2002 Season Preview

Merely describing the 2002 University of Arizona women's soccer team as "young" would be a vast understatement. This year's Wildcat roster sports a total of 19 freshmen and sophomores, as opposed to only five juniors and seniors. To top it all off, fewer than half of the 24 players have even seen action in an Arizona uniform.

Head coach **Cathy Klein** could have her hands full, to say the least.

"This is the most talent that we've ever put together. It's also the youngest team we've had, in terms of brand-new players and first-year newcomers," said Klein, who is entering the third year of her quest to turn the Wildcat soccer program around. "Our returnees must step up and lead this team in the first few games. Our new people have to come in fit, acclimate quickly and play hard from the very first practice."

The Cats return 10 letterwinners, including seven starters, from last season's 5-12-1 team. Included in that total are the year's top four scorers, who accounted for 74% of the offense on a squad that set a new school record for single season scoring.

Adding to that mix will be a pair of redshirt freshmen, 10 true freshmen and two transfers. There will certainly be plenty of new faces on the field for the Wildcats this year, but this could be the season that changes everything.

"We are solid all over the field. We are deep in the forward position, we are fast in the flank positions, we're athletic in the goal," said Klein. "We just need experience and the time to mature as a team. We are only going to get better."

"There are going to be some peaks and valleys in the road this year. I feel certain that, with time, this group is going to be the first to take us to the NCAA tournament. It might not be this year, but this group has the tools, work ethic and character to get us there."

Up Front

Headlining the list of returnees along the frontline will be sophomore **Candice Wilks**, who finished last season as the Cats' top scorer with eight goals and three assists (19 points). She was an honorable mention All-Pac-10 selection and was named the UA's co-Newcomer of the

Year.

Complementing Wilks will be junior **Liz Bartlett**, the team's fourth-leading scorer in 2001 with five goals and one assist (11 points). Already tied for fifth on the UA's all-time scoring list, the versatile Bartlett could also see time as a defender.

Redshirt freshman **Kelly Nelson** sat out last year after an ACL tear and has the talent to push for a starting job up front this season.

A true freshman from Yorba Linda, Calif., **Erin Clewett** could also press for a starting position. A two-time All-Orange County and three-time All-CIF Southern Section choice while playing at Esperanza High School, Clewett finished her career with school records of 46 goals and 123 career points.

Two other true freshmen, **Maggie MacCool** and **Mallory Miller**, could split time between the frontline and midfield. MacCool is from Sammamish, Wash., and was the 2001 3A KingCo Player of the Year at Skyline High School. Miller was a three-time All-Arizona honoree at Tucson's Salpointe Catholic High School.

In the Midfield

The midfield is the one area where the Cats are loaded again this year. It will also boast the most versatile players, as many of the midfielders are also slated for action at forward or defender.

One of only two seniors on this year's team, **Naomi Chu** could be looking at a starting job in the midfield, but she's also expected to see some time on defense. A starter in 40 of her career's 45 matches to date, Chu is considered the hardest-working returnee on this Wildcat squad.

Transferring to the UA from a nationally ranked Nebraska program, junior **Lindsey Greenwood** is an anticipated starter in the midfield or possibly up front.

In her two seasons with the Huskers, she tallied six goals and seven assists (19 points) and played in back-to-back NCAA tournaments.

Redshirt freshman **Courtney Moseley**, another ACL victim last season, is also a potential starter in central midfield or central defense. She too is back at 100% and was considered the team's best player by the final week of spring action.

A pair of freshmen, **Althea Jones** and **Lisa Kosena**, could push for major minutes on the flanks or up front. The first-ever Wildcat signee from Canada, Jones is from Pickering, Ontario, where she played for St. Mary Catholic Secondary School and the Pickering Power club team.

Kosena, from Englewood, Colo., could play anywhere in the midfield or up front. She was an honorable mention All-Colo-rado selection while playing at Cherry Creek H.S.

Fellow freshman **Jennifer Klein** will play an integral role in central midfield or central defense. A four-year starter at Prescott (Ariz.) High School, Klein was a two-time All-Arizona and All-Desert Sky Region honoree. She was also an All-American in cross country.

Yet another freshman, **Nikki David**, is expected to see plenty of playing time this year in the midfield or the back. Coming from Manhattan Beach, Calif., David was a first team All-Bay League choice at Mira Costa High School.

Also a freshman, **Traci Adler** will provide added depth in the midfield. A native of Van Nuys, Calif., she was a three-time All-Mission League selection while playing at Notre Dame High School. She could see action up front, as well as in the midfield.

In the Backfield

The Cats have more experience in the backfield than at any other position this year. Anchoring the UA defense this season will be sophomore **Lindsey Peeples**, who was one of three freshmen to start all 18 matches last year. She helped the 2001 Wildcat defense hold opponents to their lowest goal total in four years.

Another veteran is senior **Tymarie Novak**, who became an immediate starter last season after transferring from Cypress

(Calif.) College. Notching one goal and 16 shots last year, Novak can play anywhere on the field for the Cats, although she expected to be a defensive mainstay this year.

After starting all 18 matches in 2001 at either midfield or up front, sophomore **Vanessa Bailey** has been moved to the backfield, where the Cats can most use her speed and athleticism. Bailey was second on the team in scoring last year, tallying six goals and five assists (17 points). She scored or assisted at least one goal in 10 of the season's 18 games.

Sophomore **Cassie Daniels** had also been slated for a move to the backfield from the frontline this year, but she will be redshirting for the season after suffering an ACL tear during the final game of spring play. Daniels played in 17 games, starting all but one and racking up four goals and four assists (12 points).

Junior **Samantha Bartlett** will see action this year at central defense or central midfield. She played in nine matches last year, tallying seven shots and one assist.

Sophomore **Courtney Russell** adds still more experience to the backfield. She started 11 of the 15 matches she played in last year, registering one shot while seeing most of her action on defense.

Another sophomore, **Heather Nelson** subbed-in for four matches in the backfield last year but will be redshirting this season after suffering an ACL tear at the beginning of the summer.

Freshman **Shannon Pidd**, a Tucson native, is the only newcomer slated to spend most of her time in the backfield. While playing at Catalina Foothills High School, Pidd was a two-time All-Arizona selection and a three-time All-Southern Arizona choice.

In the Goal

With the graduation of two-year starter Shannon Monti, the starting goalkeeper spot is completely up for grabs by either of two incoming freshmen this year.

A transfer from UC Riverside, freshman **Natalie Juarez** earned a medical redshirt year in 2001 after breaking her leg during game action early in the season. She played in three matches for the Anteaters,

starting one, and registered totals of 120 minutes, five saves and one goal allowed.

True freshman **Amanda Martin** earned All-Tennessee, All-Middle Tennessee and All-District II AAA laurels while playing for Franklin (Tenn.) High School. She was District II Defensive MVP twice and played for the Lady Express club team out of Brentwood, Tenn.

"We're going to be very young in the goal this year. We have two freshmen coming in, and they will compete head-to-head for that starting role," said Klein. "Initially, we thought Amanda would be the starter, and she did all the right things in terms of aiding her development and making herself better this summer. She made

immense sacrifices to train at the highest level.

"However Natalie, being a transfer, has already had that first year of adjusting to collegiate athletics, so she has that advantage over Amanda. Amanda is a vocal, athletic, agile kind of goalkeeper, and Natalie has a no-nonsense approach to keeping the ball out of the net. I'm as curious as anybody to see who starts."

The Schedule

Ten home dates, including two tournaments, highlight the 2002 Arizona schedule. Of the 20 teams featured on this year's slate, eight competed in last season's NCAA tournament and six were either nationally ranked or receiving votes at the end of the 2001 season.

After a home exhibition against UTEP on Aug. 22, the Wildcats will officially kick off the 2002 season on Friday, Aug. 30, and Sunday, Sept. 1, playing host to Cal Poly, Detroit and Drake for the Wildcat Invitational. Cal Poly will open the tournament against Detroit in the first game on Friday, followed by the match between Arizona and Drake. On Saturday, Drake and Detroit face-off first, with the Arizona-Cal Poly match following.

The following weekend, Cathy Klein heads back to Ames, Iowa, to take part in the Iowa State Tournament on Friday, Sept. 6, and Sunday, Sept. 8. The Wildcats will take on Wisconsin in the first game on Sept. 6, then they face Northern Iowa in Sunday's action.

Three of the Cats' next four games will be on the road, as they are scheduled to

play at Oklahoma on Sept. 15, at home against San Diego on Sept. 22, then at Belmont (Sept. 27) and at Kentucky (Sept. 29). Arizona returns to Tucson for its second home tournament of the season, the Arizona Tournament, on Friday, Oct. 4, and Sunday, Oct. 6. Saint Louis, Idaho State and Youngstown State will visit the Old Pueblo for the tourney action.

"With their signing classes, Arizona State, UCLA, USC, Washington, Cal and Stanford are pretty much a lock for this year's NCAA tournament," said Klein. "I know that Washington State and Oregon State have made great strides with their recruiting, so there could be eight Pac-10 teams in the NCAA tournament. From what I can tell, it looks like we've made that jump as a conference."

Pac-10 play begins on Friday, Oct. 11, for the Wildcats as they head up to Tempe to take on rival Arizona State. A home weekend against UCLA (Oct. 18) and USC (Oct. 20) follows, then the UA goes north to play at Oregon (Oct. 25) and Oregon State (Oct. 27).

Arizona's final two home matches of the 2002 season will be against Washington (Nov. 1) and Washington State (Nov. 3). The Cats will end regular season action in the Bay Area, playing at California on Nov. 8 and at Stanford on Nov. 10.

"You have to win five games in the Pac-10 to be competitive, but five wins in this conference could get you into the NCAA tournament," said Klein. "There is no way any team in the Pac-10 can run the table this year. The conference is just too good now. There's no question that the Pac-10 is the best women's soccer conference in the nation, top to bottom."

In her third season as the head coach of the University of Arizona women's soccer team, Cathy Klein continues her quest to transform the Wildcat program into a nationally prominent powerhouse. The steps may seem slow, but the improvements have been obvious.

Over the six seasons prior to Klein's arrival, the Wildcat program earned a combined total of three Pac-10 victories. Last year alone, Klein guided the Cats to a 2-7-0 conference mark, the most conference wins for a UA team in four seasons. The 2001 team also set or tied 23 school records, including most goals in a season (30), most assists in a season (20), most total points (80) and most corner kicks (87).

During her brief time at Arizona, Klein has already produced three honorable mention All-Pac-10 selections, two second team Academic All-Pac-10 honorees and five honorable mention Academic All-Pac-10 choices. Fourteen Wildcat soccer players earned Mary Roby Academic Achievement Awards during the 2001-02 school year, bringing Klein's total up to 28 Mary Roby Award winners in her two seasons at the UA.

In January of 2000, Cathy Klein, a former All-American player and the head coach at Iowa State for five years, was named the second head women's soccer coach at the University of Arizona.

In her first year, Klein began her quest to turn the Arizona soccer program around, finishing the 2000 season with a 3-15-2 mark which belies the actual progress that was made during the year. With a brutal schedule, the team played an unprecedented six nationally ranked teams, all in the final seven matches of the year. The squad set or tied 30 school records, and half of the season's 20 contests were decided by a margin of only one goal or less.

Klein, 38, led Iowa State to three postseason conference tournament appearances during her tenure there and was Big 12 Conference Co-Coach of the Year in 1997, when ISU posted a 12-9 record. Her 1999 team went 13-8, reached No. 21 in the national rankings, posted a seven-game winning streak and recorded victories over nationally prominent Minnesota, Vanderbilt and Texas.

Klein was named the first coach at Iowa State in 1995 and compiled a record of 43-37-1 in four regulation seasons after the team played an exhibition year. She recruited both the 1998 and 1999 Big 12 Conference Rookies of the Year, and her 1998 team earned its best-ever Big 12 record and participated in a second consecutive Big 12 Tournament.

Including a 1994 season at Creighton, she has a Division I record of 57-41-1. Klein led Creighton to a 14-4 mark and reached a No. 17 national ranking during the 1994 season and was a perfect 8-0 at home including a victory over Big Ten champion Wisconsin.

Prior to the Creighton job, Klein spent three years as the head coach at Earlham College in Richmond, Ind., where she posted a 16-37-2 mark. The Earlham team had won just two games in the three seasons prior to Klein's takeover as head coach.

Before Earlham, Klein was the head coach at Utica College in New York, where her teams went 6-16-3 in 1987 and 1988. The Utica women's soccer program was winless in the two seasons prior to Klein's arrival.

Klein graduated from the State University of New York at Cortland in 1987 with a bachelor's in physical education.

She was a two-time All-America selection in 1985 and 1986, when the school played as a Division I program, and earned *Soccer America* magazine "Super 11" honors as a senior.

A native of Burlington, Ontario, she went on to play for the Canadian National team from 1987 to 1990. She has been involved as a regional Olympic Development Staff member and holds a United States Soccer Federation "B" license as a coach. She earned a master's degree in physical education from Kent State University in 1991.

Estrada works with second-year assistant coach Casey Mann in the UA's recruiting efforts, player academics and on-field instruction.

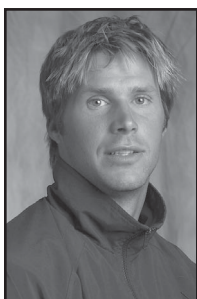
Estrada was part of Klein's staff for four years at Iowa State and was critical in the development of that program. She organized the ISU soccer program's day-to-day operations, was the individual trainer for all field players and coordinated the Cyclones' community service program.

Prior to Iowa State, Estrada posted a stellar collegiate career. The San Diego, Calif., native was a four-year starter at Creighton, finishing third on the all-time scoring list with 15 goals and 10 assists (40 points).

As a prep, Estrada was named the California Interscholastic Federation Player of the Year in 1990 while playing for San Dieguito High School. She was a two-time first-team All-Palomar League choice and a first-team All-CIF selection.

The two-time high school MVP was twice a member of the California South State Team. Following her prep career, she was honored as the San Dieguito Surf Soccer Club Player of the 80s.

Casey Mann begins his second season as an assistant coach at Arizona, where he is primarily responsible for instruction of the Wildcat goalkeepers.

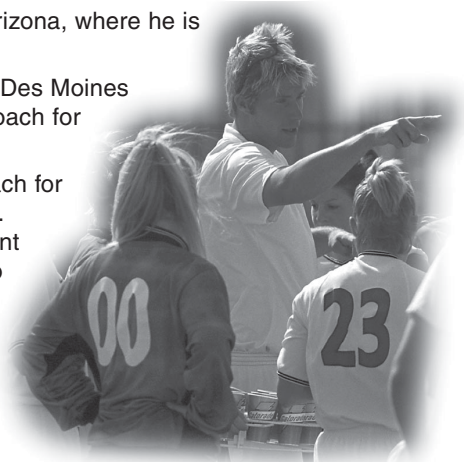

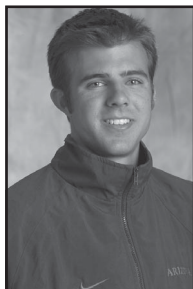

2001 Season Review

It was a team and a season dominated by Wildcat youngsters. Thirteen freshmen and sophomores played prominent roles for the 2001 Arizona women's soccer team, helping the Wildcats to 5-12-1 overall and 2-7-0 Pac-10 records. The Cats surpassed the 2000 season win total, and they had more Pac-10 wins than any UA team since 1997.

Arizona set or tied 23 school records during the season, including most goals in a season (30), most assists in a season (20), most total points (80) and most corner kicks (87). The Cats finished regular season play as the Pac-10 leader in saves (117).

After a close 4-2 loss at then-No. 5 Nebraska to open the season on Aug. 31, the Wildcats returned home to log wins over New Mexico (3-0) on Sept. 7 and Southern Utah (9-1) on Sept. 9. The Cats set six school records during that astounding victory over Southern Utah.

Two road games at West Virginia and Pittsburgh the following weekend were cancelled in the aftermath of the events on Sept. 11. So the Cats were able to remain at home for two more games, which resulted in a 2-2 overtime tie with Pepperdine (Sept. 21) and a 4-1 win over UNLV (Sept. 23).

The Cats registered a 3-1-1 mark over the first five matches of the year, the best start in the history of the program.

A brutal six-game road swing followed, with several close losses. In only two of those six matches did the Cats surrender more than two goals, and one of the losses was an overtime contest.

Arizona came back to the friendly confines of Murphey Stadium and promptly logged the program's first-ever sweep of the Oregon schools. The Cats edged Oregon, 2-1, on Oct. 19, then slipped past Oregon State, 2-1, in overtime on Oct. 21.

Playing three nationally ranked teams

in their final five matches, the Cats were again edged out of the victory column for the season. During that stretch, both 23rd-ranked California and rival Arizona State needed overtime to defeat the Wildcats

Three freshmen led the way for Arizona in scoring for the season. Forward Candice Wilks racked up the highest individual goal total in two years when she tallied eight goals and three assists (19 points). Midfielder Vanesha Bailey was just one assist shy of the school record with her team-leading five dishes. She collected six goals and five assists for 17 points, finishing second on the scoring chart.



Cassie Daniels was one of three freshmen who led the UA in scoring during 2001.

Rookie midfielder Cassie Daniels was third in scoring with four goals and four assists (12 points), and sophomore Liz Bartlett had five goals and one assist (11 points), doubling her career scoring totals.

Senior forward Kristi Loroña followed with five goals (10 points), and fellow senior Katie Winship was sixth in scoring with one goal and one assist (three points).

In the nets, senior goalkeeper Shannon Monti played 1653 minutes, the second-highest single season minutes total for any keeper in school history. She tallied 108 saves, a 2.07 goals against average and one shutout, finishing as the Pac-10 leader in both saves and saves per game.

During the course of the season, Kristi Loroña became only the second Wildcat ever to be named Pac-10 Player of the Week. She earned the honor on Sept. 11 after scoring a school-record five goals during the Cats' pounding of Southern Utah on Sept. 9.

On Oct. 22, Candice Wilks became the first UA freshman ever to be named Pac-10 Player of the Week, also marking the first time in the program's history that two Cats have received the honor in the same season. Wilks earned the award after scoring both gamewinning goals in the first-ever sweep of the Oregon schools.

Wilks was the only player to earn all-conference honors at the end of the season, as she was named honorable mention All-Pac-10. Monti was a second team Academic All-Pac-10 choice.
