part of Tucson’s history of gymnastics, and I want her to go out with a bang. That’s her motivation and she’s certainly got the gymnastics to do it, no doubt.”

“You can’t even begin to speak on how hard she works. She injured her hand four weeks ago, and she has a splint put on it. She was so upset about being out of bars that a few days ago she talked the trainer into letting try a bar set with the splint and she hit two for two routines that probably would’ve scored 9.80. She wants the team to be as good as it can be – you can just see it in her eyes. There is never a day where she isn’t working hard. I’m really proud that she’s going to always be part of our heritage and I think she’s going to have a great senior year.”

Head Coach Bill Ryden



Now in his 14th season at the helm of the Arizona gymnastics program, head coach Bill Ryden has not only continued the tradition of Arizona gymnastics, he has taken the success of the program to a higher level. Ryden has led each of his squads to the Regional Championships, stretching the program's streak to 25 consecutive appearances and made an NCAA Championship appearance in 2002, the program's first since 1996.

Ryden also has established himself as one of Arizona's most decorated head coaches, garnering a few awards to his name honoring his leadership. Ryden was named the 2002 South Central Regional Coach of the Year and the 2002 Pac-10 Coach of the Year, becoming the first Head Coach in Arizona history to be named Regional Coach of the Year. Ryden owns a career and school record of 163-163-3in his 13 years at Arizona.

In Ryden's tenure as both Arizona's Head Coach and top assistant, he has coached in 21 Pac-10 Championship meets, 17 NCAA Championships and 21 NCAA Regional Championships. Ryden also trained 13 All-Americans and 26 All-Pac-10 gymnasts at Arizona.

2011 marked the 25th consecutive postseason appearance for the Wildcats, as Ryden led the team to fourth and fifth place victories at the Pac-10 Championships and NCAA Regional Championships (respectively).

Despite an injury filled beginning, Ryden coached the Wildcats to a 24th consecutive postseason appearance, as well as a third place finish at the NCAA Regional Championships in the 2010 season. Ryden also coached three Wildcats (Deanna Graham, Molly Quirk and Aubree Cristello) to Pac-10 All-Conference awards for all-around.

Despite the youth of the GymCats in 2009, Ryden helped coach the team to their 23rd consecutive post season appearance, including a third place finish at the NCAA Regional Championships in California. Other season highlights included the breakout performance of sophomore Deanna Graham, who, under Ryden's direction was the lone Wildcat to compete individually at the NCAA National Gymnastics Championships.

In 2008, the 11th-year head coach helped the Wildcats reach their 22nd consecutive postseason. One of the highlights of the year came in the team's dual meet with ASU. Although the Wildcats consistently beat their in-state rivals, this was the first win in dual meet, at ASU, in 22 years. This also marked the first victory of the academic year for any Arizona team against the Sun Devils. The team was also victorious in Team GPA and Community Service for the fourth time. Karin Wurm was named the inaugural Pac-10 Scholar Athlete of the Year.

In 2007, Ryden led a talented team to a 19-9 overall record, including a fourth-place finish at the Pac-10 Championships and a third-place finish at the South Central Regional Championships. Most importantly, Ryden has spearheaded the construction of Arizona's new training facility on campus, a facility that rivals the top gymnastics training centers in the country. For the second year in a row and third in four years, the team won the Director's Cup for Community Service.

Even after replacing six seniors, including the school's all-time leading scorer Monica Bisordi, Ryden led the 2006 Wildcats to a #13 national finish and into the postseason for the 20th straight year. Junior Aubrey Taylor and Sophomore Karin Wurm emerged as gymnasts to contend with at the national level as both represented Arizona at the NCAA Championships. The Wildcat Gymnastics team won the Director's Cup for Community Service for the second time in three years.

In 2005, with the largest senior class in Ryden's tenure, the Wildcats earned 24 victories, the most for the program since 1996, when the Wildcats finished with a 36-10 mark. In doing so, Arizona placed second at the Pac-10 Championships, matching their best conference finish in school history. Also, under Ryden's tutelage, senior Monica Bisordi became the school's all-time leading scorer and was named 2005 South Central Region Co-Gymnast of the Year.

In 2004, Ryden led his program to new heights. Arizona posted 11 scores in 13 meets that rank on the school's top-20 all-time list. The Wildcats also posted two scores of 197 or better that season, something only accomplished twice in program history previously. The Wildcats also posted 16 team-event scores that rank on the top-10 all-time list. In addition to the team success, Ryden also coached junior Bisordi to her second straight NCAA Championship appearance where she placed fifth on the floor while on her way to second team All-America honors. The team won the Director's Cup for Community Service.

In an injury plagued season in 2003, Arizona made two appearances in the top-10 nationally and recorded 12 new scores worthy of the all-time top-10 list. The 2003 season also marked the school's high in a meet when the Wildcats earned a 197.375 in a meet 3/14/03 against Oklahoma.

Ryden made his first appearance at the NCAA Championship meet as a head coach in 2002, leading the Wildcats to an 11th place national finish and a 19-13 overall record. This was also the season Ryden was named Pac-10 Conference Coach of the Year and South Central Regional Coach of the Year. In the Pac-10 Championships, Arizona recorded a school record 49.550 in the vault that still stands today. Ryden also coached two Gymcats, Randi Liljenquist and Stevie Fanning, to a pair of Pac-10 Championships in the floor and beam respectively.

In 2001, Arizona finished the season No. 18 nationally behind Ryden and ended the year third in the NCAA South Central Regional. A big highlight of the 2001 season came against North Carolina State, when the team set the school record for uneven bars with a 49.475 score.

In his sophomore season as the Arizona head coach, Ryden led the Wildcats all the way to a No. 20 end of the season ranking and finished fourth at the NCAA Region III Championships. He also coached Arizona legend Heidi Hornbeek to an AAI American Award.

Ryden took over the Wildcats beginning with the 1999 season after being an Arizona assistant for eight years and was a success right from the start. His first team posted four event scores that at the time ranked in the top-five on Arizona's all-time performances list.

Long considered one of the top collegiate coaches in the country, Ryden is certainly no stranger to Arizona gymnastics. Ryden entered his first season as Head Coach in 1998-99 after spending the previous eight years coaching alongside former Head Coach Jim Gault, who retired following the 1998 season. During his tenure as Arizona's top assistant coach, Ryden was named Midwest Region Assistant Coach of the Year in 1992 and was a member of the USA World University Games coaching staff in 1993.

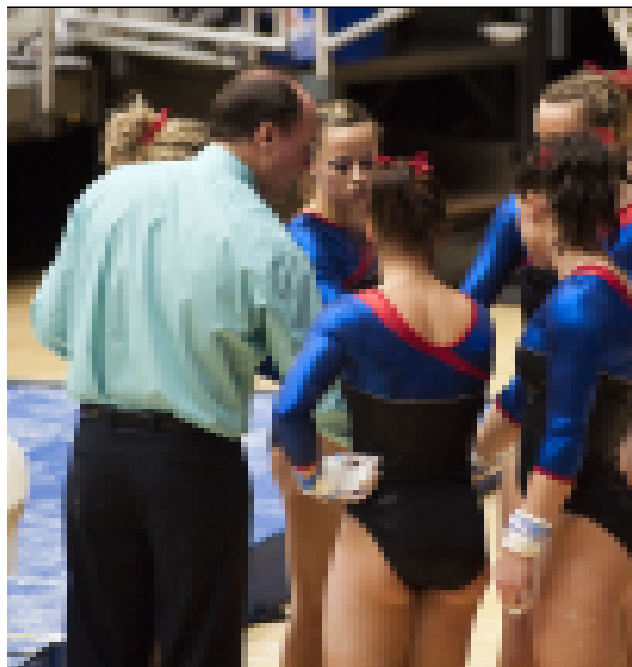

Head Coach Bill Ryden

Ryden, who started at Arizona as an assistant in August 1990, has coached in various capacities, both nationally and internationally, for more than 15 years. He served as USA national team coach in 1989, and from 1988 through 1990, he was Head Coach at Ryden Gymnastics in Littleton, Colo. From 1984 to 1988, he was a Class I/Elite coach at the Denver School of Gymnastics, where he coached former Arizona standout Diane Monty and former Wildcats Andrea Walters and Nancy Milberger during their club gymnastics career. Prior to that, in 1983, he was the Head Coach of the Arizona Twisters in Mesa, Ariz.

Not surprising, given his coaching proficiency, Ryden has an impressive background as a gymnast himself. He competed both nationally and internationally for Arizona State University from 1978 to 1983 where he was a three-year letterwinner, and during his senior year, Ryden was ranked second in the nation on the horizontal bar.

Ryden earned a B.S.E. in Aerospace Engineering from Arizona State University in 1983. He worked as a Senior Engineer at Martin Marietta Denver Aerospace from 1984 to 1990, conducting analysis on ICBM missiles and developing proprietary software systems among other tasks. He has further studies in biomechanics, anatomy and physiology, sports psychology and computer software systems.

Associate Head Coach/Recruiting Coordinator John Court



Entering his 14th year with Arizona, assistant coach John Court has established himself as one of the top assistant gymnastics coaches in the country.

With a competitive flair and energetic passion for gymnastics, Court takes great pride in helping mold each Wildcat gymnast to be at her fullest

potential both in and out of the gym.

Court's dynamic impact was recognized in 2007 as he was named the 2007 South Central Region Assistant Coach of the Year.

"I always try to get better at what I do and try to remain consistent with my coaching," Court said. "I believe in continuous learning and have a competitive drive that I teach with."

As the 2nd longest-tenured assistant coaches in the Pac-10, Court's contributions are visible both inside the gym and on an administrative level. His duties in the gym include vault and floor coaching, where Court is responsible for developing each gymnast's tumbling and vaulting.

"John has a great intention on being successful and takes great pride in representing our team and our university," head coach Bill Ryden said. "He takes his job very seriously and continues to strive to improve this team."

Outside of the gym, Court has served as Arizona's recruiting coordinator for the last six seasons, searching for the best amateur talent in the nation to bring into the Wildcat program. For Court, recruiting is not a job, it is a way to help Arizona's program get even better. Additionally, Court serves as co-director for Bill Ryden's Sonoran Gymnastics Camp.

"John spearheads our recruiting," Ryden said. "He will spend an entire year researching the upcoming recruits, figuring out where we need to go and who we need to see. He is a fan of the sport and likes finding talent. John is a people person who likes going out and talking to people."

For Court, recruiting is not a job, it is a way to help Arizona's program get even better.

"I try to assist our program in the best way I can to recruit and evaluate our future Wildcats," Court said. "This program has inked some national talent over the years and the rewards have been fantastic and our future looks very bright. After working with Bill the last eleven seasons I have a good idea of what type of person and gymnast he wants on the team."

During each gymnastics meet, Court's passion for the sport and desire to win is clearly visible in his coaching. Court leads with his emotions by always cheering for each gymnast after each routine and providing Arizona with an extra spark of energy needed to succeed.

"John is an emotional leader for this team," Ryden said. "When we get into a competition, he is all about each routine and each score. He brings his game face and helps our team succeed."

Before coaching at Arizona, Court spent five years at the University of Vermont, his last three years (1995-98) as head coach. During those years he was named ECAC Coach of the Year twice. Prior to Vermont, Court spent two years as an assistant coach at Brown University under his mother and legendary gymnastics coach Jackie Court, who coached there for 33 years.

"She is the reason I became involved with the sport. It was her passion and leadership that has helped me become the coach I am today," Court said.

With twelve years of coaching experience at Arizona, Court has noticed the valuable team experience this program provides for its gymnasts.

"At Arizona we compete at a national level in all areas and it's pleasurable to help the athletes grow as people and achieve their athletic and personal goals," Court said. "It is very important that you keep the sport fun for your team, yourself and provide a positive learning environment. We are all at our best when we love what we do."

Court is a 1993 graduate of Johnson and Wales University with a bachelor's degree in marketing. He received his master's degree in public/athletics administration from the University of Vermont in 1995.

Assistant Coach/Choreographer Randi Acosta



Currently in her second season with Arizona, assistant coach Randi Acosta is no stranger to the GymCats. As a former Arizona Gymnast, Acosta brings an enthusiasm deeply rooted in Arizona pride.

Acosta (formerly Liljenquist), competed at Arizona from 1999-2002, turning in one of the most accomplished careers of any Wildcat gymnast. During her four years of competition, Acosta was a four-time All-Pac-10 gymnast and garnered two All-American awards. Additionally, she was the 2002 Pac-10 champion on the floor exercise and was named the NCAA Regional Gymnast of the Year that same season.

Acosta holds the school record in the all-around with a 39.775, in addition to perfect 10.0 marks on the balance beam and floor exercise (twice). She is the only UA gymnast

to achieve such a score on beam and one of only three in program history to do so in the floor exercise.

Upon graduating from the U of A, Acosta worked at Mystique del Mar as an acrobat, then married Roberto Acosta in 2003. She then went on to work at Desert Devil's as an optional level beam coach and floor choreographer for several years.

With her experience at both the college and club level, Acosta brings a unique perspective to the GymCats' coaching staff.

"Randi not only bleeds red and blue, but is also extremely talented from both an athlete and a coaching perspective," head coach Bill Ryden said, "She is a visual for the girls of a successful alum with a history of a strong eye for detail. Randi is an exceptional addition to our coaching staff."

At Arizona, Acosta is responsible for choreographing routines for both the floor exercise as well as the balance beam, while primarily coaching the beam. Acosta is also a huge player in the marketing and promotions of the team, as well as team attire (competition leotards, warm-ups, etc) and producing custom music for each team member's floor music.

"I love coaching college gymnastics. I can't wait to see each individual who comes through the program succeed, make the best of their careers and be proud of what they've done. I want them to stand out. They work hard and deserve the recognition." Acosta said.

Outside of the gym, Acosta loves spending time with her husband and two daughters Ana Milan and Isabella Sophia.

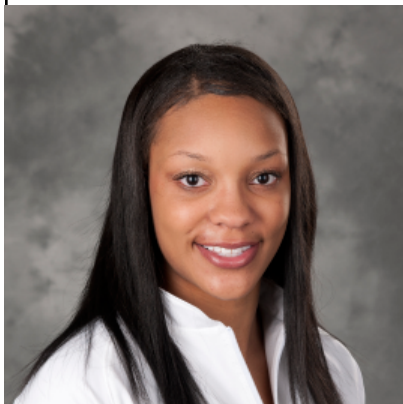

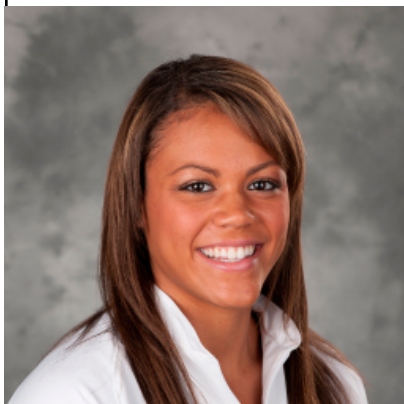

Cats Finish Fourth in Season Opener

The Arizona gymnastics team took fourth overall in the Pac-10 Preview

Jan. 9, 2011

LOS ANGELES, Calif. - The No. 19 Arizona Women's Gymnastics team started the season off strong, finish fourth with a score of 193.825 in the Pac-10 Preview hosted by UCLA. No. 6 Stanford won the meet with a team total of 196.625, followed by No. 1 UCLA with a 195.925 and No. 8 Oregon State with a 195.375. No. 21 Washington took fifth scoring a 193.675, No. 25 Arizona State went sixth with a 191.850, and California earned a 191.675.

"The first meet for this team was really like the final step in our preparation for the season. We know a lot more now about the team than we did a few weeks ago. I'm sure there are a few more lessons that we need to learn, but for the most part I was pretty happy with how we did, and how we are starting out the season," head coach Bill Ryden said.

The Wildcats began on bars totaling a 48.025. Junior Deanna Graham headed the bar squad, with a score of 9.750. Close behind her were juniors Britnie Jones and Katie Matusik and sophomore Aubree Cristello, all with scores of 9.725. Bars also marked the return of junior Rebecca Cardenas, who competed bars after a RS season this past year.

"I thought we started out pretty well. We had a stellar first few sets on bars, and I thought that that they really got the meet going for us. We made a few mistakes, but they are things that are easily fixed, and can really be chalked up to first meet jitters," Ryden said.

Arizona then went on to beam, earning a team score of 47.825. Sophomore Molly Quirk proved to be up to her form from last year, leading the team with a score of 9.850. The Wildcats also debuted two freshman beam sets from Jordan Williams and Shana Sangston.

"We had a little bit of a rough start this season on beam. Molly came out and rocked it like usual, but other than that we learned that we need to improve a little bit on the event," Ryden said. "However, after beam, we came out with determination to not let it affect the rest of our meet, and we went rocked the last two events."

Not only did they rock the last two events, but the Cats proved why they were a force to be reckoned with last year on floor and vault, totaling scores of 49.025 and 48.950 respectively. Once again, Graham led the team on both events, scoring a season high to tie for third with a 9.90 on floor and a 9.875 to tie for first on vault. Aubree Cristello was also a major contributor with a 9.875 on the floor, and a 9.700 on vault. One of the biggest highlights of the second half of the meet, however, was the return of senior Miranda Russell to the events, with twin scores of 9.850. Freshman Jordan Williams debuted on vault as well, posting a score of 9.800.

"This meet was really a 'welcome back Miranda Russell' meet. She was a little disappointed after her performance on bars, but she really came out with a bang on floor and vault. She competed amazingly well, and I couldn't be happier or more proud that she is back and competing on these two events," Ryden said. "I'm just astounded that she performed this well after a struggle of two years and two knee injuries."

The Wildcats had two all-around competitors this meet, Deanna Graham who earned a 38.725 and Aubree Cristello with a 38.775.

From here the Cats head to Logan, Utah to take on Utah State on January 14.

Cats Fall to BYU, but Defeat Utah State

The Arizona women's gymnastics team took second place in their first tri-meet of the season

Jan. 14, 2011

LOGAN, Utah - The No. 18 Arizona Wildcats come in second place in their second meet of the season. The team scored a total of 192.750, ahead of Utah State with a 192.000, but behind BYU who posted a 193.075.

"We had a couple of issues with the lineup this week. However, despite missing some of our regulars, I was very proud with everyone's performance. Though our overall score was a little lower this week, I think that everyone stepped up and competed fairly well," head coach Bill Ryden said. "Of the entire team, I am most happy with the people who were thrown into the mix, including Becca being thrown into floor, and Shana can go out and perform on two events when we need her."

Arizona had a pretty successful bar rotation, posting a total of 48.500 - their second highest event score of the meet. Senior Miranda Russell was back in form for the Cats this week, leading the team with a 9.850 to tie for first place. Not far behind her was sophomore Molly Quirk, who performed on the event for the first time of the season, earning a career high 9.775 to take third overall with the second highest score of the evening.

"Last week we had to count a fall, and this week we didn't. We had to substitute Molly Quirk, who didn't compete last week, and look what she came out and did! It's like she's making a statement that she doesn't want to be taken out. Good for her - I think we may need to make some other changes to the lineup if this continues to happen," Ryden said. "Another bright spot was Britnie Jones, who did an amazing bar routine, and then just had a little mistake on the end. I can see huge things coming from her in the next few meets as well."

Beam was a little shaky for the Cats this week, with the team posting a score of 47.850. Despite a few lower scores, however, this bettered the team score 0.25 from last week's meet. Stars for the Cats included Graham, who took second overall with a score of 9.750, and junior Katie Matusik with a 9.700. Freshman Shana Sangston was the third highest scorer for the Wildcats with a score of 9.625.

On floor, the Wildcats earned a total of 47.650. Russell again led the team with a score of 9.675. Also with a 9.675 was junior Rebecca Cardenas in her first meet on the event in two years.

"Becca's biggest deduction was in her dance - she hit her tumbling and I was very proud of her and her routine this week. Obviously the dance is something that is easily fixed, so I can see big, big things coming from her in the future in this season," Ryden said.

Vault was the team's strongest event of the night, earning a total of 48.725. Sophomore Mykle Douglas posted a new high of 9.825 in her second career performance on the event to tie for first place with Deanna Graham and Utah State's Lyndsie Boone. Freshman Jordan Williams proved herself again this week, earning the third highest score for the Wildcats with a 9.775.

"Mykle drilled that vault. Her eyes were as big as half dollars when she landed. That's her highest score in an Arizona leo, and I couldn't be more excited with how she performed," Ryden said.

"We had some bright spots, but this meet felt like we were tripping over our own feet. It was just mental errors tonight, so it's something we can rebound from," Ryden said. "I'm just glad that we are getting our jitters out now instead of later in the season."

Gymcats Extinguish Sun Devils

The Arizona women's gymnastics team topped ASU in their first home meet of the season

Jan. 21, 2011

TUCSON, Ariz. – The Arizona Women's Gymnastics team fought hard to top Arizona State 193.625 to 192.050. The team earned a point for the State Farm Territorial Cup, tying the score 3-3 between the two teams.

"We're excited to do our part for the territorial cup and win the meet – that was great. You know, we went through so much drama throughout the last two weeks, and I am so proud of Deanna and Aubree. Overall the team really fought. It's been this way for a while, but I'm so proud that I have this team that never gives up," head coach Bill Ryden said.

The win was not an easy one for the Cats, who began the meet on vault earning a score of 47.975. This put them behind the Devils 0.625 after the first event. Once again, junior Deanna Graham led the team with a score of 9.850. Other notable scores came from freshman Jordan Williams, with a score of 9.750 and Molly Quirk who began the lineup with a score of 9.625.

"Vault was uncharacteristically rough; I can't even remember the last time we scored a 47 on vault. I don't know if it was nerves, or excitement but this is something that won't happen again," Head Coach Bill Ryden said. "But, I think that this was our motivation to really kick it into gear for the rest of the meet."

The Wildcats definitely did kick it into gear on the next event, earning a season high bar score of 48.850. First up for Arizona was junior Katie Matusik, who started the team off with a solid score of 9.775. Junior Britnie Jones continued the momentum with a score of 9.800. Quirk continued her streak from last meet, tying her career high of 9.775. The highlight of bars, however, was senior Miranda Russell. Russell performed a flawless routine to post a new career high score of 9.90, enabling the Cats to tie the score after event number two.

"I was very, very proud of the bar team. We've been working on Miranda's bars for five years, and she finally put it down at the right time," Ryden said. "Becca had a very pristine routine too, but missed a few handstands, and Deanna's set was strong but also had some minor mistakes. In general though, I thought that bars went very smoothly."

Beam was a strong event for the Wildcats as well, with the team posting a season high score of 48.800. All of the counted routines were stone cold solid, with sophomore Aubree Cristello earning a 9.750, Jordan Williams with a new career high of 9.725, Deanna Graham tying her career high of 9.850, Katie Matusik with a 9.800 and Molly Quirk rounding out the event with a 9.625. After the third rotation the Cats were ahead of the Sun Devils by 0.375.

"Although you don't want to do it again, it's kind of an adrenaline rush to miss the first beam set and then hit the last five as well as we did," Ryden said. "As soon as the last of the five routines land, you're like, 'yes!,' and that's what we did tonight. I was so impressed with our beam team tonight."

There were a few hiccups on floor, but Arizona was able to total a 48.000. Aubree Cristello led the team with a score of 9.800, and sophomores Mykle Douglas and Molly Quirk were not far behind with twin scores of 9.700.

"From a purely gymnastics standpoint, we have a long way to go. This was by far our best beam and bars of the year but our traditionally strong events of vault and floor are giving us some trouble that we need to address," Ryden said. "From here we just need to buckle down and perform the way we know how."

Cats Take Down Broncos

The Arizona women's gymnastics team earned a win over Boise State

Jan. 28, 2011

TUCSON, Ariz. - The Arizona Women's Gymnastics team earned first place over the Boise State Broncos. U of A posted a season high score of 195.375, while BSU earned a 194.400.

"This meet wasn't perfect, but it was by far our strongest performance of the year. This type of meet is what we expect of ourselves, so it was nice to actually compete up to our abilities," head coach Bill Ryden said. "We still left a lot of tenths out on the floor, there is no doubt about that, but overall I think this shows everyone what we are capable of."

The Cats started the night out on vault, as per Olympic order. Led by senior Miranda Russell and sophomore Aubree Cristello, with twin scores of 9.825 and a tie for second place, the team totaled a 48.825 on the event. Other contributors included sophomore Mykle Douglas with a 9.75, freshman Shana Sangston with a new career high score of 9.725, and sophomore Molly Quirk with a 9.775.

Upon the completion of the event, the Wildcats were in the lead of Boise State by a mere 0.275.

"Vault obviously was great, especially considering that two of our top vaults weren't there. If you can almost hit a 49 without Jordan and Deanna - that's really saying something about the depth and talent we have on the event," Ryden said.

Arizona then rotated to Bars, where they posted a team total of 48.775. The Wildcats went one, two, three on the event; Russell led the event again this week with a score of 9.850, junior Deanna Graham was close behind with a 9.800, and Quirk tied her career high with a 9.775. Cristello was strong on the event as well, posting a 9.725.

"Bars was great - seven for seven. It was also great to have Aubree back in on the event, and that was Deanna's best bar performance of her career. We've been waiting to see that performance, and it was stellar," Ryden said. "Then we have Miranda. Miranda is just Miranda, she always has beautiful bars."

After event number two Arizona was holding onto the lead by 0.075.

"I was excited that we had had two good events, and I knew how good Boise State was. As with any good team, you know you can't give in. We knew we had to put the pressure on, and really go for it in the last two events," Ryden said.

The Cats continued with the strong effort, scoring a 48.775. Katie Matusik led the event, tying for first with a score of 9.850.

"Katie has been doing incredible beam for us for three years now. We are now seeing the product of a lot of fine tuning; she feels really good, she can score, and she proved tonight how strong her beam is," Ryden said.

Sangston shone on the beam as well, staying steady and posting a career high of 9.775.

"Shana really had a great week at practice; she was intent and focused on making sure that she did the gymnastics that we expected of her. She was able to make it happen in the meet, and I think she did a great job this week," Ryden said.

Other notable beam performances were had by freshman Jordan Williams with a 9.725, and Graham and Quirk both scoring 9.700. These scores enabled the Cats to pull ahead by two tenths.

The Cats turned up the heat in the fourth rotation, coming back into their past form with a total of 49.050. Arizona took the podium on floor as well, with Russell taking first with a 9.850, Graham in second with a 9.825, and junior Rebecca Cardenas and Cristello tying for third with a 9.800. Quirk contributed as well with a 9.775.

"We take a lot of pride in our floor rotation, and the last two weeks were not very characteristic of our abilities. When we rotated to floor, our attitude was not anything to do with winning the meet, we just wanted to hit floor. When we talked about floor before the event, we decided that we needed to rock McKale and show people what we could do," Ryden said. "The fact that it helped us win the meet was great, but I was happier with how we showed people how to actually view Arizona floor."

Arizona had three all-around competitors this week. Cristello took second place overall with a 39.025, followed by Quirk with a 38.950, and Graham posting a 38.350.

"Our three all-arounders were back for the first time this year. They are all first team all-conference for a reason. Deanna's vault aside, they all had really good meets. These three girls are half of our scoring, so they obviously did a great job," Ryden said.

"We expect to be better than this, but it is nice that we finally got a score that is indicative of where we should be. We feel like this type of score should be our average, so it's good to get back on track," Ryden said.

Cats Put Out Flames

The Arizona women's gymnastics team beat the University of Illinois-Chicago in a record setting meet

Feb. 4 2011

TUCSON, Ariz. - The Arizona Women's Gymnastics team shone in their pink leotards, posting a season high score of 195.400 to top the University of Illinois-Chicago Flames (193.450).

The Cats began the night on vault, starting the meet with a strong season high score of 49.025. Sophomore Molly Quirk started out the lineup for the team, earning a 9.700. From there the scores went up consistently, with freshman Shana Sangston tying her career high of 9.725 with the third highest score in the meet, sophomore Mykle Douglas and senior Miranda Russell both posting scores of 9.800 to tie for second place, and sophomore Aubree Cristello and junior Deanna Graham both earning 9.850's, tying for first place overall.

"Vault had its own issues, we didn't end up competing the lineup we originally intended, pulling Jordan and Molly. After all of that, I was very impressed with how the team came together and the vault effort as a whole. The team did a great job of flowing through it and rolling with the punches, and came out with a fantastic score," head coach Bill Ryden said.

The Wildcats took this momentum and swung with it, earning a season high bars score of 49.300 - just 0.025 off of the tenth highest score of Arizona history on the event.

"We've always felt like we've had bar talent, and we're getting better; tonight was really on. Every girl really stepped up, and bars was fun. It was a great night for landings and all of the little things and it really made bars an enjoyable event," Ryden said.

Junior Katie Matusik was a solid starter for the team, earning a career high score of 9.775. The highs just kept on coming after that, with junior Britnie Jones posting a season high 9.825, Cristello with a career high 9.875, Quirk with a career high 9.875, and Graham with a career high 9.850. Russell completed the lineup with a solid 9.875, sticking her routine and closing out one of the best Arizona bar performances in several years. Cristello, Quirk, and Russell tied for first with their bar scores, while Graham earned the second place spot. Jones joined the podium as well, taking third.

"As a group all of these girls have been working on all of the little details to make their routines better. It's hard to even separate out who had the best performance; the girls came out strong, and hungry and I was impressed with how it all came together tonight," Ryden said.

The Cats had a little bit of an off night on the beam, totaling a team score of 48.350. Despite the lower team score however, there were still a number of highlights, including Matusik earning a new career high score of 9.900 and winning the event.

"To score like this has been a personal goal of Katie's for a long time. Now that we've finished tweaking her routine you can tell that she's confident, and her routine is no longer a routine. It is a performance," Ryden said.

Other highlights included sophomore Ellen Pitluck's home debut on the event, earning a solid 9.775 - three tenths higher than her previous career high on beam, and enabling her to tie for second place with Cristello.

"It is unfortunate that we had to count a fall on beam after such a strong first half of the meet. On a positive note though, Ellen wasn't even scheduled to compete tonight and when we were five minutes into the beam warmup we threw her into the lineup," Ryden said. "I'm proud that she was able to rise to the occasion and compete so well, especially after only expecting to watch tonight."

It seemed as though Cristello piggy-backed off of Matusik's beam success, posting the second score of 9.90 of the meet for a career high on floor to take second place.

"Aubree's tumbling is so difficult; she's just a great floor performer. Every routine of hers gets better and better," Ryden said.

Graham took third place, with a score of 9.775.

The highlight of floor, however, was Russell, who earned the meet high score as well as a career high floor score of 9.925 on floor, enabling the team to total a score of 48.725 on the event.

"I'm just so proud of this kid. Miranda's coming back off of two knee injuries, and look at her vault and floor. She's really having a good time, and she's having a great senior season," Ryden said.

The team had two all-around competitors; Graham and Cristello. Graham posted a 38.750, while Cristello earned a career high 39.400 to earn a spot in the Arizona All-Time Top Performances.

"Aubree has one of the more difficult floor routines in the country, her bars has improved, and her vault is huge," Ryden said. "Aubree Cristello is money. Even better, she's consistent, and tonight exemplified that."

"I think we answered the question if we could score a 196; we counted two falls and were able to score a 195.400. We can't continue to do that though; we need to hit routines. The good thing is that we are still young, and we still have two months left in season to make it happen. It shows that we've grown, but it also shows that we still need to grow some more," Ryden said.

Cats Overtake NC State and William and Mary The Arizona women's gymnastics team took first with a new season team high

Feb. 12, 2011

RALEIGH, North Carolina - The Arizona Women's Gymnastics team earned a victory with a new team high of 195.550. North Carolina took second with a score of 194.250, and William and Mary earned third with a 187.575.

"I am incredibly proud of the team on how hard they fought; we were not totally on our game other than bars. We weren't quite nailing, and every routine we were gritting our teeth but they never gave up," head coach Bill Ryden said. "We went 23 for 24, no fall routines. Were they hit? No. But overall I was really proud of the girls."

The team started the meet off with a bang on bars, earning a score of 49.150. This score was the highest team bar score of the night.

"I never really guessed that bars would be so high scoring — I knew we had great competitors, and they are all veterans but the squad is proving that they aren't afraid to compete against anyone," Ryden said. "To get that kind of a score first event it shows that they are competing very composed and very aggressive. I'm very pleased."

Sophomore Aubree Cristello and junior Deanna Graham tied for second place with a score of 9.850, and junior Britnie Jones tied for third with a score of 9.800.

The highlight of the event, however, was senior Miranda Russell, who tied her career high to tie for first in the meet with a score of 9.90. This is Russell's third score of 9.90 or better this season so far.

"Miranda drilled her routine; she dropped that dismount and just stood there. She stuck cold, and it was a great set. She is just in a groove. She is a really great bar worker, and this routine really suits her - she's making the most of it," Ryden said.

The Cats then rotated to beam, posting the highest team score on the event of the night with a 48.625. Arizona dominated the podium, with Cristello tying for first with a 9.750, sophomore Ellen Pitluck, Graham, and junior Katie Matusik tying for second with scores of 9.725, and freshman Shana Sangston placing third with a 9.700.

"Every week the newcomers are becoming more seasoned, and this is the first time I've ever put Ellen in the lineup as a 'normal' person. Molly is still ill, and we had some balance checks but overall I was pleased with the fight on the team on beam," Ryden said.

From there, the Wildcats rotated to floor, where they posted a team score of 48.925. Contributors included Russell, who tied for first place with a score of 9.850, Graham who tied for second with a 9.825, and junior Rebecca Cardenas who took third with a score of 9.775. Sophomore Molly Quirk posted a 9.750, and Matusik earned a 9.725.

"My favorite floor routine of the night was Becca. She came out strong after last week, but she got air on all of her passes, and she really started the team out strong," Ryden said. "Despite not feeling well Molly pulled out a pretty solid routine, but our floor wasn't really living up to the setup. Deanna and Miranda nailed nice sets to finish us up, but having to count some rougher floor routines kept us from our potential tonight."

Arizona finished up the meet on vault, earning the night's top team score with a 48.850. Graham took first overall with a 9.850, and Cristello placed second with a 9.825. Other top scores for the Cats included sophomore Mykle Douglas with a 9.750, Quirk with a 9.725, and Russell with a 9.700.

"I called the team over before we began vault because we really needed a complete meet on the road. We didn't do our absolute best vaulting, but it was nice that we had the victory on the event."

The Wildcats had three all-around competitors. Graham earned her first score above a 39.00 for the season, taking first overall with a 39.250. Quirk took third with a 38.900, and Cristello earned a score of 38.650.

"Admittedly Deanna has had a rougher time this season than normal, but she came into this meet completely focused and she came out and really showed she is on her way back to her true form; good for her for finally getting that monkey off of her back," Ryden said.

"This meet wasn't necessarily a showcase of our best gymnastics, but it definitely was an example of how tough we can compete," Ryden said.

Wildcats Fall to the Cardinal

The No. 24 Arizona women's gymnastics team took second to No. 4 Stanford

Feb. 18, 2011

TUCSON, Ariz. - The McKale Center hosted a season high crowd of 1,490 to watch the Pac-10 duel between Arizona and Stanford. After a tough competition, the Wildcat Gymnastics team fell to the Cardinal 194.675 to 195.300.

"We just weren't sharp enough. It wasn't about our gymnastics by any stretch - we just weren't sharp on the fine details and we kept letting little tenths get to us that we haven't had to deal with in the last few weeks," head coach Bill Ryden said. "It was a little bit frustrating."

The Wildcats started the night out on vault, led by sophomore Aubree Cristello who posted the team high score of 9.825 to tie for second place. Behind her was junior Deanna Graham with a score of 9.800, tying for third place. Also in third with another score of 9.800 and tying her career high was sophomore Mykle Douglas. Senior Miranda Russell and sophomore Molly Quirk posted scores of 9.775 and 9.700 respectively to round out the team total 48.900.

"I thought our vault was actually pretty good - especially considering I changed the lineup immediately after warm-up. All things considered I was happy with the start, and was proud of the girls' ability to make adjustments and go with the flow," Ryden said.

Vault also served as a career debut for freshman Barbara Donaldson, who competed second in the lineup and posted a score of 9.675.

"I think Babs did a great job. In a way she's a typical freshman; she's still learning the game and I walked up to her and told her she was in and she just agreed and got in line," Ryden said. "It's important to put your best team out there at that moment, and she was it and it worked out."

Heading into bars, the Wildcats trailed the Cardinal by 0.200.

On bars, Arizona totaled a score of 48.750. Leaders of the team were Quirk and Russell, with twin scores of 9.800 to tie for third place. Directly behind them were junior Katie Matusik and Graham, both posting a score of 9.725. Yet another team tie occurred between junior Britnie Jones and Cristello with a 9.700.

"Bars was solid, not great. We were getting used to those 49 scores but we didn't stick some landings and weren't able to hit some of those finer details tonight," Ryden said.

At the halfway point, Stanford led by 0.65 after posting a vault total of 49.200.

The Cats had some difficulties on beam, posting a 48.025. Matusik led the team with a 9.775 to take third place. Other leaders of the beam squad were Cristello and Quirk, both earning scores of 9.725.

"We counted a fall, and we counted some uncharacteristic wobbles. You add all that up, and you get a 48.025," Ryden said. "This was one of Molly's better routines, and even the score wasn't anything to write home about, I think she made a lot of positive progress with the set. I was very happy with her beam tonight."

Despite a deficit of 1.00 going into the third event, Arizona fought hard on floor, posting a team total of 49.000 and closing the gap to only 0.625. Russell had the team high score of 9.850, taking second place overall. Tying for third place was Cristello and Graham with a score of 9.825. Junior Rebecca Cardenas and Matusik also made an impact, both posting scores of 9.750.

"Considering everything, it's always positive to have your last score be the highest of the meet. It just shows that as a team we are not willing to give up or give in," Ryden said.

The Cats had three all-around competitors this evening; Cristello, Graham, and Quirk. Cristello took the silver, posting a 39.075 behind Stanford's Shelley Alexander with a score of 39.150. Graham took fourth Quirk took fourth with a 38.850, and Graham placed fifth overall with a 38.575.

"I'm glad that we looked good and did pretty well, but we nicked and dined ourselves this meet. Next week will be better," Ryden said.

Cats Defeat Cougars with Season High Beam Total

No. 25 Arizona women's gymnastics team took down the BYU Cougars at Provo

Feb. 26, 2011

PROVO, Utah – After a back and forth battle, the No. 25 Arizona Women's Gymnastics team settled the score against BYU, defeating the Cougars 195.350 to 195.150 thanks to a stellar beam total in the fourth rotation.

"We competed hard: we had three good events and one event we wish we could do over, but despite the floor score the girls went out and had the best beam rotation of the season. As far as the heart of the team goes, there is no question," head coach Bill Ryden said. "We proved tonight that we can go 49 on any event at any time, the problem is that we can't go 49 on all four events at the same time which is now our goal."

Arizona started the night with a solid score of 48.925 on bars. Senior Miranda Russell and sophomore Molly Quirk were leaders for the Cats, both scoring a 9.850 to tie for second place on the event.

"Molly has really just developed into a really great bar worker. Both of the 9.850 routines were great, Miranda and Molly had a great night and I was really proud of them," Ryden said.

In third was sophomore Aubree Cristello with a score of 9.800. Other contributors to the total included junior Britnie Jones, with a score of 9.725, and junior Katie Matusik with a 9.700.

"We expect to do pretty solid bars now. The first two sets had some dismount issues, but it is nice when you can have those issues and still put up a pretty decent score. We didn't have our greatest night on bars – I really think that now anytime we don't get a 49 we have things that we can do better."

Despite a strong start, the Wildcats trailed the Cougars by 0.25 after the first event.

Arizona turned up the heat in its second event, totaling a 49.025 to pull the Cats ahead by 0.35 after the second rotation. Arizona held two places on the podium again on vault: Cristello tied for first place with a 9.875, and junior Deanna Graham took second with a solid 9.850.

"Aubree can perform the true technique for her vault, and she just boomed the thing. She drilled it, and it was gorgeous. She does a very technically correct vault, and when you add the right height and distance you get a big score, which was what happened tonight," Ryden said.

Also adding to the vault score, sophomore Mykle Douglas and Russell both earned scores of 9.775, and freshman Jordan Williams posted a score of 9.700.

"We had some issues; some of our vaults have some landing deductions that we know we need to fix. In all though, the fact that we can still have a few lower vaults than what we wanted and still go 49 – that's a great thing," Ryden said.

The third event was led by Matusik with a score of 9.725 (to tie for third place) and contributing to a floor total of 48.200. Directly behind her were Quirk and Graham with twin scores of 9.700, and Cristello with a score of 9.600. Junior Rebecca Cardenas also contributed to the total with a score of 9.475.

"Floor was rough. We had problems landing our tumbling. We kept taking steps and making landing errors. It wasn't just one girl; it seemed to be the entire team. For some reason we needed to be able to adjust to the floor and we couldn't quite do it," Ryden said. "The dance was fine, our performance was fine, but if you are stumbling around on your tumbling it is going to come off of the score."

After floor, Arizona had fallen behind the Cougars 146.45 to 146.15.

The Cats appeared to use the deficit to their advantage, however, buckling down and making the strongest showing on beam yet, scoring a season high score of 49.200.

"The beam team has taken it so personally about some of our recent issues on beam. The girls were really fired up after the third rotation. To see that beam team go out, especially thinking that after floor there was no chance of us winning the meet, to see them do so well was a great thing. I'm very proud of them," Ryden said.

After a strong start from Cristello with a 9.725, the Wildcats had two routines that scored a 9.90 or better. Matusik earned the first place spot with a career high score of 9.925 – her second score of 9.90 or better this season.

"Katie's routine was just gorgeous. I was talking to myself during the routine saying, 'make this be that set, make this be that set where everything just falls into place,' and that's what she did. It was just so fun and I am so proud of her. She earned it; that was a deserved score and it's fun when that happens," Ryden said.

Graham was the second of these scores, posting a new career high of 9.90. This score not only secured her the second place finish, but also expanded her 9.90 circle to a third event. Graham has posted scores of 9.90 on both vault and floor to date.

"This score just shows what a great athlete Deanna is. Deanna is capable of posting 9.90's on every event, and now this is her third event. It shows she is a complete gymnast, and even though she had problems on other events in the meet she kept fighting and ended on a strong note," Ryden said.

Freshman Shana Sangston earned a new career high on the event as well, posting a 9.825 to tie Quirk for third place on the event.

"Shana had a very nice set too. The whole beam team just stepped up. They weren't up there wobbling, they weren't up there doing balance checks, and Shana has really developed into an outstanding beam worker, and a good competitor. I'm very impressed," Ryden said.

Arizona had three all-around competitors this meet: Quirk, Cristello, and Graham. All three competitors went 1,2,3 in the standings; Quirk with a season high score of 39.075, Cristello with a 39.000 and Graham with a 38.875.

"Of the three, Molly did what we expected of her. She had the best performance of the meet, and she deserved to have the highest score. These scores also just go to show you what Aubree and Deanna are capable of, even when they have some issues," Ryden said.

"This score helps us out a lot from an RQS standpoint, but it also shows that we still have a lot of learning to do. Once again we showed that we have the potential to be really, really good, but we just aren't quite there yet," Ryden said.

LOS ANGELES, Calif. – After a rough start, the University of Arizona Women's Gymnastics team rounded out a 194.125 to come in third place at Pauley Pavilion. First place went to the University of Georgia with a 196.175, and second went to the host team UCLA with a 195.750.

"This meet was kind of a slap in the face. The result wasn't the judging, it wasn't equipment, it wasn't lack of fans – we just weren't up to the task today. We ended with a silver lining of a vault score, but the rest of the meet was not up to our potential," head coach Bill Ryden said.

The meet began with bars for the Cats, and a tough rotation ended with a team total of 47.575.

"I don't know what else to say – this was the worst bar performance of the year. It was not what I expected. Deanna and Molly had great practices coming in; I just don't know what happened. We've had problems on these bars before, but I don't understand why this happened," Ryden said. "We're definitely going to be able to go up from here."

The rotation was led by senior Miranda Russell, sophomore Aubree Cristello, and junior Britnie Jones. The girls received scores of 9.775, 9.775, and 9.700 respectively.

"The thing about all three of these girls is that they were all able to overcome issues. The story about bars was about these issues: those who overcame them, and those who didn't," Ryden said. "Britnie was able to rise to the occasion after a tough time in warm up on her dismount, and Aubree had a very hard practice on Friday. It is hard to be in Miranda's position and play clean up when there is almost no hope left for the event, but she was able to do it."

The Cats slowly began to pick up the pieces on the second event, totaling a score of 48.850. For a second week straight junior Katie Matusik was the star for Arizona on the event, earning a team high 9.875 to take third place in the meet.

Freshman Shana Sangston was another main performer on beam, posting a score of 9.800.

"Shana is turning into a very seasoned competitor. I am very proud of her. She is still new to this, and there was so much pressure going into beam after the bar rotation. She continues to impress each week," Ryden said.

Directly behind her was sophomore Molly Quirk with a 9.775, and junior Deanna Graham as well as freshman Jordan Williams with twin scores of 9.700.

"We had already counted two falls, and the first beam set fell. You can only imagine what was going through everyone's mind at that point. Deanna was able to stop the bleeding despite having a bruised foot, and I was so impressed with the girls and how they hung tough throughout the event," Ryden said.

Floor was the Wildcats' third rotation, and after a number of landing deductions the team pulled out a total 48.400.

"We counted a lot of steps and out of bounds deductions and those add up," Ryden said.

Cristello performed fourth in the lineup, but was first for the team and third in the meet with a performance that earned her a score of 9.800.

"I thought Aubree had a good floor set. She was definitely on a mission to make up for last week. The judges were consistently tight on floor, and to get a 9.800 on floor meant you had a pretty solid routine," Ryden said.

Other floor contributions came from junior Rebecca Cardenas with a 9.750, Matusik with a 9.700, Graham with a 9.675, and Russell with a 9.475.

Despite hardships throughout the first three events, Arizona turned up the heat on vault to earn a team total of 49.300. This beat Georgia's team vault score of 49.175, and came second to UCLA's vault total by only 0.025.

The Cats led off with Williams, who posted a career high 9.825. From there the scores continued to rise, with Cristello and Quirk both earning 9.850's, and sophomore Mykle Douglas earning a new career high 9.875. Graham wrapped up the lineup and took second place with yet another score of 9.90.

"This was our best vault performance of the year. After struggling and having a bitter taste in your mouth after the first few events, vault helped us to get rid of a little bit of that sour face," Ryden said.

"Hopefully we can use this meet to springboard into better things starting with the senior meet this coming week," Ryden said. "We can only go up from here, and it is important for Miranda that we as a team show up and compete to our potential."

Wildcats Take Down Cougars, Wildcats and Pioneers

The Arizona women's gymnastics team took first in the last home meet of the season

March 11, 2011

TUCSON, Ariz. - the Arizona Women's Gymnastics team wrapped up the regular season with a season high score of 195.625 to overtake the Cougars, Wildcats, and Pioneers. BYU took second place with a score of 195.300, New Hampshire earned third with a 194.625, and TWU finished up with a 191.475.

"I think that it was really nice to compete well after last week. The fact that we didn't have a good outing last week meant we needed to get back on track with our gymnastics. We certainly did that this meet, I was pleased," head coach Bill Ryden said.

The Cats hit the vault running, with a team total of 49.125. Sophomore Molly Quirk started the team with a solid base score of 9.650, and scores continued to rise from there. Freshman Jordan Williams earned a 9.700, followed by sophomore Mykle Douglas with a 9.750. Sophomore Aubree Cristello drilled her landing for a 9.875 (tying for second).

"We started off well. We weren't doing our best vaults at the beginning; we were landing them, which we have to do, but we just kept getting stronger and stronger as the lineup went on. This was nice to see," Ryden said.

Two new career highs were scored in the end of the lineup by senior Miranda Russell and junior Deanna Graham. Russell posted a 9.875 (tying for second), and Graham posted a 9.925 (tying for first with BYU's Natalie Eyre).

"It was nice to finally see Miranda do a practice vault in the meet. She just boomed that sucker," Ryden said. "I had been teasing Deanna all night about sticking - she is one of the best vaulters in the country, but she always takes a little step to the side. She wanted to stick it to me so badly, and she was so close to nailing that thing. Her vault was pristine."

The momentum continued on bars; the Wildcats posted a score just .01 shy of a 49, totaling a 48.900. Leaders on the event were Graham, Russell, and junior Katie Matusik, all with scores of 9.800 to tie for third place. Other contributors included Quirk, with a 9.775, and Cristello, who earned a 9.725.

"We messed up our first two routines, but the girls didn't give up or panic. Sometimes you just have to fight. The routines weren't easy or perfect, but the girls had fight and I have to give them credit for that," Ryden said.

The Cats had a little bit of trouble on beam, posting a 48.450. Matusik continued to lead the team on the third rotation, this time sharing the spotlight with freshman Shana Sangston. Both girls posted scores of 9.800 to tie for second overall along with BYU's Eyre.

"Shana. What can you say about how she's developed? An unknown walk on who wanted to join the team, would I have expected her to come out as strong as she has? No. Am I extremely proud of her? Yes. She's stepping up in an area where we really need her, and she's making a huge dent," Ryden said.

Directly behind them were Graham and Williams, with a score of 9.750. This marked a new career high for Williams.

"It was quite unexpected, I'm still a little bit shocked about how Aubree and Molly competed. But you have to give it up for the other four girls, we came through and made a decent score out of it," Ryden said.

The Wildcats then went 1,2,3 on floor. Graham placed first with a 9.875, Russell took silver with a 9.850, and Cristello captured the bronze with a 9.825. Both junior Rebecca Cardenas and Quirk earned scores of 9.800, and Matusik contributed with a 9.775.

"We have worked for the last two weeks on cleaning up our landings and our dance. I really felt like tonight showed a lot of the results of that hard work," Ryden said. "We've had more issues on floor this year than I can ever remember, we've been working on those issues harder than ever, and it was nice to see some of that work pay off in our results."

The Cats had three all-around competitors this meet, Graham, Cristello and Quirk. Graham took first overall with a season high 39.350. Cristello posted a 38.625, and Quirk finished out the competition with a 38.575.

"Deanna had a great meet. In reality, Aubree and Molly both went two for four, and still got strong scores. I know that Molly and Aubree will come back with a vengeance for sure, but Deanna was absolutely on fire," Ryden said.

The competition concluded with a highlight of senior Miranda Russell, honoring her achievements throughout her five years as a Wildcat gymnast.

"I am so happy with Miranda's senior year. You always want a senior to hit on her senior meet, she did that. She is making the most of her knee, and our team wouldn't be the same without her," Ryden said.

Wildcats Earn Fifth at Pac-10 Championships

The gymnastics team made a strong showing in Los Angeles to overtake California and ASU

March 19, 2011

LOS ANGELES, Calif. – The Arizona Women's Gymnastics team made a strong showing at the Pac-10 Championships, posting a 195.475 to take fifth place. Oregon State won the meet with a 197.200, UCLA took second with a 196.750, Washington earned third posting a 196.025, and Stanford placed fourth with a 195.975. Rounding out the meet were California (191.575) and Arizona State (190.450).

"We really looked good. Our bobbles cost us two positions in the team results. We would have finished third, except for the floor routines. It just goes to show you what we're capable of, even with those mistakes," head coach Bill Ryden.

After a bye, the Wildcats had a solid start on bars with a 48.850. All of the contributors earned scores of 9.700 or better – much better than Arizona's last performance in Pauley Pavilion.

"I made some drastic changes to the bar lineup due to some issues within the past few weeks. We even warmed up seven people – I had two girls ready to go by the fourth person in the lineup, and I was so proud of how the girls stayed on their feet," Ryden said.

Once again, senior Miranda Russell was the top scorer for the Cats, posting a score of 9.850 to tie for third. Junior Deanna Graham was next for Arizona with a 9.775, followed by juniors Rebecca Cardenas and Britnie Jones, both with 9.750's. Sophomore Aubree Cristello wrapped up the total with a 9.725.

"Miranda did great on bars. She did her job, as well as the rest of the bar team, which was great for all of us," Ryden said.

The team immediately rotated to beam, and used the momentum to post the second highest beam total of the season. Junior Katie Matusik was a star once again for the Wildcats, posting her third score of 9.90 (or better) of her career, and tying for second on the event.

"Katie's beam was spectacular. The routine definitely deserved the score it got. I think that Katie is going to go down as one of the best beam workers to wear an Arizona leotard," Ryden.

Freshman Jordan Williams posted a career high 9.850, and freshman Shana Sangston earned a 9.800. Graham and Cristello both earned a score of 9.750 to wrap up a 49.050 for the Cats.

"Jordan looked amazing. Aubree did another great job starting us off, and Shana was fantastic. Both of our freshmen did great under pressure for the first Pac-10 meet. I couldn't be prouder of our beam team," Ryden said.

Arizona had a little bit of trouble on the third event, earning a 48.375 on floor. Standouts on the event were Cardenas, with a 9.725, and Graham, with a 9.700.

"Molly got hurt on beam so we had to pull her from the meet. Mykle did a great job stepping into that role last minute. She started us off strong, and then Becca did her job. Katie had a pretty solid routine, and then we had some issues with steps, bobbles, and going out of bounds," Ryden said.

The Wildcats made up for floor in the final event, totaling a season high vault score of 49.200. Graham was the team's top scorer of the night, earning a 9.875 to earn third overall. Behind her was sophomore Mykle Douglas, and Russell with twin scores of 9.850. Cristello earned a 9.825, and Williams posted a 9.800.

"Going into vault we were a little ticked off about floor, so we came into the event with a vendetta. Everyone did solid vaults, and it was a fantastic way to finish," Ryden said.

Arizona had two all-around competitors this weekend: Graham and Cristello. Graham, who was coming off of being named Gymnast of the Week, showed her strength once again with a 39.100. Cristello had a solid score as well, totaling a 38.950.

"It was great to get the score we did, it will help our RQS. It's a little bittersweet; we had three phenomenal events, and one that wasn't so great. We're a good complete team, but we are a great team on three events," Ryden said. "Now we can just look forward to finding out about the rest of the post season."

From here, Arizona will wait until Monday, March 21 for final rankings to determine the location of the NCAA Regional Championships.

Gymnastics Takes Fifth at NCAA Regional Championships

The Arizona women's gymnastics team made a strong showing at the Denver Regional

April 2, 2011

DENVER, Colo. - The Arizona Women's Gymnastics team made a strong showing at the 2011 NCAA Regional Championships, earning a total score of 195.400 to take fifth place. In first was Arkansas, with a 196.550, second place went to Florida with a 196.425, and Boise State took third with a 196.400. Denver earned fourth with a 195.625, and Brigham Young University posted a 194.650 to take sixth.

Of the Denver Regional, Arkansas and Florida will be moving forwards to compete at the NCAA National Championships.

"Unfortunately tonight was just an example of what we've been doing all year; three good events and one we wish we could have back. Once again it switched events on us," head coach Bill Ryden said about the overall meet.

The team started the meet on bars, totaling a 48.850. Sophomore Aubree Cristello led the Cats off, posting a score of 9.600. Following her were junior Britnie Jones, with a 9.675, and sophomore Molly Quirk, with a 9.750. Junior Deanna Graham stuck her landing for a 9.775, then senior Miranda Russell earned a 9.850 with a stuck landing, and junior Katie Matusik concluded the event with yet another stuck landing for a score of 9.800 (tying her career high).

"I went into bars with the same mentality as Pac-10's. We warmed up seven people, and I called Katie up at the last minute based on performances before her. How much can you say about a kid who can respond like that? She will do absolutely everything she can to help the team, and that was absolutely the best bar routine of Katie Matusik's career," Ryden said.

Upon the conclusion of the first event, the Wildcats were placed fifth overall. Florida was in the lead with a 49.225 on floor, Boise State took over second with a 49.175 on floor, and BYU was in third with a 48.950 on vault. The Razorbacks started the meet off in fourth place with a 48.900 on beam, and Denver rounded out the teams with a score of 48.725 on bars.

The Wildcats slipped to sixth after event number two, earning a 48.350 on beam. Matusik led the team for yet another week, posting the top team score of 9.875. Quirk took the second place spot for Arizona with a 9.800. Freshmen Shana Sangston and Jordan Williams posted scores of 9.750 and 9.700 respectively, and Graham contributed by earning a 9.225 despite a fall.

"It was a very unfortunate start to beam; you really need to start off strong, and having to routines fall off the bat makes you really wonder about what is going to happen. I will give Shana and Jordan all the credit in the world for pulling it back around and keeping it together," Ryden said. "Molly had a lot to prove, and she did a very nice job. Once again, Katie Matusik - not enough words to describe that girl and her heart."

Floor was an entirely different story, enabling Arizona to pull ahead one spot in the rankings. The Cats started off with junior Rebecca Cardenas, who earned a solid starting score of 9.725. Matusik then posted her career high score of 9.800.

"Katie had a career night. She was on her game; she looked great, and she's been training great. On a four judge panel, in a meet where they won't give you an inch, Katie did it. No matter how I change up the order, Katie will look at me with the biggest smile in the world and say, 'I'll do it. I'll do whatever.' I can't tell you what that means to me," Ryden said.

Other contributors included Cristello, with a 9.850, and Russell and Graham who earned twin 9.875 to tie for third in the meet overall.

"We've all been feeling the heat, coaches and gymnasts alike, as far as making floor is concerned. It was nice to be able to sort of redeem ourselves on that event after what has been going on this season," Ryden said.

Going into the final rotation, Florida held tight to first with a total 148.000, Arkansas and Boise State tied for second with a 147.375, Denver earned fourth with a 146.325, and Boise State slipped to sixth with a 145.800.

In the final event, the Wildcats posted a 49.075 to solidify their finish in fifth place. Sangston began the lineup, posting a new career high 9.750. From there the scores stayed consistently strong, with Williams, Douglas, and Cristello all posting scores of 9.800. Russell then earned a 9.825, and Graham posted a 9.850 to tie for third place.

"Our goal was to try to match our Pac-10 score after beam, so after floor came through, we knew we needed to vault to try to get there. The girls were pumped, they rose to the occasion. When you are talking a four judge panel, it is exciting to be able to vault that well," Ryden said.

Arizona had two all-around competitors tonight: Graham and Cristello. Cristello posted a total all-around score of 38.375, and Graham earned a 38.725.

"When I talked to the team at the half way point, we decided we wanted to leave the people of Denver with a positive view of Arizona. The fact that we were able to leave with two back-to-back 49's - that's pretty good," Ryden said.

"By far, the highlights of the meet were Miranda and Katie. For Miranda, for her to be so happy and so satisfied in her last meet is rewarding. I am certainly going to miss her," Ryden said. "Both of those girls showed such heart."
