Postgame Notes

- Arizona won its seventh game of the season for the third-straight year to ensure a winning season.
- The Wildcats gained 288 rushing yards on 47 attempts (6.1 yards per carry). It was the second-highest rushing total of the season (353 in opener vs. UNLV) and also the second-highest per carry average (7.4 also vs. UNLV).
- Arizona produced a pair of 100-yard rushers (Nick Wilson, 21-153; Anu Solomon, 12-115) for the second time this season. Wilson teamed with Terris Jones-Grigsby in 100-yard rushing outputs in the season opener against UNLV on Aug. 29.
- Solomon established a new career high with 115 net rushing yards (previous high: 60 vs. Nevada, Sept. 13, 2014).
- The last time a UA quarterback reached the century mark in rushing yards was B.J. Denker, who had 102 yards on 14 totes against Oregon on Nov. 23, 2013.
- Arizona's first points of the game came when nickel back Anthony Lopez register his first career sack and forced a fumble, which was scooped upTra'Mayne Bondurant for a 22-yard touchdown. It marked Arizona's first defensive touchdown of the season.
- For Bondurant, it was his fourth career defensive touchdown (previous three were via interception).
- David Richards' second-quarter receiving touchdown was his first of the season. Richards is the 10th Wildcat to haul in a receiving touchdown this season.
- Samajie Grant hauled in a pair of touchdown receptions for his first career multitouchdown performance.
- Austin Hill (3-46) caught a pass for the 26th-straight game that he has played.
- Arizona's defense forced three turnovers in the first half more than any single game this year. The Cats had forced two in four of the previous five contests.
- The defense finished with four turnovers gained for the first time since forcing five against USC on Oct. 27, 2012.
- The Wildcats converted each turnover into a touchdown for 28 points. UA entered the game with a 31-3 advantage in points off turnovers for the entire season.
- Quarterback Anu Solomon threw a touchdown pass for the ninth-consecutive game to begin his career.
- Reserve cornerback Devin Holliday intercepted his second career pass and first since his collegiate debut against NAU on Aug. 30, 2013.
- Senior safety Jourdon Grandon picked off his first pass of the season (fifth of career).
- Linebacker Scooby Wright, a semifinalist for the Lombardi and Nagurski awards, recorded 10 tackles, 2.0 for loss and 1.0 sack. Wright now has 107 tackles, 20.5 tackles for loss and 13.0 sacks to go with five forced fumbles.
- For Wright, it was his sixth-straight game with a sack. The sophomore has at least one tackle for loss in all nine games this season.
- Colorado entered the game leading the nation with 245 first downs. UA's defense held the Buffaloes to a season-low 19 tonight.
- The Cats held the Buffs to 353 yards of total offense the lowest output all season. Colorado had gained in 400 or more yards in eight-consecutive games.
